SECTION 16. It is the intention of the Legislature that the 351 352 Department of Corrections shall have the authority to accept, budget and expend any portion of confiscated funds received in 353 354 conjunction with its participating in investigations of illegal

activities of any offender under the supervision of the agency.

399	SECTION 21. In addition to all other funds heretofore
400	appropriated, the following sum is hereby appropriated out of the
401	State General Fund not otherwise appropriated, for the purpose of
402	providing for the increased operating expenses at the Private and
403	Regional Facilities and the Medical Services Division of the
404	Department of Corrections for the period beginning upon passage
405	and through June 30, 2006\$ 8,495,271.00.
406	SECTION 22. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by
407	the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the
408	credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon
409	warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal
410	Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the
411	proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law.
412	SECTION 23. This act shall take effect and be in force from
413	and after July 1, 2006, except for Section 21 which shall take
414	effect and be in force from and after its passage.
