SENATE BILL NO. 3087

AN ACT TO AUTHORIZE THE ISSUANCE OF GENERAL OBLIGATION BONDS 1 2 OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI FOR THE PURPOSE OF PROVIDING FUNDS TO 3 ASSIST THE TOWN OF PELAHATCHIE, MISSISSIPPI, IN MAKING 4 INFRASTRUCTURE IMPROVEMENTS NECESSARY TO FACILITATE AND PROMOTE BUSINESS, RECREATIONAL AND COMMERCIAL DEVELOPMENT; AND FOR RELATED 5 б PURPOSES. 7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: SECTION 1. As used in this act, the following words shall 8 9 have the meanings ascribed herein unless the context clearly 10 requires otherwise:

(a) "Accreted value" of any bond means, as of any date of computation, an amount equal to the sum of (i) the stated initial value of such bond, plus (ii) the interest accrued thereon from the issue date to the date of computation at the rate, compounded semiannually, that is necessary to produce the approximate yield to maturity shown for bonds of the same maturity.

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(b) "State" means the State of Mississippi.

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(c) "Commission" means the State Bond Commission.

20 SECTION 2. (1) (a) A special fund, to be designated as the "2006 Town of Pelahatchie Infrastructure Improvement Fund," is 21 22 created within the State Treasury. The fund shall be maintained by the State Treasurer as a separate and special fund, separate 23 24 and apart from the General Fund of the state. Unexpended amounts remaining in the fund at the end of a fiscal year shall not lapse 25 into the State General Fund, and any interest earned or investment 26 27 earnings on amounts in the fund shall be deposited into such fund. (b) Monies deposited into the fund shall be disbursed, 28

29 in the discretion of the Department of Finance and Administration, S. B. No. 3087 *SS26/R1274* R3/5 06/SS26/R1274 PAGE 1 30 to assist the Town of Pelahatchie, Mississippi, in making 31 infrastructure improvements necessary to facilitate and promote 32 business, recreational and commercial development.

33 (2) Amounts deposited into such special fund shall be 34 disbursed to pay the costs of the projects described in subsection 35 (1) of this section. Promptly after the commission has certified, 36 by resolution duly adopted, that the projects described in subsection (1) shall have been completed, abandoned, or cannot be 37 completed in a timely fashion, any amounts remaining in such 38 39 special fund shall be applied to pay debt service on the bonds 40 issued under this act, in accordance with the proceedings 41 authorizing the issuance of such bonds and as directed by the 42 commission.

(3) The Department of Finance and Administration, acting 43 through the Bureau of Building, Grounds and Real Property 44 Management, is expressly authorized and empowered to receive and 45 46 expend any local or other source funds in connection with the 47 expenditure of funds provided for in this section. The expenditure of monies deposited into the special fund shall be 48 49 under the direction of the Department of Finance and Administration, and such funds shall be paid by the State 50 51 Treasurer upon warrants issued by such department, which warrants shall be issued upon requisitions signed by the Executive Director 52 53 of the Department of Finance and Administration, or his designee. 54 SECTION 3. (1) The commission, at one time, or from time to time, may declare by resolution the necessity for issuance of 55 56 general obligation bonds of the State of Mississippi to provide funds for all costs incurred or to be incurred for the purposes 57 58 described in Section 2 of this act. Upon the adoption of a 59 resolution by the Department of Finance and Administration, 60 declaring the necessity for the issuance of any part or all of the 61 general obligation bonds authorized by this section, the Department of Finance and Administration shall deliver a certified 62 *SS26/R1274* S. 63 copy of its resolution or resolutions to the commission. Upon 64 receipt of such resolution, the commission, in its discretion, may 65 act as the issuing agent, prescribe the form of the bonds, 66 advertise for and accept bids, issue and sell the bonds so 67 authorized to be sold and do any and all other things necessary 68 and advisable in connection with the issuance and sale of such The total amount of bonds issued under this act shall not 69 bonds. 70 exceed One Million Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$1,500,000.00). No bonds shall be issued under this act after July 1, 2010. 71

72 (2) Any investment earnings on amounts deposited into the 73 special fund created in Section 2 of this act shall be used to pay 74 debt service on bonds issued under this act, in accordance with 75 the proceedings authorizing issuance of such bonds.

SECTION 4. The principal of and interest on the bonds 76 77 authorized under this act shall be payable in the manner provided 78 in this section. Such bonds shall bear such date or dates, be in such denomination or denominations, bear interest at such rate or 79 80 rates (not to exceed the limits set forth in Section 75-17-101, Mississippi Code of 1972), be payable at such place or places 81 82 within or without the State of Mississippi, shall mature 83 absolutely at such time or times not to exceed twenty-five (25) years from date of issue, be redeemable before maturity at such 84 time or times and upon such terms, with or without premium, shall 85 bear such registration privileges, and shall be substantially in 86 87 such form, all as shall be determined by resolution of the commission. 88

89 SECTION 5. The bonds authorized by this act shall be signed by the chairman of the commission, or by his facsimile signature, 90 and the official seal of the commission shall be affixed thereto, 91 attested by the secretary of the commission. The interest 92 93 coupons, if any, to be attached to such bonds may be executed by 94 the facsimile signatures of such officers. the bonds who were in office at the time of such signing but who 96 97 may have ceased to be such officers before the sale and delivery 98 of such bonds, or who may not have been in office on the date such 99 bonds may bear, the signatures of such officers upon such bonds 100 and coupons shall nevertheless be valid and sufficient for all 101 purposes and have the same effect as if the person so officially signing such bonds had remained in office until their delivery to 102 the purchaser, or had been in office on the date such bonds may 103 104 However, notwithstanding anything herein to the contrary, bear. 105 such bonds may be issued as provided in the Registered Bond Act of 106 the State of Mississippi.

SECTION 6. All bonds and interest coupons issued under the provisions of this act have all the qualities and incidents of negotiable instruments under the provisions of the Uniform Commercial Code, and in exercising the powers granted by this act, the commission shall not be required to and need not comply with the provisions of the Uniform Commercial Code.

113 SECTION 7. The commission shall act as the issuing agent for the bonds authorized under this act, prescribe the form of the 114 115 bonds, advertise for and accept bids, issue and sell the bonds so authorized to be sold, pay all fees and costs incurred in such 116 117 issuance and sale, and do any and all other things necessary and advisable in connection with the issuance and sale of such bonds. 118 119 The commission is authorized and empowered to pay the costs that 120 are incident to the sale, issuance and delivery of the bonds authorized under this act from the proceeds derived from the sale 121 122 of such bonds. The commission shall sell such bonds on sealed bids at public sale, and for such price as it may determine to be 123 for the best interest of the State of Mississippi, but no such 124 125 sale shall be made at a price less than par plus accrued interest 126 to the date of delivery of the bonds to the purchaser. All 127 interest accruing on such bonds so issued shall be payable

S. B. No. 3087 *SS26/R1274* 06/SS26/R1274 PAGE 4 128 semiannually or annually; however, the first interest payment may 129 be for any period of not more than one (1) year.

Notice of the sale of any such bonds shall be published at least one (1) time, not less than ten (10) days before the date of sale, and shall be so published in one or more newspapers published or having a general circulation in the City of Jackson, Mississippi, and in one or more other newspapers or financial journals with a national circulation, to be selected by the commission.

The commission, when issuing any bonds under the authority of this act, may provide that bonds, at the option of the State of Mississippi, may be called in for payment and redemption at the call price named therein and accrued interest on such date or dates named therein.

SECTION 8. The bonds issued under the provisions of this act 142 are general obligations of the State of Mississippi, and for the 143 144 payment thereof the full faith and credit of the State of 145 Mississippi is irrevocably pledged. If the funds appropriated by the Legislature are insufficient to pay the principal of and the 146 147 interest on such bonds as they become due, then the deficiency shall be paid by the State Treasurer from any funds in the State 148 149 Treasury not otherwise appropriated. All such bonds shall contain 150 recitals on their faces substantially covering the provisions of 151 this section.

152 SECTION 9. Upon the issuance and sale of bonds under the 153 provisions of this act, the commission shall transfer the proceeds 154 of any such sale or sales to the special fund created in Section 2 155 of this act. The proceeds of such bonds shall be disbursed solely 156 upon the order of the Department of Finance and Administration 157 under such restrictions, if any, as may be contained in the 158 resolution providing for the issuance of the bonds.

159 SECTION 10. The bonds authorized under this act may be 160 issued without any other proceedings or the happening of any other S. B. Any 163 resolution providing for the issuance of bonds under the 164 provisions of this act shall become effective immediately upon its 165 adoption by the commission, and any such resolution may be adopted 166 at any regular or special meeting of the commission by a majority 167 of its members.

SECTION 11. The bonds authorized under the authority of this 168 act may be validated in the Chancery Court of the First Judicial 169 District of Hinds County, Mississippi, in the manner and with the 170 171 force and effect provided by Chapter 13, Title 31, Mississippi Code of 1972, for the validation of county, municipal, school 172 173 district and other bonds. The notice to taxpayers required by such statutes shall be published in a newspaper published or 174 having a general circulation in the City of Jackson, Mississippi. 175

176 SECTION 12. Any holder of bonds issued under the provisions 177 of this act or of any of the interest coupons pertaining thereto 178 may, either at law or in equity, by suit, action, mandamus or other proceeding, protect and enforce any and all rights granted 179 180 under this act, or under such resolution, and may enforce and compel performance of all duties required by this act to be 181 182 performed, in order to provide for the payment of bonds and 183 interest thereon.

SECTION 13. All bonds issued under the provisions of this 184 185 act shall be legal investments for trustees and other fiduciaries, and for savings banks, trust companies and insurance companies 186 187 organized under the laws of the State of Mississippi, and such 188 bonds shall be legal securities which may be deposited with and shall be received by all public officers and bodies of this state 189 and all municipalities and political subdivisions for the purpose 190 191 of securing the deposit of public funds.

S. B. No. 3087 *SS26/R1274* 06/SS26/R1274 PAGE 6 192 **SECTION 14.** Bonds issued under the provisions of this act 193 and income therefrom shall be exempt from all taxation in the 194 State of Mississippi.

195 **SECTION 15.** The proceeds of the bonds issued under this act 196 shall be used solely for the purposes herein provided, including 197 the costs incident to the issuance and sale of such bonds.

198 SECTION 16. The State Treasurer is authorized, without further process of law, to certify to the Department of Finance 199 200 and Administration the necessity for warrants, and the Department of Finance and Administration is authorized and directed to issue 201 202 such warrants, in such amounts as may be necessary to pay when due 203 the principal of, premium, if any, and interest on, or the 204 accreted value of, all bonds issued under this act; and the State 205 Treasurer shall forward the necessary amount to the designated place or places of payment of such bonds in ample time to 206 207 discharge such bonds, or the interest thereon, on the due dates 208 thereof.

SECTION 17. This act shall be deemed to be full and complete authority for the exercise of the powers herein granted, but this act shall not be deemed to repeal or to be in derogation of any existing law of this state.

213 **SECTION 18.** This act shall take effect and be in force from 214 and after its passage.
