WHEREAS, she married Laurel Attorney Carroll Gartin, who 15 16 served three terms as Lieutenant Governor of Mississippi; and WHEREAS, moving to Laurel after World War II, Mrs. Gartin 17 assumed an active role in all phases of community life, including 18 19 memberships in the Nahoula Chapter of the Daughters of the American Revolution; Life Associate member of the Laurel Junior 20 21 Auxiliary, which honored her as Queen at its Annual Ball in 1968; 22 the Lauren Rogers Museum of Art; and the Laurel Arts League. She helped organize the Northwood Garden Club and was a member of the 23 Laurel Garden Club. She received a Certificate of Appreciation 24 from the Garden Club of America. She also served on the Board of 25 Trustees of the State Garden Club. She was on the Board of 26 27 Directors of the YWCA; the Board of Adjustments for the Laurel Zoning Board; and the Board of Trustees for William Carey College. 28

She was a member of the Official Women's Club of Mississippi and a loyal member of the University of Mississippi Alumni Association. She was a member of the First Baptist Church of Laurel where she served in many capacities, such as Sunday School teacher, President of the Baptist City Federation of the Women's Missionary Union, Circle Chairman and she worked with the Girls Auxiliary; and

WHEREAS, along with her husband, Mrs. Gartin served 36 unselfishly in the religious, educational, cultural, patriotic and 37 civic affairs of her community and state. Lt. Governor Gartin was 38 39 affectionately admired and respected over his many years of public service and at the time of his untimely death in office, he had 40 spent his entire adult life in the service of his government, 41 42 including Municipal Judge, two-term Mayor, Wartime Combat Army Officer, three-term Lieutenant Governor, and acting Governor 43 during his 11-year tenure; and 44
