- WHEREAS, United States Army Staff Sergeant Brian Lee Freeman, 6
- 7 27, of Caledonia, Mississippi, was killed on Monday, November 7,
- 2005, while on foot patrol southwest of Baghdad, Iraq, one of four 8
- 9 Colorado-based soldiers killed by a suicide bomber; and
- WHEREAS, Sergeant Freeman was a Tank Commander assigned to 10
- Troop 1, 3rd Squadron, 3rd Armored Cavalry Regiment out of Fort 11
- Carson, Colorado, part of the Army's Task Force Baghdad; and 12
- WHEREAS, carried by a United States Army Honor Guard, he came 13
- 14 home to his wife and family and to his community and was buried on
- Wednesday, November 16, 2005, at the Rowan Cemetery, Caledonia, 15
- 16 Mississippi, with full military honors; during the funeral he was
- 17 awarded the Bronze Star and the Purple Heart; and
- WHEREAS, Sergeant Freeman is the second soldier from the tiny 18
- 19 northeast Mississippi town of Caledonia to die in Iraq.
- operations began in Iraq and Afghanistan, at least 40 soldiers or 20
- 21 sailors with Mississippi ties have died in action; and
- 22 WHEREAS, Sergeant Freeman was born June 9, 1978, in Amory,
- Mississippi; he had lived most of his life in Caledonia, was a 23
- graduate of Caledonia High School and was a member of Kolola 2.4
- Springs Baptist Church; and 25
- WHEREAS, he joined the Army in 1997 and was an extremely 26
- 27 dedicated role model devoted to the younger soldiers. He had

- 28 planned to re-enlist in the Army and was interested in becoming a
- 29 career soldier, but his death prevented his plan; and
- 30 WHEREAS, he is survived by his wife, Leah Freeman of Laurel;
- 31 his father and mother, Howard Glen and Patricia Mooney Freeman of
- 32 Caledonia; grandmother, Charlotte Mooney, brother Matthew Freeman,
- 33 sister, Lisa Nichols, father-in-law and mother-in-law, Ronnie and
- 34 Linda Christian of Laurel, and other family and friends; and
- 35 WHEREAS, Brian Freeman lived his life committed to our
- 36 nation's safety and security. To a country, a fallen soldier
- 37 means a national loss; to a community, a fallen soldier means a
- 38 true hero; to a parent, a fallen soldier means a son who won't be
- 39 coming home. Mississippians understand the costs of conflict,
- 40 because we have paid them in the past, and it is with great pride
- 41 and humility that we recognize the heroic action of this great
- 42 American and Mississippian, who was the guardian of civilization
- 43 as we know it today:
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE STATE OF
- 45 MISSISSIPPI, THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING THEREIN, That
- 46 we do hereby remember the gallant service and commend the life of
- 47 United States Army Staff Sergeant Brian Lee Freeman of Caledonia,
- 48 Mississippi, who was killed in the line of duty in Iraq on Monday,
- 49 November 7, 2005, and extend the thoughts and prayers of the
- 50 Legislature to his family and our sorrow on his passing.
- 51 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That this resolution be presented to
- 52 the surviving family of Sergeant Freeman and be made available to
- 53 members of the Capitol Press Corps.
