## SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 525

A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION REMEMBERING THE GALLANT SERVICE AND 1 2 COMMENDING THE LIFE OF UNITED STATES MARINE CORPS CORPORAL MICHAEL 3 BRANDON PRESLEY OF BATESVILLE, MISSISSIPPI, WHO DIED ON DECEMBER 4 14, 2005, DUE TO INJURIES SUSTAINED IN ACTION IN IRAQ, AND EXPRESSING THE SYMPATHY OF THE LEGISLATURE. 5 6 WHEREAS, United States Marine Corporal Michael Brandon 7 Presley, 21, of Batesville, Mississippi, died on Wednesday, December 14, 2005, at the Landstuhl Regional Medical Center in 8 9 Germany from wounds sustained in a suicide-bomb blast while conducting combat operations in Fallujah, Iraq; and 10 WHEREAS, Corporal Presley was assigned to the 23rd Marines, 11 3rd Battalion, Kilo Company, from Camp Lejeune, North Carolina, 12 attached to the 2nd Combat Engineer Battalion, 2nd Marine 13 14 Division, II Marine Expeditionary Force; and WHEREAS, carried by a Marine Honor Guard, he returned to his 15 16 former home and his community, and was buried on Thursday, December 22, 2005, at Magnolia Cemetery in Batesville with full 17 military honors; during the funeral he was awarded the Navy Cross; 18 19 and WHEREAS, Corporal Presley was born on February 17, 1984, in 20 21 Oxford, Mississippi, graduated from North Delta High School in 22 2002, where he played as an offensive and defensive lineman for 23 the Green Wave and was part of the Green Wave 3A Championship Team for the Mississippi Private School Association in 2000; known as 24 "Brandon" to his friends, he kept in touch with his teachers from 25 the North Delta School even while he was stationed overseas, and 26

27 let them know that he appreciated their work. He had a unique

28 connection with children and enjoyed reaching out to the youth at 29 his school; and

30 WHEREAS, while in the Marine Corps, Corporal Presley's awards 31 included the Purple Heart, the National Defense Service Medal, the 32 Iraq Campaign Medal, the Global War on Terrorism Medal and the Sea 33 Service Deployment Ribbon; and

34 WHEREAS, since operations began in Iraq and Afghanistan, at 35 least 41 soldiers or sailors with Mississippi ties have died in 36 action; and

37 WHEREAS, he is survived by his mother, Pam Hope Presley 38 Cousar of New Albany, Mississippi; brother, Frasyer Colin Hawkins 39 of New Albany, Mississippi; stepfather, Joe W. Cousar of New 40 Albany; grandmother Mary Presley of Pope, Mississippi; and 41 grandparents, Mitchell and Mary Frances Harmon Woods of Sardis, 42 Mississippi; and many close friends; and

WHEREAS, Brandon was a friend who is counted among America's 43 44 heroes, committed to our nation's safety and security. To a country, a fallen soldier means a national loss; to a community, a 45 fallen soldier means a true hero; to a parent, a fallen soldier 46 47 means a son who won't be coming home. Mississippians understand 48 the costs of conflict, because we have paid them in the past, and 49 it is with pride and humility that we recognize the heroic action of this great American and Mississippian, who was the guardian of 50 51 civilization as we know it today:

52 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI, THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING THEREIN, That 53 54 we do hereby remember the gallant service and commend the life of United States Marine Corporal Michael Brandon Presley of 55 Batesville, Mississippi, who died on December 14, 2005, due to 56 injuries sustained in combat operations in Iraq on December 12, 57 58 2005, and extend the thoughts and prayers of the Legislature to 59 his family and our sorrow on his passing.
