- Stoppers, serving as president from October 1991 to January 1994. 11

- serving as a member of the Board of Directors from 1997 to 2001. 22

- 24 president of the Mississippi Purchasing Agents Association in 1971
- and a member of the American Society of Industrial Security; and 25
- 26 WHEREAS, Mr. Brown was a member of First United Methodist
- Church in Starkville, the Masonic Trinity Lodge No. 88 and the 2.7

- 28 Hamasa Shriners Temple. He was a supporter of French Camp
- 29 Academy; and
- 30 WHEREAS, survivors include his wife, Ruth Duke Brown of
- 31 Starkville; his brother, James L. Brown of West; two sisters, Eva
- 32 Dee Jones of Sallis and Dorothy Harmon of Thomastown; three sons,
