SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 546

1 A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION COMMENDING THE LIFE AND CIVIC
2 CONTRIBUTIONS OF CHARLES N. BROWN OF KOSCIUSKO, MISSISSIPPI,
3 FORMER PRESIDENT OF THE CRIME STOPPERS ADVISORY COUNCIL, AND
4 EXPRESSING THE SYMPATHY OF THE LEGISLATURE.

5 WHEREAS, Mr. Charles N. Brown of Kosciusko, Mississippi,
6 passed away on Thursday, December 22, 2005; and

7 WHEREAS, a security consultant, he was president and CEO of
8 Reliable Security, which was recognized by being in the Fast 40 in
9 2000 and 2002; and

10 WHEREAS, he was founder and chairman of Golden Triangle Crime
11 Stoppers, serving as president from October 1991 to January 1994.
12 He worked with then State Sen. Amy Tuck and Gov. Kirk Fordice to
13 establish by state law a Crime Stoppers Council for the State of
14 Mississippi; and

15 WHEREAS, he was appointed as member and served as president
16 of the Crime Stoppers Advisory Council from July 1996 to June 1998
17 and was reappointed to the council by Gov. Ronnie Musgrove from
18 July 1998 to June 2003. He is a court-certified expert witness
19 and consultant in specifications, design, installation and
20 maintenance of electronic security; and

21 WHEREAS, he was a member of Crime Stoppers International,
22 serving as a member of the Board of Directors from 1997 to 2001.
23 He was president of the Mississippi Alarm Association in 1991,
24 president of the Mississippi Purchasing Agents Association in 1971
25 and a member of the American Society of Industrial Security; and

26 WHEREAS, Mr. Brown was a member of First United Methodist
27 Church in Starkville, the Masonic Trinity Lodge No. 88 and the

28 Hamasa Shriners Temple. He was a supporter of French Camp
29 Academy; and

30 WHEREAS, survivors include his wife, Ruth Duke Brown of
31 Starkville; his brother, James L. Brown of West; two sisters, Eva
32 Dee Jones of Sallis and Dorothy Harmon of Thomastown; three sons,
33 Rob Brown and Adam Brown, both of Starkville, and Dan Brown of
34 Provincetown, Mass.; and friends statewide; and

35 WHEREAS, it is with sadness that we note the passing of this
36 outstanding Mississippi citizen whose civic and charitable
37 contributions to his community and state are a matter of record:

38 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE STATE OF
39 MISSISSIPPI, THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING THEREIN, That
40 we do hereby commend the life and civic contributions of Mr.
41 Charles N. Brown of Kosciusko, Mississippi, former President and
42 founder of the Mississippi Crime Stoppers Advisory Council, and
43 expressing to his surviving family the sympathy of the Legislature
44 on his passing.

45 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That this resolution be presented to
46 his wife, Ruth Brown, and be made available to the Capitol Press
47 Corps.
