- 4 WHEREAS, answering the call of Pilgrim Missionary Baptist
- 5 Church in Indianapolis, Indiana, the family of Dr. Leroy
- 6 Wadlington will leave Oxford, Mississippi, at the end of January
- 7 2006 to lead their new 1600-member congregation; and
- 8 WHEREAS, Dr. Wadlington, who has served as the Pastor of
- 9 Second Missionary Baptist Church for 23 years, knows he's trading
- 10 a certain level of comfort to become a stranger in an unfamiliar
- 11 place; and
- 12 WHEREAS, Leroy Wadlington was born and reared in Lafayette
- 13 County, Oxford, Mississippi. He learned hard work from the fields
- 14 and instructions on succeeding from his father and mother who
- 15 sharecropped to sustain the family until other opportunities were
- 16 available; and
- 17 WHEREAS, he graduated from Central High School and was Senior
- 18 Class President of the last class before mandated integration. He
- 19 continued his education at Northwest Junior College, Senatobia,
- 20 Mississippi; left his family home to attend the University of
- 21 Wisconsin, Madison, Wisconsin; W. Herbert Brewster Theological
- 22 Institute, Memphis, Tennessee; Southern Baptist Seminary,
- 23 Nashville, Tennessee; and a Doctorate of Divinity from New
- 24 Millennium Baptist College, Charlotte, North Carolina; and
- 25 WHEREAS, Leroy Wadlington was employed with Chambers
- 26 Corporation after returning from Wisconsin and finally with the
- 27 United States District Court for the Northern District of

- 29 division of the United States District Court within the Fifth
- 30 Circuit. He worked for district judges William C. Keady, Orma R.
- 31 Smith and finally Neal B. Biggers, until retiring after 21 years
- 32 of service in June 1996; and
- 33 WHEREAS, he has been very active in the affairs of the
- 34 Oxford, Lafayette County and University community, always
- 35 attempting to improve life for all citizens. He has received
- 36 numerous awards for his efforts. The most meaningful, the
- 37 "Mississippi Now Award" and the "Thomas Sullivan Humanitarian
- 38 Award" by the University of Mississippi; and
- 39 WHEREAS, he served as Moderator of the Tallahatchie-Oxford
- 40 District Association, Oxford, Mississippi, for six years, until
- 41 becoming elected President of the New Educational State Convention
- 42 of Mississippi in July 2003. He is presently Pastor of the Second
- 43 Missionary Baptist Church of Oxford, Mississippi, and has served
- 44 that congregation for 23 years; and
- WHEREAS, today, his social-justice concerns in Oxford have
- 46 included "underemployment", the discrepancy between how much one
- 47 earns and what it actually costs to live here, as well as
- 48 affordable housing and predatory lending practices. At Second
- 49 Baptist, the focus has been on chipping away at some of those
- 50 issues by "serving the whole of man," as Wadlington terms the
- 51 vision. That's meant everything from preparing "healthy meals"
- 52 for Wednesday evening fellowship dinners, to hosting seminars on
- 53 financial issues like wills-and-estates planning, to his
- 54 compassionate efforts at local hospitals where he did not expect
- 55 his donations to be reimbursed; and
- 56 WHEREAS, Pastor Wadlington serves on numerous local and state
- 57 boards and committees such as: Board of Directors of the
- 58 Institution for Racial Reconciliation, University, Mississippi;
- 59 local and state AMOS Organization; Boys & Girls Club, United Way;
- 60 state Domestic Violence Clergy Committee and many others; and
