## SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 568

A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION REQUESTING THAT THE CONGRESSIONAL 1 DELEGATION OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI WORK TO PROTECT 2 3 INTELLECTUAL AND PHYSICAL PROPERTY RIGHTS. 4 WHEREAS, the Fifth Amendment of the Constitution states "nor shall private property be taken for public use, without just 5 compensation"; and 6 7 WHEREAS, Kelo vs. the City of New London gave local 8 governments and municipalities the power to seize private property 9 for private enterprises in order to increase tax revenue and stimulate economic development, not for any public use or purpose; 10 11 and WHEREAS, this interpretation of the eminent domain power 12 13 infringes upon the most fundamental of rights and endangers property owners across the nation; and 14 WHEREAS, Article I, Section 8 of the Constitution states 15 "Congress shall have the power to...promote the progress of 16 science and useful arts, by securing for limited times to authors 17 18 and inventors the exclusive right to their respective writings and 19 discoveries"; and 20 WHEREAS, the exclusive right of authors and inventors to 21 their intellectual property is being subjected to increasing 22 infringement and threats of infringement by both public and 23 private entities, ranging from global piracy to illegal sharing of 24 content files on college campuses to governmental abrogation; and WHEREAS, state legislatures have the duty to limit both 25

26 public and private infringements of private entities' rights to 27 the use and enjoyment of physical and intellectual property on

matters within the authority of the legislatures, and to oppose 28 29 such violations on matters without their authority; and 30 WHEREAS, that governmental takings of either physical or 31 intellectual property for nonpublic uses or purposes, and 32 governmental abrogation of physical or intellectual property 33 rights without compensation, and illegal use of physical or 34 intellectual property by private entities, are violations of the fundamental rights of the owners of physical and intellectual 35 36 property:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI, THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING THEREIN, That the Legislature of the State of Mississippi work to restore, protect and enhance intellectual and physical property rights by reviewing present law and pending legislation.

42 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That we hereby instruct the Senate 43 and House of Representatives to restore, protect and enhance 44 intellectual and physical property rights in present federal law, 45 pending federal legislation and all trade agreements.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That this resolution be transmitted to the State of Mississippi's Congressional Delegation and the President of the United States, and be made available to the Capitol Press Corps.
