- the Advice and Consent of the Senate, shall appoint Ambassadors, 8

- and all other Officers of the United States"; and 10
- WHEREAS, on October 31, 2005, the United States Senate 11
- confirmed Samuel A. Alito, Jr., to the U.S. Supreme Court; and 12
- WHEREAS, activist judges on some federal courts have 13
- 14 frustrated the constitutional structure which prescribes that laws
- shall be written by elected legislatures; and 15
- 16 WHEREAS, President George W. Bush has expressed his
- 17 commitment to appoint federal judges who will strictly interpret
- the United States Constitution; and 18

- 20 dilatory tactics to prevent a senate floor vote on several of
- 21 President George W. Bush's judicial nominees, all of whom where
