A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION COMMENDING AND CONGRATULATING COLONEL 1 RONALD E. POWELL, STATE SURGEON FOR THE MISSISSIPPI ARMY NATIONAL 2 3 GUARD, UPON THE OCCASION OF HIS RETIREMENT. 4 WHEREAS, Colonel Ronald E. Powell, State Surgeon for the Mississippi Army National Guard, served as Commander of Task Force 5 Medical, assigned to command and control all military medical 6 units in the State of Mississippi for the Hurricane Katrina 7 8 disaster operations from August-November 2005; and 9 WHEREAS, prior to this humanitarian public service, Colonel Powell was attached to the 155th Separate Armored Brigade in 10 active operations in Iraq; and 11 WHEREAS, Colonel Powell's background is a matter of record: 12 13 • Born October 5, 1945, in Memphis, Tennessee, the son of a World War II hero, a turret gunner who flew back to base in 14 15 England in a damaged B52 bomber plane when the pilot and co-pilot 16 were killed in a bombing mission over Germany. • 1967, graduated from Arkansas State University with a BS 17 18 Degree in Biology and Chemistry; 1970, graduated from the University of Mississippi School of Pharmacy; 1979, graduated from 19 20 the University of Health Sciences, Kansas City, Missouri; 1980, 21 internship at Mount Clemens General Hospital, Mount Clemens, 22 Michigan; and 1990, board-certified in Family Practice. • Married Diann Barrett of Jonesboro, Arkansas, in 1968. 23 They have two children, Amy Powell Tabor of West Point, 24 Mississippi, and Ronald Edward Powell, Jr., of Cordova, Tennessee; 25

and four grandchildren, Powell, Elizabeth Claire and Barrett Tabor

He served in the United States Public Health Service from
1970-1974 as a Commissioned Officer.

He opened solo practice in Family Medicine in West Point,
Mississippi, in 1980, and continues this practice to date.

• He has twice served as the Chief of Staff at the Clay County Medical Center in West Point, Mississippi. He serves on the System-Wide Medical Staff Board of the North Mississippi Medical Center in Tupelo, Mississippi.

37 • He joined the Mississippi National Guard in 1985 and served with the 223rd Engineering Battalion as Battalion Surgeon; 38 39 was appointed State Surgeon in 2003; served with the 155th Combat 40 Battalion at the Forward Operations Base outside of Karbala, Iraq, in a joint military/medical effort with the Polish Military. This 41 was the first time such a joint medical effort was attempted in 42 43 Operation Iraqi Freedom. This active duty assignment went from 44 January 2, 2004 to April 29, 2004. After returning to his private practice, he was assigned as Medical Operations Officer in charge 45 46 of the medical assets for the Mississippi National Guard Relief 47 Effort at Gulfport, Mississippi, from September 3, 2005, to 48 October 18, 2005, following the devastation of the Mississippi Gulf Coast by Hurricane Katrina; and 49

50 WHEREAS, he has served on the Tombigbee Waterways Board and 51 the Board of the Boy Scouts of America. He was appointed to the Old Waverly Golf Club Executive Board in 1985 and serves on this 52 53 board to date.
