- 4 WHEREAS, Mr. Charles Leon Moore, Sr., well-known citizen,
- community activist and City Councilman in Greenville, Mississippi, 5
- has departed this earthly life on March 14, 2006; and 6
- 7 WHEREAS, Charles Moore was a native Greenvillian who
- 8 dedicated his life and energy to the community and its residents;
- 9 and
- WHEREAS, he served in the U.S. Marine Corps during World War 10
- After coming home and completing his high school 11
- requirements, he realized he had to make a decision. Either he 12
- 13 would leave Greenville or stay and make it a better place for all
- to live. He chose the second; and 14
- 15 WHEREAS, his goals and aspirations were achieved by the
- 16 following:
- Getting involved in voter registration in the 1950s; 17
- 18 • Getting involved with the inception of Delta Ministry in
- Greenville in 1964; 19
- 20 Helping organize the effort to bring Headstart to our
- 21 community in 1966;
- 22 Helping organize the effort to integrate Greenville Public
- Schools in 1968; 23
- Spearheading the organization of Herbert Lee Center where 24
- civil rights meetings were held. It still exists on the 25
- 26 corner of Cately and Belaire Streets;

- Coordinating the Robert Clark for Congress in the
 Washington County campaign, 1982-1984;
- Washington County Chairman Committee to elect Mike Espy,

 1986, 1988, 1990, 1992;
- Chaired the committee to elect Bennie Thompson for Washington County, 1993;
- Chaired the committee to elect Dick Molpus for Governor,
- 34 1995;
- Recipient of the Harriet Tubman Award from the Magnolia

 Bar Association in 1996; and
- 37 WHEREAS, he was a member of the Church of Christ Holiness,
- 38 Past Commander of Veterans of Foreign Wars, Past President of the
- 39 Greenville Travel Club, retired member of the National Association
- 40 of Letter Carriers (NALC) Union and the Past President of Branch
- 41 516 of the NALC. He was also a member of the Secretary of State
- 42 Dick Molpus Task Force. He filed a discrimination complaint that
- 43 resulted in blacks being promoted to managerial positions in the
- 44 U.S. Post Office. He was a member of the NAACP since 1946; and
- WHEREAS, from the South Pacific and back to Greenville, many
- 46 roads were traveled. Charles' last major challenge as a
- 47 Greenville City Council member began as the Council Representative
- 48 from Ward 4 in 1990, re-elected for a four-year term in October
- 49 1993, and ended with his retirement in 2001 because of declining
- 50 health; and
- 51 WHEREAS, he is survived by his wife, Alfolonia
- 52 Matthews-Moore, five children, Charles Leon Moore, Jr., Gregory
- 53 Moore, Janice Moore, Iris Moore-McGee and Stanley Moore; and three
- 54 grandchildren; and
- 55 WHEREAS, it is with sadness that we note the passing of this
- 56 respected Mississippian whose contributions to his community and
- 57 state are a matter of record:
