## SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 617

1 A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION COMMENDING THE LIFE AND DISTINGUISHED  
2 PUBLIC SERVICE OF FORMER MISSISSIPPI REPRESENTATIVE J.O.  
3 SOUTHWARD, JR., OF TISHOMINGO, MISSISSIPPI, AND EXPRESSING THE  
4 SYMPATHY OF THE LEGISLATURE.

5 WHEREAS, former Mississippi State Representative and World  
6 War II veteran J.O. Southward, Jr., of Tishomingo, Mississippi,  
7 passed away on Friday, March 17, 2006; and

8 WHEREAS, Representative Southward was an Army veteran of  
9 World War II, and served in the Mississippi House of  
10 Representatives from 1952 to 1956; and

11 WHEREAS, he formerly served on the Board of Trustees of  
12 Northeast Mississippi Junior College, and was a former Board of  
13 Directors of Timber Hills. He was a Scottish Rite Mason, and was  
14 a member of Tishomingo Lodge #522 F&AM; and

15 WHEREAS, he was a former graduate Assistant to the Dean of  
16 Political Science and History at Mississippi State University, and  
17 was a member of the Woodmen of the World; and

18 WHEREAS, he also served as a Colonel under several  
19 Mississippi governors. He loved the history and people of the  
20 Town of Tishomingo; and

21 WHEREAS, he was preceded in death by his parents, John and  
22 Dulcie Southward. Survivors include his fiancée and best friend,  
23 Linda Hester of Iuka; six cousins, Peggy Page (Willis), Sis  
24 Bickerstaff, Mary McNatt and Fairless Southward, all of  
25 Tishomingo, Hal Southward of Saltillo and Joe Southward of Tunica;  
26 and numerous other cousins and friends:

27           WHEREAS, it is with sadness that we note the passing of this  
28 former legislator and veteran whose dedication to public service  
29 is a matter of record:
