4	WHEREAS, the Legislature finds that there is a need to

7	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE STATE OF
8	MISSISSIPPI, THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING THEREIN,
9	That:
10	There is hereby created a study committee for the purpose of
11	studying the feasibility of establishing a civil rights museum in
12	the City of Jackson, Mississippi. The study committee shall be
13	composed of the following:
14	(a) The Executive Director of the State Department of
15	Archives and History, or his designee;
16	(b) Three (3) members of the Senate to be appointed by
17	the Lieutenant Governor;

20	Members of the committee who are not legislators shall not
21	receive any compensation or per diem, but may receive travel
