- SPORT OF NASCAR, AND DESIGNATING APRIL 29, 2006, AS "DALE
- 3 EARNHARDT, SR., DAY IN MISSISSIPPI."
- 4 WHEREAS, the National Association for Stock Car Auto Racing
- (NASCAR) held its first sanctioned race in 1948, and since that 5
- time, NASCAR has grown into a national sport with an estimated 75 6
- 7 million fans; and
- WHEREAS, from 1990-2006, NASCAR joined the ranks of the four 8
- 9 major professional sports, bringing even more attention to the
- sport and its champion. The 1990s will go down in history as one 10
- of the most exciting decades the sport has seen. Attendance 11
- 12 skyrocketed, TV ratings boomed and some memorable championship
- 13 moments were forged in our memories; and
- WHEREAS, as great as the sport of NASCAR is today, it only 14
- 15 got that way by standing on the shoulders of the giants who
- 16 pioneered the sport. Their stories are part of the American
- dream; and 17
- 18 WHEREAS, it's no accident that NASCAR has evolved into the
- 19 major sport it is today. The secret to its success can be found
- 20 in its complex plan to create opportunities for all its fans,
- 21 including many in Mississippi, teams, drivers, manufacturers,
- promoters and sponsors; and 22
- WHEREAS, NASCAR racing legend Dale Earnhardt, Sr., was born 23
- on April 29, 1951; and 24
- WHEREAS, with 76 victories during his career, including seven 25
- 26 Winston Cup Championships, four International Race of Champions
- 27 (IROC) Championships, 10 wins at Talladega Superspeedway and 34

- 28 wins at Daytona International Speedway, Dale Earnhardt was truly
- 29 the face of NASCAR, inspiring fans throughout Mississippi and the
- 30 nation with his skill on the track; and
- 31 WHEREAS, known as "The Intimidator," Dale Earnhardt, at the
- 32 wheel of the No. 3 car, created a legacy in Mississippi amassing
- 33 so many wins; and
- 34 WHEREAS, Dale Earnhardt changed the sport of racing, bridging
- 35 past, present and future generations of fans by upholding the
- 36 finest NASCAR traditions while remaining a cutting-edge competitor
- 37 throughout the entirety of his career; and
- 38 WHEREAS, Dale Earnhardt's tragic death on February 18, 2001,
- 39 deeply touched countless people, including many Mississippians,
- 40 and the loss of this great icon of auto racing and his presence at
- 41 tracks across the country will be missed for generations to come;
- 42 and
- WHEREAS, this Legislature commends the work of NASCAR and the
- 44 NASCAR Foundation in bringing together drivers, teams, fans,
- 45 industry partners and others to serve the causes and charities
- 46 that reflect the core values of the entire NASCAR Family:
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE STATE OF
- 48 MISSISSIPPI, THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING THEREIN, That
- 49 we do recognize the great professional sport of NASCAR and its
- 50 importance to the State of Mississippi, and hereby designate April
- 51 29, 2006, as "Dale Earnhardt, Sr., Day in Mississippi," urging
- 52 NASCAR fans throughout Mississippi to remember his sports legacy.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That this resolution be forwarded to
- 54 Mississippi NASCAR affiliates and be made available to the Capitol
- 55 Press Corps.
