## SENATE RESOLUTION NO. 41

A RESOLUTION COMMENDING THE MISSISSIPPI VALLEY STATE
UNIVERSITY CONCERT CHOIR FOR ITS TRADITION OF EXCELLENCE AND FOR
REPRESENTING THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI AT NATIONAL AND
INTERNATIONAL VENUES.
WHEREAS, the Mississippi Valley State University Concert

6 Choir has enjoyed a high standard of choral excellence during the 7 University's 52 years of existence; and

8 WHEREAS, the choir has always served as an Ambassador of the 9 University and the State of Mississippi; and

10 WHEREAS, Orlando Moss, Composer and Voice Teacher began 11 directing the choir during the Fall of 1993. Presently, he 12 directs the choir for campus and community concerts. He conducted 13 the choir for four years at the Annual George A. Johnson Choral 14 Concert in Jackson, Mississippi, and he directed the choir at the 15 American Negro Spiritual Competition in Cincinnati, Ohio, and won 16 a prestigious award; and

17 WHEREAS, the choir, representing Mississippi, competed in the highest and most difficult Classical category at the 15th Concorso 18 19 Internazionale Di Canto Corale in Verona, Italy, on April 14-18, 2004. Out of 33 choirs from different countries, the choir won 20 21 the Silver Cup, making it one of the best choirs in the world. The choir also performed concerts at the Senior Center of 22 23 Bardolino and at the church service of Saint Antonio in Costermo. 24 Because the choir won in the competition in Verona, the choir was invited to perform at the National Association for the Study and 25 26 Performance of African-American Music's 2005 Professional Music Conference; and 27

28 WHEREAS, the choir is especially famous for its 29 interpretation of African-American music, but is equally famous 30 for being able to perform in any musical genre; and

31 WHEREAS, many outstanding singers have entered the doors of 32 the Mississippi Valley State University choral corridors and have 33 left their footprints in the sands of excellence by helping the 34 choir achieve vocal prominence. Many sang in *Moss' The* 35 *Mississippi Delta Saga* during the 1997 Spring semester at 36 Mississippi Valley State University; and

37 WHEREAS, presently, the choir has applied for a tour of 30 38 students to Brazil to learn about their culture, let them learn about the great State of Mississippi, the Mississippi Delta, and 39 40 the United States of America, and, to continue extending our American values and dreams to a world that needs to better 41 understand us. The choir promotes the belief that students must 42 become knowledgeable about other world cultures in order to become 43 44 fully educated; and

45 WHEREAS, the Mississippi Valley State University Concert 46 Choir will continue to offer the very best in choral excellence to 47 highlight the cultural, educational and musical values found in 48 Mississippi; and

49 WHEREAS, it is with great pride that we recognize this great 50 artistic organization in the university system which brings honor 51 to its community and to the State of Mississippi:

52 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE STATE OF 53 MISSISSIPPI, That we do hereby commend the Mississippi Valley 54 State University Concert Choir, under the direction of Orlando 55 Moss, for its tradition of excellence and for its representation 56 of the State of Mississippi at national and international venues 57 and extend to them the best wishes of the Mississippi Senate in 58 its future tours and activities.
