172 who has been employed for twelve (12) months or longer by an 173 amount equal to One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00), effective on 174 July 1, 2006. 175 With the funds herein appropriated, it is the intention of 176 the Legislature that it shall be the agency's responsibility to 177 make certain that funds required to be appropriated for "Personal Services" for Fiscal Year 2008 do not exceed Fiscal Year 2007 178 179 funds appropriated for that purpose, unless programs or positions 180 are added to the agency's Fiscal Year 2008 budget by the Mississippi Legislature. Based on data provided by the 181 182 Legislative Budget Office, the State Personnel Board shall 183 determine and publish the projected annual cost to fully fund all 184 appropriated positions in compliance with the provisions of this It shall be the responsibility of the agency head to insure 185 186 that no single personnel action increases this projected annual 187 cost and/or the Fiscal Year 2007 appropriation for "Personal Services" when annualized, with the exception of escalated funds. 188 189 If, at the time the agency takes any action to change "Personal 190 Services, " the State Personnel Board determines that the agency has taken an action which would cause the agency to exceed this 191 projected annual cost or the Fiscal Year 2007 "Personal Services" 192 193 appropriated level, when annualized, then only those actions which 194 reduce the projected annual cost and/or the appropriation 195 requirement will be processed by the State Personnel Board until 196 such time as the requirements of this provision are met. Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with 197 198 the terms, conditions and procedures established by law or allowable under the terms set forth within this act. The State 199 200 Personnel Board shall not escalate positions without written 201 approval from the Department of Finance and Administration. Department of Finance and Administration shall not provide written 202 203 approval to escalate any funds for salaries and/or positions 204 without proof of availability of new or additional funds above the

- SECTION 6. Of the funds appropriated in Sections 1 and 2, 259
- 260 and authorized for expenditure in Section 3, payment may be
- 261 authorized for court ordered attorney fees and any accrued
- 262 interest subject to the approval of the Office of the Attorney
- 263 General.
- 264 SECTION 7. No part of the funds herein appropriated shall be
- 265 used for the purpose of returning escaped state convicts to the
- 266 State Penitentiary from a distance of over one hundred (100) miles
- 267 beyond the borders of the state, except upon approval of the
- 268 Governor in each specific case.
- 269 SECTION 8. None of the money herein appropriated shall be
- 270 paid to any person who by the provision of Section 47-5-47,
- Mississippi Code of 1972, as amended, is prohibited from being an 271
- 272 employee of the Mississippi Department of Corrections. The State
- 273 Department of Finance and Administration shall at least annually
- 274 make a report to the Joint Legislative Committee on Performance
- 275 Evaluation and Expenditure Review and to the Attorney General

276 stating the name of any person prohibited under the provisions of

277 Section 47-5-47, Mississippi Code of 1972, as amended, from being

an employee of the Mississippi Department of Corrections who has 278

279 during the preceding year received any money herein appropriated.

In the event that any such person prohibited as herein above 280

281 provided from receiving funds herein appropriated should receive

282 any of said funds, the Attorney General shall immediately commence

283 action to recover the monies so paid to said person and to enjoin

284 the further employment of said person at the Mississippi

Department of Corrections. 285

286 SECTION 9. It is the intent of the Legislature that all prisoners at Parchman shall work a minimum of eight (8) hours per 287

day, excluding prisoners with a physical disability or those

289 incarcerated in maximum security.

290 SECTION 10. It is the intention of the Legislature that the

Department of Corrections shall have the authority to accept,

budget and expend any special funds collected or otherwise 292

293 available, through the sell of scrap or recycled material, for the

purpose of providing recycling equipment, supplies or services for

295 use within the department.

296 SECTION 11. It is the intention of the Legislature that the

297 per diem rates paid to regional facilities shall not exceed

298 Twenty-nine Dollars and Seventy-four Cents (\$29.74) per inmate.

299 All regional facilities shall continue to receive the annual three

300 percent (3%) increase in the per diem rate as authorized in

Section 47-5-933, Mississippi Code of 1972, however, in no event 301

302 shall any regional facility's per diem rate exceed Twenty-nine

303 Dollars and Seventy-four Cents (\$29.74) per inmate.

304 SECTION 12. Effective July 1, 2006, the department or its

305 contracted medical provider will pay to a provider of a medical

service for any and all incarcerated persons from a correctional 306

307 or detention facility an amount based upon negotiated fees as

308 agreed to by the medical care service providers and the department

309 and/or its contracted medical provider. In the absence of

negotiated discounted fee schedule, medical care service providers 310

311 will be paid by the department or its contracted medical service

312 provider an amount no greater than the reimbursement rate

applicable based on the Mississippi Medicaid reimbursement rate. 313

314 This limitation applies to all medical care services, durable and

315 nondurable goods, prescription drugs and medications provided to

316 any and all incarcerated persons outside of the correctional or

317 detention facility.

SECTION 13. It is the intention of the Legislature that the 318

319 Commissioner of the Mississippi Department of Corrections shall

have the authority to transfer cash from one special fund treasury 320

321 fund to another special fund treasury fund under the control of

the Department of Corrections. The purpose of this authority is 322

323 to more efficiently use available cash reserves. It is further

324 the intention of the Legislature that the Department of

325 Corrections shall submit written justification for the transfer to

the Legislative Budget Office and the Department of Finance and

Administration on or before the fifteenth (15th) of the month

328 prior to the effective date of the transfer.

329 SECTION 14. The Commissioner of the Mississippi Department

330 of Corrections is hereby authorized to transfer spending authority

331 between and within budgets, both positions and funds, in an amount

332 not to exceed twenty-five percent (25%) of the authorized budgets

333 in the aggregate. It is further the intention of the Legislature

334 that the Department of Corrections shall submit written

335 justification for the transfer to the Legislative Budget Office

and the Department of Finance and Administration on or before the 336

fifteenth $(15^{\mbox{th}})$ of the month prior to the effective date of the 337

transfer. However, no transfers shall be authorized which 338

339 increase the major object of expenditure "Salaries, Wages and

340 Fringe Benefits" in any budget authorized in Section 3 of this

341 act.

342 SECTION 15. It is the intention of the Legislature that the

343 Mississippi Department of Corrections shall have the authority to

receive, budget, and expend funds from any source, including

beginning cash in excess of beginning cash when spending authority 345

346 was initially appropriated, that may become available to the

347 department in accordance with the rules and regulations of the

Department of Finance and Administration in a matter consistent 348

- 349 with the escalation of federal funds.
- 350 SECTION 16. The department is authorized to expend available
- 351 funds on technology or equipment upgrades or replacements when the
- savings generated from such upgrades or replacements exceed 352
- 353 expenditures thereof.
- 354 SECTION 17. It is the intention of the Legislature that the
- Department of Corrections shall have the authority to accept, 355
- 356 budget and expend any portion of confiscated funds received in
- 357 conjunction with its participating in investigations of illegal
- 358 activities of any offender under the supervision of the agency.
- 359 These funds shall be used to provide security enhancement within
- 360 the Department of Corrections.
- 361 SECTION 18. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions
- of Section 2, Fifty-six Million Dollars (\$56,000,000.00) shall be 362
- 363 derived from the Budget Contingency Fund, as created in Section
- 364 27-103-301, Mississippi Code of 1972.
- SECTION 19. It is the intention of the Legislature that 365
- 366 whenever two (2) or more bids are received by this agency for the
- 367 purchase of commodities or equipment, and whenever all things
- 368 stated in such received bids are equal with respect to price,
- 369 quality and service, the Mississippi Industries for the Blind
- 370 shall be given preference. A similar preference shall be given to
- the Mississippi Industries for the Blind whenever purchases are 371
- 372 made without competitive bids.
- SECTION 20. All expenditures of funds appropriated by this 373
- 374 act for the purposes of advertising through the media shall comply
- 375 with the provisions of this section. All notices, advertisements,
- or announcements designed to accomplish distribution of vital 376
- 377 information paid for wholly or in part through funds appropriated
- by this act and distributed through the media shall be placed 378
- 379 according to a formula based upon the following criteria:

380 (a) Outlets of the Mississippi Public Broadcasting
381 System shall receive twenty percent (20%) of all expenditures
382 allotted for any advertising campaign undertaken by the agency to
383 which funds are appropriated by this act. All distribution of
384 information undertaken by the Mississippi Broadcasting System
385 under these requirements shall conform to the accepted standards
386 of information distribution common to public media.

(b) Media outlets, other than outlets of the Mississippi Public Broadcasting System, shall receive placement of such notices through the following method of distribution and based upon commonly accepted boundaries of distribution:

(i) Newspapers. Newspapers demonstrating established market reach through verifiable and auditable circulation numbers shall receive twenty-five percent (25%) of all expenditures allotted for distribution of vital information, and such expenditures to the individual newspapers shall be determined and prorated based upon the verifiable and auditable share of total circulation within the individual counties. This requirement does not replace the requirements and systems currently in place regarding legal notices in the newspapers.

(ii) Radio. Radio stations demonstrating established market reach through verifiable and auditable market share information as recorded through reputable and established rating services shall receive twenty percent (20%) of all expenditures allotted for such distribution of vital information, and such expenditures to the individual stations shall be determined and prorated based upon the verifiable and auditable share of total market reach within the individual counties.

(iii) Television. Television stations and television cable outlets demonstrating established market reach through verifiable and auditable market share information as recorded through reputable and established rating services shall receive twenty percent (20%) of all expenditures allotted for such distribution of vital information, and such expenditures to the individual stations shall be determined and prorated based upon

415 the verifiable and auditable share of total market reach within

416 the individual demonstrated market reach area of the station or

417 cable outlet.

418 (iv) Magazines. Magazines demonstrating

419 established market reach through verifiable and auditable

420 circulation numbers shall receive ten percent (10%) of all

421 expenditures allotted for such distribution of vital information,

422 and such expenditures to the individual magazines shall be

423 determined and prorated based upon the verifiable and auditable

424 circulation numbers within the counties. If no magazine exists

425 which meets the criteria stated above, the portion of those funds

so allotted shall be distributed among the other media outlets

427 equally.

428 (v) Electronic media. Electronic media

429 demonstrating established market reach through verifiable and

auditable circulation numbers shall receive five percent (5%) of

431 all expenditures allotted for such distribution of vital

432 information, and such expenditures to the individual electronic

433 media outlets shall be determined and prorated based upon the

434 verifiable and auditable circulation numbers within the counties.

435 If no electronic media exists which meets the criteria stated

436 above, the portion of those funds so allotted shall be distributed

437 equally among the other media outlets.

Provisions of this section do not apply to the placement of

439 advertisements in national media outlets to recruit economic

440 development or to promote tourism in the state.

441 **SECTION 21.** The money herein appropriated shall be paid by

442 the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the

443 credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon

444 warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal

445 Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the

446 proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law.

447 SECTION 22. This act shall take effect and be in force from

448 and after July 1, 2006.
