178 It shall be the responsibility of the agency head to insure

that no single personnel action increases this projected annual 179

180 cost and/or the Fiscal Year 2007 appropriation for "Personal

Services" when annualized, with the exception of escalated funds. 181

182 If, at the time the agency takes any action to change "Personal

Services, " the State Personnel Board determines that the agency 183

184 has taken an action which would cause the agency to exceed this

185 projected annual cost or the Fiscal Year 2007 "Personal Services"

appropriated level, when annualized, then only those actions which 186

187 reduce the projected annual cost and/or the appropriation

188 requirement will be processed by the State Personnel Board until

such time as the requirements of this provision are met. 189

190 Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with

191 the terms, conditions and procedures established by law or

192 allowable under the terms set forth within this act. The State

193 Personnel Board shall not escalate positions without written

194 approval from the Department of Finance and Administration. The

Department of Finance and Administration shall not provide written 195

196 approval to escalate any funds for salaries and/or positions

without proof of availability of new or additional funds above the 197

198 appropriated level.

199 No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds which are 200 201 being used for salaries authorized under the provisions of this

202 act and which are withdrawn and no longer available.

SECTION 4. The Commissioner of Public Safety may, on a 203

204 case-by-case basis, within funds available, recommend that 205 corrective salary adjustments be made to the compensation of

206 employees of the Department of Public Safety where an inequity was

207 created between employees of equivalent capacity by previous

208 application of the agency appropriation acts. Any such corrective

209 salary adjustment plan must have prior approval by the State

210 Personnel Board. Such adjustments will not be retroactive.

Any funds in the Salary, Wages and Fringe Benefits major 211

212 object of expenditure may be used to purchase accumulated

213 compensatory time within funds available.

214 SECTION 5. The Commissioner of Public Safety shall have the

215 authority to transfer both positions and/or State General Funds

appropriated herein from any Division within the Department of 216

217 Public Safety to any other Division within the Department of

Public Safety, not to exceed twenty-five percent (25%). 218

219 SECTION 6. It is the intent of the Legislature that the

local governments pay for part of the computer cost of the

Mississippi Justice Information Center by maintaining their

222 contribution to the Department of Public Safety.

223 SECTION 7. It is the intention of the Legislature that the

Department of Public Safety designate certain employees to aid the 224

225 Division of Crime Laboratories in the billing and collecting of

226 all fees charged for services rendered by the Division of Crime

227 Laboratories.

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228 SECTION 8. No part of the funds appropriated herein shall be

229 transferred to, expended by, or used, directly or indirectly, for

the benefit of any public relations, publicity or publication 230

231 activities of any other state agency, department or officer, nor

shall any personnel paid with funds appropriated herein be 232

233 transferred or assigned to any other state agency, department or

234 officer for public relations, publicity, or publication activities

of such office. 235

236 SECTION 9. It is the intention of the Legislature that the

Department of Public Safety shall have the authority to receive, 237

238 budget and expend funds from any source in accordance with the

239 rules and regulations of the Department of Finance and 240 Administration in a manner consistent with the escalation of 241 federal funds.

Department of Public Safety shall not issue citations for
violations of speed limits on a quota basis. No funds expended
under this act shall be used for such quota-based citations for
violations of speed limits.

248 authority to transfer Department of Public Safety Special Funds from any Division within the Department of Public Safety to any 249 other Division of the Department of Public Safety Special Funds, 250 251 including, but not limited to, Funds 3711, 371C, 371E, 3713, 3714, 252 3715, 3740, 3741, 3742, 3744, 3747 and 3718, not to exceed Five 253 Million Dollars (\$5,000,000.00) collectively during Fiscal Year 254 2007. - 366 **SECTION 17.** Of the funds appropriated under the provisions

- 368 Hundred Sixty-three Dollars (\$7,172,263.00) shall be derived from
- 369 the Budget Contingency Fund, as created in Section 27-103-301,
- 370 Mississippi Code of 1972.
- SECTION 18. All expenditures of funds appropriated by this 371
- 372 act for the purposes of advertising through the media shall comply
- 373 with the provisions of this section. All notices, advertisements,
- 374 or announcements designed to accomplish distribution of vital
- information paid for wholly or in part through funds appropriated 375
- 376 by this act and distributed through the media shall be placed
- according to a formula based upon the following criteria: 377
- 378 Outlets of the Mississippi Public Broadcasting
- 379 System shall receive twenty percent (20%) of all expenditures

allotted for any advertising campaign undertaken by the agency to which funds are appropriated by this act. All distribution of information undertaken by the Mississippi Broadcasting System under these requirements shall conform to the accepted standards of information distribution common to public media.

(b) Media outlets, other than outlets of the Mississippi Public Broadcasting System, shall receive placement of such notices through the following method of distribution and based upon commonly accepted boundaries of distribution:

established market reach through verifiable and auditable circulation numbers shall receive twenty-five percent (25%) of all expenditures allotted for distribution of vital information, and such expenditures to the individual newspapers shall be determined and prorated based upon the verifiable and auditable share of total circulation within the individual counties. This requirement does not replace the requirements and systems currently in place regarding legal notices in the newspapers.

established market reach through verifiable and auditable market share information as recorded through reputable and established rating services shall receive twenty percent (20%) of all expenditures allotted for such distribution of vital information, and such expenditures to the individual stations shall be determined and prorated based upon the verifiable and auditable share of total market reach within the individual counties.

(iii) Television. Television stations and television cable outlets demonstrating established market reach through verifiable and auditable market share information as recorded through reputable and established rating services shall receive twenty percent (20%) of all expenditures allotted for such distribution of vital information, and such expenditures to the individual stations shall be determined and prorated based upon the verifiable and auditable share of total market reach within

the individual demonstrated market reach area of the station or cable outlet.

416 (iv) Magazines. Magazines demonstrating 417 established market reach through verifiable and auditable 418 circulation numbers shall receive ten percent (10%) of all 419 expenditures allotted for such distribution of vital information, 420 and such expenditures to the individual magazines shall be 421 determined and prorated based upon the verifiable and auditable 422 circulation numbers within the counties. If no magazine exists 423 which meets the criteria stated above, the portion of those funds 424 so allotted shall be distributed among the other media outlets 425 equally.

Electronic media. Electronic media 426 (v)427 demonstrating established market reach through verifiable and 428 auditable circulation numbers shall receive five percent (5%) of 429 all expenditures allotted for such distribution of vital information, and such expenditures to the individual electronic 430 431 media outlets shall be determined and prorated based upon the 432 verifiable and auditable circulation numbers within the counties. If no electronic media exists which meets the criteria stated 433 434 above, the portion of those funds so allotted shall be distributed 435 equally among the other media outlets.

Provisions of this section do not apply to the placement of advertisements in national media outlets to recruit economic development or to promote tourism in the state.

SECTION 19. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law.

SECTION 20. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after July 1, 2006.
