AMEND by striking Section 1 of the bill and inserting in lieu
 thereof the following:

3 "<u>SECTION 1.</u> (1) The counties of Jackson, Harrison, Hancock 4 and Pearl River, including all municipalities therein, shall 5 enforce, on an emergency basis, all the wind and flood mitigation 6 requirements prescribed by:

7 (a) The 2003 International Residential Code and the
8 2003 International Building Code, as supplemented; and

9 (b) The Guidelines for Hurricane Resistant Construction 10 as published by the Institute for Business & Home Safety, 2005, 11 and the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) Coastal 12 Construction Guidelines for Flooding.

Except as otherwise provided in subsection (4) of this 13 (2) 14 section, emergency wind and flood building requirements imposed in this section shall remain in force until the county board of 15 supervisors or municipal governing authorities, as the case may 16 17 be, adopts as minimum mandatory codes the latest editions of all or any part of any of the codes described in subsection (3) of 18 19 this section. Except as otherwise provided in subsection (4) of 20 this section, the wind and flood mitigation requirements imposed 21 by this section shall be enforced by the county board of

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22 supervisors or municipal governing authorities, as the case may 23 be.

(3) A county board of supervisors or municipal governing
authorities, as the case may be, may adopt as minimum codes the
latest editions of all or any part of any of the following:

27 International Building Code and the standards (a) referenced in that code for regulation of construction within 28 these counties. The appendices of that code may be adopted as 29 needed, but the specific appendix or appendices must be referenced 30 31 by name or letter designation at the time of adoption. For the 32 purposes of this subsection, the International Building Code shall be amended as follows: Structural framing members of Type V 33 34 construction shall be constructed of termite resistant materials in any area where Formosan termites are known to be present. 35

36 International Residential Code (IRC) and the (b) standards referenced in that code are included for regulation of 37 38 construction within these counties. The appendices of that code 39 may be adopted as needed, but the specific appendix or appendices must be referenced by name or letter designation at the time of 40 41 adoption, with the exception of Appendix J, Existing Buildings and Structures, which is hereby adopted by this reference. For the 42 43 purposes of this subsection, International Residential Code 2003 R301.2.1.1 (Design Criteria) shall be amended as follows: 44

45 (i) Item 2, the Southern Building Code Congress
46 International, Standard for Hurricane Resistant Residential
47 Construction (SSTD 10), shall be replaced by the Institute for
48 Business & Home Safety, Guidelines for Hurricane Resistant
49 Construction, 2005.

50 (ii) Item 6, the Florida Concrete and Products
51 Association, Guide to Concrete Masonry Residential Construction in
52 High Wind Areas, shall be added.

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(iii) Item 7, Institute for Business & Home
Safety, Optional Code-plus Fortified for Safer Living©, shall be
added.

56 (iv) Item 8, Federal Alliance for Same Homes,
57 Optional Code-plus Blueprint for Safety[™] shall be added.

58 (v) Structural framing members shall be
59 constructed of termite resistant materials in any area where
60 Formosan termites are known to be present.

(c) Uniform Mechanical Code and the standards
referenced in that code for regulation of construction within
these counties. The appendices of that code may be adopted as
needed, but the specific appendix or appendices must be referenced
by name or letter designation at the time of adoption.

(d) Uniform Plumbing Code and the standards referenced
in that code for regulation of construction within these counties.
The appendices of that code may be adopted as needed, but the
specific appendix or appendices must be referenced by name or
letter designation at the time of adoption.

(e) National Fuel Gas Code and the standards referenced in that code for regulation of construction within these counties. The appendices of that code may be adopted as needed, but the specific appendix or appendices must be referenced by name or letter designation at the time of adoption.

(f) National Electric Code and the standards referenced in that code for regulation of construction within these counties. The appendices of that code may be adopted as needed, but the specific appendix or appendices must be referenced by name or letter designation at the time of adoption.

(g) National Fire Protection Association Code and the
standards referenced in that code for regulation of construction
within these counties. The appendices of that code may be adopted

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84 as needed, but the specific appendix or appendices must be referenced by name or letter designation at the time of adoption. 85 (4) The provisions of this section shall go into effect 86 thirty (30) days from the effective date of this act. However, 87 within ninety (90) days after the provisions of this section go 88 into effect, the board of supervisors of a county and/or the 89 90 governing authorities of any municipality within a county, upon resolution duly adopted and entered upon its minutes, may choose 91 not to be subject to the code requirements imposed under 92 subsection (1) of this section." 93
