## Senate Amendments to House Bill No. 698

TO THE CLERK OF THE HOUSE:

THIS IS TO INFORM YOU THAT THE SENATE HAS ADOPTED THE AMENDMENTS SET OUT BELOW:

## AMENDMENT NO. 1

Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

10 SECTION 1. Section 49-7-20.1, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
11 amended as follows:

12 49-7-20.1. (1) (a) To reduce hunting accidents of children 13 under license age, to protect the safety of these children and to 14 promote hunter safety, a child at least twelve (12) years of age 15 and under sixteen (16) years of age must have a certificate of 16 satisfactory completion of a hunter education course approved by 17 the department before hunting in this state.

18 (b) A child at least twelve (12) years of age and under 19 sixteen (16) years of age may hunt without having the certificate 20 of hunter education required under this subsection if the child is 21 in the presence and under the direct supervision of a licensed or 22 exempt resident hunter at least twenty-one (21) years of age when 23 hunting.

(2) A child under the age of twelve (12) must be in the
presence and under the direct supervision of a licensed or exempt
<u>resident</u> hunter at least twenty-one (21) years of age when the
child is hunting.

(3) There is no penalty for a violation of this section, but
to protect the safety of the child a conservation officer may
require the child to end the hunt and may unload the firearm and
may take the firearm and the child to an adult.

32 SECTION 2. Section 49-7-5, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 33 amended as follows:

34 49-7-5. (1) (a) Any resident, as defined in Section 35 49-7-3, upon application, shall receive a combination resident H. B. 698 PAGE 1 36 hunting and fishing license for the sum of Seventeen Dollars 37 (\$17.00). Such license shall qualify the licensee to hunt under 38 this chapter all game and fowl, including deer and turkey, and to 39 fish in any county of the state.

(b) Any resident, as defined in Section 49-7-3, upon application, shall receive a resident combination small game hunting and fishing license for the sum of Thirteen Dollars (\$13.00) together with the fee provided in Section 49-7-17 to the office or agent issuing such license. Such hunting license shall qualify the licensee to hunt and fish under this chapter all game and fowl, except deer and turkey, in any county in the state.

47 Any resident of the State of Mississippi, as (C) defined in Section 49-7-3, upon application, shall receive a 48 resident small game license, and for it shall pay the issuing 49 officer or agent the sum of Thirteen Dollars (\$13.00), together 50 51 with the fee provided in Section 49-7-17 to the officer or agent issuing such license. Such hunting license shall qualify the 52 person holding the same to hunt under the provisions of this 53 54 chapter, and in season, all game and fowl, except deer and turkey, 55 in any county in the state.

Any resident, as defined in Section 49-7-3, upon 56 (d) 57 application, shall receive a sportsman's license for the sum of 58 Thirty-two Dollars (\$32.00). Such license shall qualify the 59 licensee to hunt under this chapter all game and fowl, including 60 deer and turkey, and to fish as provided by law, in any county in the state, and to hunt using primitive weapons and bow and arrow 61 in the manner provided by law. The commission may notify the 62 licensee of the expiration of his license, and the licensee may 63 64 renew the license by mailing the sum of Thirty-two Dollars 65 (\$32.00) to the commission. A licensee who has not renewed the license within thirty (30) days after the expiration date shall be 66 67 removed from the commission's records, and the licensee must apply to be placed on the renewal list. 68

(e) In addition to a hunting license allowing the
taking of turkey, a resident who hunts turkey during a fall turkey

71 season must purchase a fall turkey hunting permit for a fee of 72 Five Dollars (\$5.00) plus the fee provided in Section 49-7-17. A 73 resident sportsman's licensee or resident lifetime sportsman 74 licensee may hunt during the fall turkey season without purchasing 75 a permit.

76 (f) The commission may offer a resident apprentice hunting license for a resident who does not have the required 77 78 certificate of hunter education and may set the fee for the 79 apprentice hunting license. An apprentice license may be 80 purchased only one (1) time by a resident and the apprentice 81 hunting licensee must be accompanied by a licensed or exempt resident hunter at least twenty-one (21) years of age when 82 83 hunting.

84 (2) Any resident citizen of the State of Mississippi (a) 85 who has not reached the age of sixteen (16) years or who has 86 reached the age of sixty-five (65) years, or any resident citizen who is blind, paraplegic, or a multiple amputee, or who has been 87 88 adjudged by the Veterans Administration as having a total 89 service-connected disability, or has been adjudged to be totally disabled by the Social Security Administration shall not be 90 91 required to purchase or have in his possession, a hunting or 92 fishing license while engaged in such activities. A person exempt 93 by reason of total service-connected disability, as adjudged by 94 the Veterans Administration or who has been adjudged to be totally 95 disabled by the Social Security Administration or who is blind, paraplegic or a multiple amputee, shall have in their possession 96 and on their person proof of their age, residency, disability 97 status or other respective physical impairment while engaged in 98 99 the activities of hunting or fishing.

(b) All exempt hunting and fishing licenses previously
issued for disabilities shall be null and void effective July 1,
1993.

103 (c) The commission may offer a youth all-game hunting 104 and fishing license for exempt youths who have a hunter education 105 certificate and an all-game hunting and fishing license for other 106 persons exempted under paragraph (a). Youths and other exempt 107 persons shall not be required to purchase this license or have it 108 in possession while hunting or fishing. The commission may 109 establish a fee not to exceed Five Dollars (\$5.00) for such 110 licenses.

111 (3) No license shall be required of residents to hunt, fish 112 or trap on lands in which the record title is vested in such 113 person.

(4) Any person or persons exempt under this section from procuring a license shall be subject to and must comply with all other terms and provisions of this chapter.

(5) Any person authorized to issue any license under this section may collect and retain for the issuance of each license the additional fee authorized under Section 49-7-17.

SECTION 3. Section 49-7-20, Mississippi Code of 1972, is amended as follows:

49-7-20. (1) It is unlawful for any person born on or after
January 1, 1972, to procure any <u>Mississippi</u> hunting license,
<u>except a resident apprentice hunting license</u>, unless the person
has been issued certification of satisfactory completion of a
hunter education course approved by the department.

127 (2) It is unlawful for any person to issue any <u>Mississippi</u>
128 <u>hunting</u> license, except a resident apprentice hunting license, to
129 any person born on or after January 1, 1972, unless the purchaser
130 has provided valid certification of satisfactory completion of a
131 hunter education course approved by the department.

132 (3) It is unlawful for any person to fraudulently obtain a133 hunter education certification.

134 (4) The department may revoke any hunting license or hunter 135 education certification upon determination that the holder was not 136 entitled to issuance or obtained the license or certification by 137 any fraudulent means.

138 SECTION 4. This act shall take effect and be in force from 139 and after July 1, 2006.

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 49-7-20.1, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO PROVIDE AN EXCEPTION TO HUNTER EDUCATION REQUIREMENTS FOR CHILDREN BETWEEN AGES OF 12 AND 16; TO AMEND SECTION 49-7-5, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO AUTHORIZE THE COMMISSION ON WILDLIFE, FISHERIES AND PARKS TO ISSUE A RESIDENT APPRENTICE HUNTING LICENSE FOR RESIDENTS WITHOUT HUNTER EDUCATION CERTIFICATE; TO AMEND SECTION 49-7-20, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO CONFORM; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
