Senate Amendments to House Bill No. 803

TO THE CLERK OF THE HOUSE:

THIS IS TO INFORM YOU THAT THE SENATE HAS ADOPTED THE AMENDMENTS SET OUT BELOW:

AMENDMENT NO. 1

Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

5 Section 25-58-21, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 6 amended as follows: 7 25-58-21. (1) There is established the Mississippi Coordinating Council for Remote Sensing and Geographic Information 8 Systems, hereinafter referred to as the "council." The council 9 shall set and assure enforcement of policies and standards to make 10 11 it easier for remote sensing and geographic information system users around the state to share information and to facilitate 12 13 cost-sharing arrangements to reduce the costs of acquiring remote 14 sensing and geographic information system data. The council shall not oversee or regulate the activities of higher education 15 16 entities where it relates to the fields of teaching or research; however, the council shall be informed of these activities for the 17 purpose of coordinating these higher education activities with 18 19 other public remote sensing and GIS initiatives to achieve the 20 maximum benefit for the State of Mississippi and its taxpayers. The council's responsibilities include, but are not limited to: 21 22 (a) Coordination of remote sensing and geographic information system activities within Mississippi; 23 24 Establishing policies and standards to guide 25 Mississippi Department of Information Technology Services (MDITS) in the review and approval of state and local government 26 27 procurement of both hardware and software development relating to remote sensing and geographic information systems; 28

Oversight of MDITS' implementation of these

responsibilities;

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- 31 Preparing a plan, with proposed state funding
- priorities, for Mississippi's remote sensing and geographic 32
- information system activities, including development, operation 33
- 34 and maintenance of the Mississippi Digital Earth Model;
- (e) Oversight of the Mississippi Department of 35
- 36 Environmental Quality's development and maintenance of the
- Mississippi Digital Earth Model, including establishing policies 37
- 38 and standards for the procurement of remote sensing and geographic
- 39 information system data by state and local governmental entities
- and establishing the order in which the seven (7) core data layers 40
- 41 shall be developed;
- (f) Designating Mississippi's official representative 42
- 43 to the National States Geographic Information Council and to any
- other national or regional remote sensing or geographical 44
- 45 information system organizations on which Mississippi has an
- 46 official seat;
- Establishing and designating the members of an 47
- 48 advisory committee made up of policy level officials from major
- state, local, regional and federal agencies, including, but not 49
- 50 limited to, the National Association of Space Administration, the
- 51 Mississippi Institute for Forestry Inventory, the Mississippi
- 52 Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks, the Mississippi
- 53 Public Utilities Staff, the Department of Marine Resources, the
- 54 county E911 coordinator, the State Health Officer, the
- 55 Commissioner of Agriculture and Commerce, the State Tax
- Commission, the Council of Consulting Engineers and the 56
- 57 Mississippi Band of Choctaw Indians, as well as members of the
- 58 private sector;
- 59 (h) Creating a staff level technical users committee,
- 60 in which any public or private sector entity in Mississippi
- 61 interested in remote sensing and geographic information may be
- allowed to participate; 62
- 63 (i) Coordinating with the State Tax Commission to
- 64 assure that state and local governmental entities do not have to

- 65 comply with two (2) sets of requirements imposed by different
- 66 organizations.
- 67 (2) The Mississippi Coordinating Council for Remote Sensing
- 68 and Geographic Information Systems will be composed of the
- 69 following members:
- 70 (a) The Executive Director of the Mississippi
- 71 Department of Environmental Quality;
- 72 (b) The Executive Director of the Mississippi
- 73 Department of Information Technology Services;
- 74 (c) The Executive Director of the Mississippi
- 75 Department of Transportation;
- 76 (d) The Executive Director of the Mississippi Emergency
- 77 Management Agency;
- 78 (e) The Executive Director of the Mississippi
- 79 Development Authority;
- 80 (f) The Secretary of State;
- 81 (g) The Executive Director of the Mississippi Forestry
- 82 Commission;
- 83 (h) The Director of the Mississippi State Board of
- 84 Registered Professional Geologists;
- 85 (i) A representative from the Institutions of Higher
- 86 Learning, appointed by the Commissioner of the Institutions of
- 87 Higher Learning;
- 88 (j) One (1) mayor, serving a municipality, appointed by
- 89 the Executive Director of the Mississippi Municipal League;
- 90 (k) The Executive Director of the Mississippi Municipal
- 91 League or his designee who will serve as the member;
- 92 (1) One (1) county supervisor appointed by the
- 93 Executive Director of the Mississippi Association of Supervisors;
- 94 (m) The Executive Director of the Mississippi
- 95 Association of Supervisors or his designee who will serve as the
- 96 member;
- 97 (n) A member of the Tax Assessors/Collectors
- 98 Association, to be appointed by the president of that association;

- 99 A representative of the Planning and Development
- 100 Districts, appointed by the Governor;
- 101 A Senator, as a nonvoting member, appointed by the
- 102 Lieutenant Governor; * * *
- A Representative, as a nonvoting member, appointed 103 (q)
- by the Speaker of the House; 104
- (r) A member of the Mississippi Association of 105
- 106 Professional Surveyors, appointed by the president of the
- 107 association; and
- 108 The members listed in paragraphs (a) through (g) may appoint
- 109 a designee, but the designee must be the head of an office,
- 110 bureau, division or branch within the member's agency.
- The members of the council shall serve for a term concurrent 111
- 112 with their service as an elected or appointed official or
- concurrent with the term of the appointing official. 113
- The Executive Director of the Department of Environmental 114
- Quality shall serve as council chair and the Executive Director of 115
- 116 Information Technology Services as vice chair for the first two
- 117 (2) years. After the first two (2) years, the council shall elect
- from its members a chair and vice chair, for terms to be specified 118
- 119 by the council.
- With regard to the designee chosen by the Executive Director 120
- 121 of the Mississippi Municipal League or the Executive Director of
- 122 the Mississippi Association of Supervisors, the designee shall
- become a permanent member of the council for a term concurrent 123
- 124 with the term of the appointing executive director.
- (3) At the direction of the chairman of the council and 125
- contingent upon the availability of sufficient funds, each member 126
- may receive reimbursement for reasonable expenses, including 127
- 128 travel expenses in accordance with rates established pursuant to
- 129 Section 25-3-41, incurred in attending meetings of the council.
- 130 Any member of the council who is also a state employee may not
- receive per diem compensation for attending meetings of the study 131
- committee, but may be reimbursed in accordance with Section 132
- 133 25-3-41 for mileage and actual expenses incurred in the

- 134 performance of the duties, if authorized by vote, at a meeting of
- 135 the council, which action must be recorded in the official minutes
- 136 of the meeting. Legislative members of the council will be paid
- 137 from the contingent expense funds of their respective houses in
- 138 the same amounts as provided for committee meetings when the
- 139 Legislature is not in session.
- 140 (4) The council may accept money from any source, public or
- 141 private, to be expended in implementing the duties under this
- 142 section.
- 143 (5) The council may utilize staff employed by the agencies
- 144 affected by this section and any other assistance made available
- 145 to it.

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- 146 **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 147 and after July 1, 2006.

Further, amend by striking the title in its entirety and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 25-58-21, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972,

TO CLARIFY THE MEMBERSHIP OF THE MISSISSIPPI COUNCIL FOR REMOTE

SENSING AND GEOGRAPHIC INFORMATION; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
