1 2 3	AN ACT MAKING AN APPROPRIATION FOR THE SUPPORT AND MAINTENANCE OF THE STATE FORESTRY COMMISSION FOR THE FISCAL YEAR 2007.			
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:			
5	SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be			
б	necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State			
7	General Fund not otherwise appropriated, for the support and			
8	maintenance of the State Forestry Commission for the fiscal year			
9	beginning July 1, 2006, and ending June 30, 2007			
10	\$ 17,186,938.00.			
11	SECTION 2. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be			
12	necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the special			
13	fund in the State Treasury to the credit of the State Forestry			
14	Commission which is comprised of special source funds collected by			
15	or otherwise available to the commission, for the support and			
16	maintenance of the commission for the fiscal year beginning			
17	July 1, 2006, and ending June 30, 2007			
18	\$ 10,914,482.00.			
19	Of the funds specified in this section, Two Hundred Fifty			
20	Thousand Dollars (\$250,000.00) shall be deposited in a fund			
21	created in the State Treasury called the "Forest Improvement			
22	Revolving Fund." Money in this fund shall be used by the State			
23	Forestry Commission to assist in the reforestation and growth			
24	improvement of the forests, woodlands, and publicly owned lands of			

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the state, including sixteenth section lands, Camp Shelby,
Columbia Training School and colleges and universities.
Landowners who contract with the commission for such work shall
pay to the commission its actual cost for conducting such work.
Money received for this work by the commission shall be paid into
the State Treasury, and the State Treasurer shall deposit such
money in the "Forest Improvement Revolving Fund."

32 SECTION 3. With the funds appropriated under the provisions 33 of Sections 1 and 2, the following positions are authorized: 34 AUTHORIZED POSITIONS:

Funds are provided herein to adjust the Variable Compensation Plan to ensure that all full-time employees receive a pay increase equal to the realignment component of the Variable Compensation Plan or Twelve Hundred Dollars (\$1,200.00), whichever is greater, beginning on July 1, 2006.

Pursuant to policies established by the State Personnel Board, agency heads may, on a case by case basis and within funds available, recommend equity salary adjustments to Fiscal Year 2006 agency appropriation acts where application of limitations result in awarding one employee a salary increase greater than another employee within the same agency, with the same job classification series and greater longevity.

51 With the funds herein appropriated, it is the intention of 52 the Legislature that it shall be the agency's responsibility to 53 make certain that funds required to be appropriated for "Personal 54 Services" for Fiscal Year 2008 do not exceed Fiscal Year 2007 55 funds appropriated for that purpose, unless programs or positions 56 are added to the agency's Fiscal Year 2008 budget by the

Mississippi Legislature. Based on data provided by the 57 58 Legislative Budget Office, the State Personnel Board shall 59 determine and publish the projected annual cost to fully fund all 60 appropriated positions in compliance with the provisions of this 61 act. It shall be the responsibility of the agency head to insure 62 that no single personnel action increases this projected annual cost and/or the Fiscal Year 2007 appropriation for "Personal 63 64 Services" when annualized, with the exception of escalated funds. If, at the time the agency takes any action to change "Personal 65 Services," the State Personnel Board determines that the agency 66 67 has taken an action which would cause the agency to exceed this projected annual cost or the Fiscal Year 2007 "Personal Services" 68 69 appropriated level, when annualized, then only those actions which 70 reduce the projected annual cost and/or the appropriation 71 requirement will be processed by the State Personnel Board until 72 such time as the requirements of this provision are met.

73 Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with 74 the terms, conditions and procedures established by law or 75 allowable under the terms set forth within this act. The State 76 Personnel Board shall not escalate positions without written 77 approval from the Department of Finance and Administration. The 78 Department of Finance and Administration shall not provide written 79 approval to escalate any funds for salaries and/or positions without proof of availability of new or additional funds above the 80 81 appropriated level.

No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds which are being used for salaries authorized under the provisions of this act and which are withdrawn and no longer available.

86 No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be 87 used to spend more money on any public information than the agency

88 spent for public information in the fiscal year preceding the 89 effective date of this appropriation.

SECTION 4. It is the intention of the Legislature that the 90 91 State Forestry Commission shall maintain complete accounting and 92 personnel records related to the expenditure of all funds 93 appropriated under this act and that such records shall be in the 94 same format and level of detail as maintained for Fiscal Year 95 2006. It is further the intention of the Legislature that the agency's budget request for Fiscal Year 2008 shall be submitted to 96 97 the Joint Legislative Budget Committee in a format and level of 98 detail comparable to the format and level of detail provided during the Fiscal Year 2007 budget request process. 99

SECTION 5. In compliance with the "Mississippi Performance Budget and Strategic Planning Act of 1994," it is the intent of the Legislature that the funds provided herein shall be utilized in the most efficient and effective manner possible to achieve the intended mission of this agency. Based on the funding authorized, this agency shall make every effort to attain the targeted performance measures provided below:

122 A reporting of the degree to which the performance targets 123 set above have been or are being achieved shall be provided in the 124 agency's budget request submitted to the Joint Legislative Budget 125 Committee for Fiscal Year 2008.

SECTION 6. It is the intention of the Legislature that the 126 State Forestry Commission be allowed to escalate its budget in the 127 Capital Outlay: Equipment major object of expenditure, with funds 128 generated from the Forest Acreage Tax, and with funds generated 129 130 from the sale of old equipment and lease of tower sites an amount not to exceed Seven Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$750,000.00). 131 132 It is further the intention of the Legislature that the State Forestry Commission be allowed to escalate its budget in the 133 Subsidies, Loans and Grants major object of expenditure, with 134 135 funds generated from the Severance Tax to fund the Forest Resource 136 Development Program in an amount not to exceed Five Hundred 137 Thousand Dollars (\$500,000.00). The receipt of these funds is hereby authorized and approved, provided such receipts and 138 139 expenditures are reported and otherwise accounted for in 140 accordance with Section 27-103-101 et seq. and Section 27-104-1 et 141 seq., Mississippi Code of 1972.

SECTION 7. It is the intention of the Legislature that the 142 143 State Forestry Commission be allowed to escalate part-time 144 positions up to one hundred (100) and expend funds not to exceed Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000.00) from any source of 145 146 funds that become available to the commission. This escalation 147 shall be in accordance with rules and regulations of the Department of Finance and Administration in a manner consistent 148 with the escalation of federal funds. These positions may be used 149 150 to protect life and property during extended periods of extreme 151 wildfire occurrences of a minimum of fifty (50) fires per day.

The escalation of positions and the expenditure of these funds shall be at the discretion of the State Forester, with written notification to the State Personnel Board and the State Fiscal Officer.

156 **SECTION 8.** The Forestry Commission has the authority to 157 purchase from the "General Services Administration" Fire Fighter 158 Catalog and any other GSA Catalog as long as the cost of such 159 items are less than the quotes received.

160 SECTION 9. There is hereby created in the State Treasury a 161 fund designated as the Volunteer Fire Department Equipment 162 Conversion Revolving Fund to be used by the State Forestry Commission to assist in the conversion of vehicles acquired by the 163 164 State Forestry Commission through the Federal Excess Personal Property Program or by Volunteer Fire Departments through other 165 means to adapt them for use in the suppression of wildland fires. 166 167 This assistance shall be in the form of fabrication of water tanks 168 or other accessories necessary for the operation of fire 169 suppression units, installation of piping and valves, painting or other similar or associated component work necessary to place fire 170 171 suppression equipment into service. It is not for general vehicle 172 maintenance or repair.

173 The Volunteer Fire Department Equipment Conversion Revolving Fund shall be funded by monies received from charges for work and 174 services performed for Volunteer Fire Departments by the State 175 176 Forestry Commission. Monies collected from such charges shall be deposited into the Volunteer Fire Department Equipment Conversion 177 178 Revolving Fund. The State Treasurer shall make disbursements 179 therefrom for payment of materials, supplies and labor upon requisition of the Forestry Commission and upon the issuance of 180 warrants therefor by the Department of Finance and Administration. 181 182 The amount of monies deposited into the Volunteer Fire 183 Department Equipment Conversion Fund through this work shall not

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exceed Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000.00). Funds in excess of Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000.00) shall be placed in the State Forestry Commission's regular appropriated special funds. Monies in this revolving fund are to be considered special funds and shall be carried forward from one fiscal year to the next.

SECTION 10. There is hereby created in the State Treasury a fund designated as the Camden State Forest Revolving Fund to be used by the State Forestry Commission to direct forest management activities on the Camden State Forest in Madison County, Mississippi. The forest management activities will include, but not be limited to, maintenance of property, timber sale activities and regeneration work.

196 The Camden State Forest Revolving Fund shall be funded by 197 monies received from timber sales, leases, and any other source. 198 Monies collected from these income sources shall be deposited into 199 the Camden State Forest Revolving Fund. The State Treasurer shall 200 make disbursements therefrom for payments of materials, supplies 201 and labor upon requisition of the State Forestry Commission and 202 upon the issuance of warrants therefor by the Department of 203 Finance and Administration.

It is the intention of the Legislature that any revolving funds in excess of the budgeted amount needed for the necessary operation and maintenance of all properties under the direct supervision and management of the State Forestry Commission shall remain in the Camden State Forest Revolving Fund for use in future years.

SECTION 11. Of the funds appropriated in Section 2 and authorized for expenditure in Section 3, it is the intention of the Legislature that Two Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$200,000.00) shall be transferred to the Department of Agriculture and Commerce for the Beaver Control or Eradication Program during the Fiscal Year 2007.

SECTION 12. It is the intention of the Legislature that 216 whenever two (2) or more bids are received by this agency for the 217 purchase of commodities or equipment, and whenever all things 218 219 stated in such received bids are equal with respect to price, 220 quality and service, the Mississippi Industries for the Blind shall be given preference. A similar preference shall be given to 221 222 the Mississippi Industries for the Blind whenever purchases are 223 made without competitive bids.

224 **SECTION 13.** Any person who was an employee of the Forestry 225 Commission who was laid off during Fiscal Year 2006 shall be given 226 first priority in any new employment by the commission.

227 SECTION 14. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by 228 the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the 229 credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal 230 231 Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law. 232 233 SECTION 15. This act shall take effect and be in force from 234 and after July 1, 2006.
