HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 4

A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION COMMENDING AND CONGRATULATING DR. 1 JASON DEAN, EDUCATION POLICY ADVISOR TO GOVERNOR HALEY BARBOUR, ON 2 HIS APPOINTMENT TO THE 2006-2007 CLASS OF WHITE HOUSE FELLOWS. 3 4 WHEREAS, the White House announced on June 16, 2006, the appointment by President George W. Bush of 14 individuals from 5 across the country to serve as White House Fellows, which included 6 the appointment of Dr. Jason Scott Dean, 32, Education Policy 7 8 Advisor to Governor Haley Barbour; and

9 WHEREAS, as members of the 2006-2007 Class of White House 10 Fellows, Dr. Dean and the other Fellows represent a diverse 11 cross-section of professions including medicine, law, finance, 12 education, state government and three branches of the military; 13 and

14 WHEREAS, the White House Fellows Program, founded in 1964 by 15 President Lyndon B. Johnson, offers exceptional young people, such 16 as Dr. Dean, first-hand experience working at the highest levels 17 of the federal government; and

18 WHEREAS, the White House Fellows Program is one of the 19 nation's most prestigious programs for leadership and public 20 service and selection is highly competitive and is based on a 21 record of remarkable professional achievement, evidence of 22 leadership skills, a strong commitment to public service, and the 23 knowledge and skills necessary to contribute successfully at the 24 highest levels of the federal government; and

25 WHEREAS, White House Fellows typically spend one year
26 working as full-time, paid special assistants to Senior White

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27 House Staff, Cabinet Secretaries, and other top-ranking government 28 officials; and

WHEREAS, Fellows also participate in an education program consisting of roundtable discussions with leaders from the private and public sectors, and trips to study United States policy in action both domestically and abroad and after the fellowship year, many Fellows repay the privilege by contributing to the nation as better leaders and public servants; and

35 WHEREAS, Dr. Dean has served as Education Policy Advisor to 36 Governor Haley Barbour since 2004, where his responsibilities 37 include budgetary and policy matters relating to public education; 38 and

39 WHEREAS, Dr. Dean has successfully worked with the state's 40 educational stakeholders and the Legislature to pass the 41 Governor's education agenda which included such vital issues as 42 high school redesign, reducing the state's dropout rate, and 43 addressing the critical shortage of teachers; and

44 WHEREAS, in the aftermath of Hurricane Katrina, Dr. Dean 45 tirelessly worked with FEMA, state, and faith-based groups to 46 coordinate a warehouse and shipping system, and his network of 47 volunteers quickly placed in-kind national and international 48 donations into critically affected areas; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Dean's post-storm duties also included diligently working with and assisting schools and facilities in their recovery; and

52 WHEREAS, Dr. Dean, knowing the importance of community 53 service, has served as Chairman for the United Way of Ole Miss, as 54 a board member for GEAR-UP, on the Public Education Forum, and on 55 the Mayor's Commission on Public Safety, Big Brothers and other 56 community service interests; and

57 WHEREAS, before joining the Governor's staff, Dr. Dean worked 58 as Assistant Dean of Students and Assistant Professor at the

61 WHEREAS, Dr. Dean, a staunch believer in education, received 62 a bachelor of arts degree in international studies from the 63 University of Southern Mississippi and his master of arts and 64 Ph.D. in education from the University of Mississippi; and 65 WHEREAS, Dr. Dean has been lovingly supported in all his 66 endeavors by his lovely wife, Courtney, and their delightful 67 child, Mary Bogan; and

68 WHEREAS, it is the policy of this Legislature to recognize 69 outstanding Mississippians such as Dr. Dean, who has been an 70 effective advocate for various education initiatives in the 71 Legislature on behalf of Governor Barbour, and whose presence will 72 be missed as he embarks on a prestigious new assignment in public 73 service which brings great recognition to the State of 74 Mississippi:
