SENATE RESOLUTION NO. 3

1 A RESOLUTION COMMENDING THE CHARITABLE AND CIVIC SERVICE OF 2 REVEREND WINDELL GREENE, SR., OF NATCHEZ, MISSISSIPPI, ON THE 3 OCCASION OF HIS RETIREMENT.

WHEREAS, Reverend Windell Greene, Sr., of Natchez,
Mississippi, has served his church, community and state in many
capacities; and

7 WHEREAS, Windell Greene, Sr., was born on May 9, 1941, to the 8 late Jimmy and Susie Greene in Vidalia, Louisiana, one mile from 9 Natchez, Mississippi, across the Mississippi River Bridge. His 10 family included six brothers and six sisters; and

WHEREAS, he was educated in the Concordia Parish Public 11 Schools. After graduation, he enrolled at Southern University in 12 13 Baton Rouge, Louisiana, where he received his Bachelor's degree in Social Studies in 1963. He worked his way through college at the 14 15 State Industrial School for Colored Youths near Baton Rouge. It was at this school that Greene would practice many of his 16 counseling skills that would serve him well later in life. He 17 18 became a motivating force and role model for men who were older 19 and much more experienced than he; and

20 WHEREAS, even before attending college, Greene had determined 21 to be a minister of the gospel. He preached his first sermon at the age of 17 on Christmas Day at the Masonic Hall in Vidalia, 22 Louisiana. His unassuming demeanor and love of the gospel caught 23 the attention of a Minister of the Church of Christ, Clarence 24 Shaffner. Reverend Shaffner was instrumental in Greene's decision 25 26 to further his education at Southern University. While attending college, he was named Minister at the Frogmore Church of Christ in 27

WHEREAS, at Southern University, Greene met and married 30 31 Elnora Martin of Jonesboro, Louisiana, on October 27, 1963. Five 32 children blessed that union: LaWendellyn Greene Franklin of 33 Vidalia, Louisiana; Donnell Green, Windell Greene, Jr., and Dwight 34 Greene of Jackson, Mississippi; and Dr. Montrell Green of Cleveland, Mississippi. All of his children are active in the 35 congregations in the cities where they reside. He has nine 36 37 grandchildren; and

38 WHEREAS, after marriage, Greene continued to serve as Minister of the Frogmore Church of Christ. He later moved to 39 40 Buffalo in Wilkinson County, then to Woodlawn in Natchez. During this time, he worked in Vidalia teaching Social Studies and 41 English. When the congregation at Woodlawn moved to the Fourth 42 Street location, Windell Greene became the full-time Minister of 43 what is now the Fourth Street Church of Christ in 1985. 44 Не 45 retired from the Vidalia School System after 22 years to devote his full attention to the church and preaching the gospel. 46 It is 47 a decision he has never regretted. He has nurtured the growth of 48 his congregation from 15 members to nearly 400; and

WHEREAS, Green has also been a servant in his community. He is involved in the prison ministry at Angola Penitentiary in Louisiana. He delivers "Manna in the Morning," a radio broadcast on WTYJ in Natchez. He has served on numerous boards and committees throughout the years, including:

• Natchez-Adams Bi-Racial Committee charged with 60 61 desegregating Natchez Public Schools; • NAACP Board of Directors; 62 63 • Chairman of Ministerial Unification Committee that served 64 as liaison between political factions and city officials; 65 • Mississippi State Commission on Teacher and Administrator Education; 66 • Appointed by the State Superintendent of Education on the 67 Administration Preparation Task Force; 68 • Currently serves as Vice President of Council on Aging; 69 70 and WHEREAS, he has received many awards and accolades: 71 72 • Ten Most Influential African-Americans in 1994; • Named Pastor of the Year by Bluff City Post; 73 74 • James Cothern Award of Recognition; 75 • Windell Greene Day on May 8, 1999, jointly by city and 76 county; and 77 WHEREAS, Greene still resides in Natchez, Mississippi, with his bride of 43 years. He plans to continue to labor in the 78 79 Kingdom of God in a more limited capacity; and 80 WHEREAS, it is with great pride that we recognize the 81 selfless charitable and civic service and leadership of this Mississippi citizen: 82 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE STATE OF 83 84 MISSISSIPPI, That we do hereby commend the charitable and civic service of Reverend Windell Greene, Sr., of Natchez, Mississippi, 85 86 and extend to him and his family the best wishes of the Senate on the occasion of his retirement as Minister of Fourth Street Church 87 of Christ, Natchez, Mississippi. 88 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That this resolution be forwarded to 89 90 Reverend Greene and his family and be made available to the 91 Capitol Press Corps.
