## HOUSE BILL NO. 13

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 63-3-519, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO AUTHORIZE THE SHERIFF AND HIS DEPUTIES IN CERTAIN COUNTIES TO 3 USE RADAR SPEED DETECTION EQUIPMENT UPON THE PUBLIC STREETS, ROADS AND HIGHWAYS OF THE COUNTY LYING OUTSIDE OF THE LIMITS OF ANY INCORPORATED MUNICIPALITY; TO PROVIDE THAT FINES COLLECTED FOR 5 6 SPEEDING VIOLATIONS RESULTING FROM THE USE OF RADAR SPEED 7 DETECTION EQUIPMENT BY THE SHERIFF OR DEPUTY SHERIFFS IN SUCH COUNTIES, WITH THE EXCEPTION OF SUCH COSTS AS THE COUNTY INCURS IN 8 THE PURCHASE AND USE OF RADAR SPEED DETECTION EQUIPMENT, SHALL BE 9 FORWARDED TO THE STATE TREASURER AND DEPOSITED INTO THE STATE 10 GENERAL FUND; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 11 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 12 SECTION 1. Section 63-3-519, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 13 amended as follows: 14 15 63-3-519. (1) It is unlawful for any person or peace officer or law enforcement agency, except the Mississippi Highway 16 Safety Patrol, to purchase or use or allow to be used any type of 17 radar speed detection equipment upon any public street, road or 18 highway of this state. However, such equipment may be used: 19 20 (a) By municipal law enforcement officers within a municipality having a population of two thousand (2,000) or more 21 22 upon the public streets of the municipality; (b) By any college or university campus police force 23 24 within the confines of any campus wherein more than two thousand (2,000) students are enrolled; 25 (c) By municipal law enforcement officers in any 26
