HOUSE BILL NO. 34

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION $63\mathchar`-3\mathchar`-809$, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, 1 TO REQUIRE MOTOR VEHICLE OPERATORS TO PERFORM CERTAIN TRAFFIC 2 3 SAFETY MANEUVERS WHEN APPROACHING AUTHORIZED EMERGENCY VEHICLES 4 POSITIONED ON OR ALONGSIDE OF A ROAD, STREET OR HIGHWAY IN THE PERFORMANCE OF EMERGENCY SERVICES; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 5 6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 7 SECTION 1. Section 63-3-809, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 8 amended as follows:

63-3-809. (1) Upon the immediate approach of an authorized 9 emergency vehicle, when the driver is giving audible signal by 10 siren, exhaust whistle, or bell, the driver of every other vehicle 11 shall yield the right-of-way and shall immediately drive to a 12 position parallel to, and as close as possible to, the right-hand 13 edge or curb of the roadway clear of any intersection and shall 14 stop and remain in such position until the authorized emergency 15 vehicle has passed, except when otherwise directed by a <u>law</u> 16 enforcement officer. 17

When an authorized emergency vehicle is parked or 18 (2) 19 positioned on or alongside of a road, street or highway in the performance of emergency services and is displaying blinking, 20 oscillating or rotating lights, as authorized under Section 21 63-7-19, the operator of every other vehicle approaching the 22 emergency vehicle, in an immediate but safe manner, except when 23 otherwise directed by a law enforcement officer, shall,: 24 (a) When driving on a roadway with two (2) or more 25 26 lanes for vehicles traveling in the same direction, vacate the lane closest to the emergency vehicle; or 27

28 (b) When driving on a roadway with only one (1) lane for vehicles traveling in the same direction, slow to a speed of 29 twenty (20) miles per hour less than the posted speed limit when 30 31 the posted speed limit is twenty-five (25) miles per hour or 32 greater, or slow to a speed of five (5) miles per hour when the posted speed limit is twenty (20) miles per hour or less. 33 (3) The Department of Public Safety shall provide an 34 educational awareness campaign informing the motoring public about 35 the provisions of subsection (2) of this section and shall include 36 37 such information in all driver's license educational materials 38 printed after June 30, 2007. This section shall not operate to relieve the driver of 39 (4) 40 an authorized emergency vehicle from the duty to drive with due regard for the safety of all persons using the highway. 41 42 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from
