HOUSE BILL NO. 108

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 63-1-47, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO 1 2 REQUIRE EVERY PERSON, UPON EACH RENEWAL OF A DRIVER'S LICENSE, 3 EXCEPT UPON RENEWAL OF A DRIVER'S LICENSE BY ELECTRONIC MEANS, TO TAKE AND PASS A VISION SCREENING EXAMINATION TO BE ADMINISTERED BY 4 THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 5 6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: SECTION 1. Section 63-1-47, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 7 amended as follows: 8 63-1-47. (1) Except as otherwise provided in this section, 9 each applicant for an original license issued pursuant to this 10 article, who is entitled to issuance of same, and who is eighteen 11 12 (18) years of age or older, shall be issued a four-year license which will expire at midnight on the licensee's birthday. 13 14 (a) Except as otherwise provided in this section, all renewal licenses of operators eighteen (18) years of age or older 15 shall be for four-year periods and may be renewed any time within 16 six (6) months before the expiration of the license upon 17 application and payment of the required fee, unless required to be 18 19 reexamined. Every person, upon each renewal of a driver's 20 (b) 21 license, except upon renewal of a driver's license by electronic means as authorized under Section 63-1-35, in addition to 2.2 complying with all other requirements for the renewal of a 23 driver's license, must take and pass a vision screening 24 examination to be administered by the Department of Public Safety. 25 26 No additional fee shall be charged by the department for

<sup>27</sup> administering such examination.

(c) From and after January 1, 1990, no commercial 28 29 driver's license shall be issued under the provisions of this article for any commercial motor vehicle, the lawful operation of 30 which requires the driver to obtain a Class A, B or C commercial 31 32 driver's license under Article 2 of this chapter; however, from 33 time to time, the holder of a commercial license may apply for a commercial driver's license under Article 2 of this chapter; and, 34 if he fails to pass the required test for such license, he shall 35 be entitled to an extension of his license that shall be valid for 36 37 one hundred twenty (120) days or until he again is tested under Article 2 of this chapter, whichever occurs first. The extension 38 shall entitle the license holder to operate all vehicles which 39 such license authorized him to operate prior to taking the 40 41 required test. The first extension shall be without charge; however, a fee of Fifteen Dollars (\$15.00) shall be imposed for 42 43 any subsequent extension. No extension shall be valid past March 44 31, 1992.

Any commercial driver's license issued under this 45 (2) article before January 1, 1990, which expires after March 31, 46 47 1992, shall be void on April 1, 1992, for the operation of any commercial vehicle requiring a commercial license to be issued 48 49 under Article 2 of this chapter; however, if the holder of any 50 such license applies for a commercial driver's license under Article 2 of this chapter, passes the required tests for such 51 52 license, pays all applicable fees under Article 2 of this chapter except the Forty Dollars (\$40.00) license fee and otherwise meets 53 54 all requirements for the issuance of such license, then such person shall be issued a license under Article 2 of this chapter 55 56 which shall expire on the expiration date of the commercial 57 driver's license being replaced.

(3) The fee for the issuance of an original and renewals of
a Class D commercial driver's license under this article to an
applicant who is not a United States citizen and who does not

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64 The Commissioner of Public Safety shall notify, by (4) 65 United States mail addressed to the last known address of record 66 with the Department of Public Safety, all holders of a commercial driver's license issued under this article before January 1, 1990, 67 and which expire after March 31, 1992, that such license will be 68 void on and after April 1, 1992, for the operation of any vehicle 69 70 for which a commercial driver's license is required to be issued 71 under Article 2 of this chapter.

(5) Any person holding a valid commercial driver's license 72 73 issued under this article before January 1, 1990, shall continue 74 thereafter, until expiration of such license, to be entitled to 75 operate all vehicles which such license authorized him to operate 76 immediately before January 1, 1990, except that from and after 77 April 1, 1992, such license shall not entitle the licensee to 78 operate a commercial motor vehicle the lawful operation of which 79 requires a commercial driver's license under Article 2 of this 80 chapter.

Except as otherwise provided in this article, each 81 (6) 82 applicant for an original driver's license issued pursuant to this 83 article, who is entitled to issuance of same, being under eighteen (18) years of age, shall be issued a one-year license which will 84 85 expire at midnight on the licensee's birthday. Renewal drivers' licenses of operators under the age of eighteen (18) shall be for 86 87 one-year periods and may be renewed any time within two (2) months before the expiration of the license upon application and payment 88 of the required fee, unless required to be reexamined. 89 An 90 intermediate license shall be valid for one (1) year from its date of issue and may be renewed any time within fourteen (14) days 91 92 before expiration of the license. All applications by an operator under the age of eighteen (18) must be accompanied by 93

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94 documentation that the applicant is in compliance with the

95 education requirements of Section 63-1-9(1)(g), and the

96 documentation must be dated no more than thirty (30) days prior to

97 the date of application.

98 (7) Any license issued under this article to a person who is not a United States citizen and who does not possess a social 99 security number issued by the United States government shall 100 expire one (1) year from the date of issuance and may be renewed, 101 102 if such person is otherwise qualified to renew such license, 103 within thirty (30) days of expiration. The fee for any such 104 license and for renewal shall be as prescribed in Section 63-1-43. SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from 105 106 and after July 1, 2007.
