HOUSE BILL NO. 237

1 AN ACT TO CREATE THE MISSISSIPPI WORKING PERSON'S ACT; TO 2 REQUIRE THAT A CERTAIN WAGE BE PAID BY EMPLOYERS DOING BUSINESS IN 3 THE STATE TO ANY EMPLOYEE WITHIN THEIR EMPLOYMENT; TO PROVIDE HOW 4 THE HOURLY RATE INCREASE SHALL BE CALCULATED; TO REQUIRE THE STATE 5 ECONOMIST TO ANNOUNCE THE HOURLY WAGE RATE INCREASE; TO AMEND 6 SECTION 25-3-40, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO CONFORM TO THE 7 PRECEDING SECTION; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 9 <u>SECTION 1.</u> This act shall be known as the "Mississippi 10 Working Person's Act."

SECTION 2. The Legislature finds that there is a need for 11 gainful employment that allows the citizens of this state to be 12 13 compensated at a living wage. The intent of the Legislature is to increase the minimum wage for citizens of this state above the 14 15 minimum wage established by federal law. The Legislature recognizes and supports that whenever federal law increases the 16 17 federal minimum wage above the wage established by this act, such federal wage increase shall supersede the wage established by this 18 19 act.

20 <u>SECTION 3.</u> (1) (a) Except as otherwise provided in this 21 section, any employer doing business in the state shall pay any 22 employee within his employment at least: (i) Six Dollars and 23 Twenty-five Cents (\$6.25) per hour beginning on July 1, 2007; and 24 (ii) Seven Dollars and Twenty-five Cents (\$7.25) per hour 25 beginning on January 15, 2008.

On and after January 15, 2009, and January 15 of each succeeding calendar year, the hourly wage required by this section shall be increased by applying the United States inflation rate for the previous calendar year to the hourly wage established for

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30 the previous calendar year and shall be effective on the date 31 announced by the State Economist as provided under paragraph (b) 32 of this subsection (1). The United States inflation rate for a 33 calendar year shall be the Consumer Price Index for the calendar 34 year for all urban consumers as calculated by the Bureau of Labor 35 Statistics of the United States Department of Labor.

36 (b) The State Economist shall: (i) make an official 37 announcement of the hourly wage rate increase on January 15 of 38 each calendar year, or as soon thereafter as possible; (ii) cause 39 the dissemination of such announcement to the news media in such 40 manner as such economist deems appropriate; and (iii) file the 41 same with the Mississippi Department of Employment Security. The hourly wage rate shall be effective from the date of the official 42 43 announcement by the State Economist.

Subject to the provisions of this subsection (2), an 44 (2) 45 employer of a tipped employee shall be entitled to an allowance 46 as a part of the hourly wage required by subsection (1) of this 47 section. The allowance shall be in an amount equal to the tips received by such employee. However, the amount of the allowance 48 49 authorized under this subsection (2) shall not exceed fifty 50 percent (50%) of the hourly wage required by subsection (1) of 51 this section, and the application of the allowance must result in 52 payment of wages other than tips to such employees of no less than fifty percent (50%) of the hourly wage required by subsection (1) 53 54 of this section. For the purposes of this subsection (2), "tipped 55 employee" means an employee engaging in an occupation in which he 56 or she customarily and regularly receives more than Thirty Dollars (\$30.00) per month in tips. Additionally, the term "tip" means 57 58 voluntary monetary contributions received by an employee from a 59 guest, patron or customer for services rendered.

60 **SECTION 4.** Section 25-3-40, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 61 amended as follows:

No. 237 \* HR03/ R7.1\* 07/HR03/R7.1 PAGE 2 (GT\LH) 62 25-3-40. \* \* \* The Mississippi Compensation Plan shall be 63 amended to provide salary increases in such amounts and 64 percentages as might be recommended by the Legislative Budget 65 Office and as may be authorized by funds appropriated by the 66 Legislature for the purpose of granting incentive salary increases 67 as deemed possible dependent upon the availability of general and 68 special funds.

It is hereby declared to be the intent of the Mississippi 69 Legislature to implement a minimum wage as enacted by Mississippi 70 71 or federal statutory law, whichever wage is greater. It is the 72 intent and purpose of this section to maximize annual salary increases consistent with the availability of funds as might be 73 74 determined by the Mississippi Legislature at its regular annual session and that all salary increases hereafter be made consistent 75 76 with the provisions of this section.

77 SECTION 5. This act shall take effect and be in force from78 and after July 1, 2007.
