HOUSE BILL NO. 261

1	AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 57-69-5, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO
2	PROVIDE THAT THE OFFICE OF MINORITY BUSINESS ENTERPRISES OF THE
3	MISSISSIPPI DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY SHALL SERVE AS THE OFFICIAL
4	STATE COORDINATING OFFICE FOR ALL STATE AGENCIES THAT RECEIVE
5	FEDERAL MONIES AND FOR ALL STATE PROCUREMENTS AND CONSTRUCTION
6	PROJECTS FOR THE PURPOSE OF ENSURING THAT MINORITY BUSINESS
7	ENTERPRISES ARE PROVIDED AN ADEQUATE OPPORTUNITY TO PARTICIPATE
8	FAIRLY IN THE DISTRIBUTION OF SUCH FEDERAL MONIES AND IN THE
9	AWARDING OF SUCH PROCUREMENT AND CONSTRUCTION CONTRACTS.

- 10 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 11 SECTION 1. Section 57-69-5, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 12 amended as follows:
- 13 57-69-5. (1) There is hereby created the Office of Minority
- 14 Business Enterprises of the Mississippi Development Authority
- 15 under the Mississippi Development Authority. The Executive
- 16 Director of the Mississippi Development Authority shall appoint an
- 17 executive director for the office. The executive director may
- 18 employ a staff subject to approval of the Executive Director of
- 19 the Mississippi Development Authority as necessary to carry out
- 20 the purposes of this office.
- 21 (2) The office shall perform the following:
- 22 (a) Develop, plan and implement programs to provide an
- 23 opportunity for participation by qualified minority owned
- 24 businesses in public works and the process by which goods and
- 25 services are procured by state agencies and educational
- 26 institutions from the private sector;
- 27 (b) Develop a comprehensive plan encouraging that
- 28 qualified minority owned businesses are provided an opportunity to
- 29 participate in public contracts for public works and commodities
- 30 and services;

31	(c) Identify barriers to equal participation by
32	qualified minority owned businesses in all state agency and
33	educational institution contracts;
34	(d) Develop and maintain a central minority business
35	enterprise certification list for all state agencies and
36	educational institutions;
37	(e) Adopt rules for the implementation of this chapter;
38	(f) Develop and maintain a central minority business
39	enterprise certification program;
40	(g) Develop and maintain a central minority business
41	enterprise supplier certification program;
42	(h) Submit an annual report to the Governor and the
43	Legislature outlining the progress and economic impact on the
44	public and private sectors of implementing this chapter;
45	(i) Increase efforts to inform minority businesses of
46	state government procurement procedures and policies;
47	(j) Serve as the principal advocate in the state on
48	behalf of minority business enterprises and minority business
49	enterprise suppliers and provide advice in the consideration of
50	administrative requirements and legislation that affect minority
51	business enterprises and minority business enterprise suppliers;
52	(k) Evaluate the effectiveness of efforts of state
53	agencies and other entities to assist minority business
54	enterprises and minority business enterprise suppliers and make
55	appropriate recommendations to assist the development and
56	strengthening of minority business enterprises and minority
57	business enterprise suppliers;
58	(1) Determine the availability of financial and other
59	resources to minority business enterprises and minority business
60	enterprise suppliers and recommend methods for:
61	(i) Increasing the availability of equity capital
62	and other forms of financial assistance to minority business

enterprises and minority business enterprise suppliers;

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64	(ii) Generating markets for the goods and services
65	of minority business enterprises and minority business enterprise
66	suppliers;
67	(iii) Providing more effective education, training
68	and management and technical assistance to minority business
69	enterprises and minority business enterprise suppliers; and
70	(iv) Providing assistance to minority business
71	enterprises and minority business enterprise suppliers in
72	complying with federal, state and local laws;
73	(m) Serve as a focal point for receiving complaints and
74	suggestions concerning state government policies and activities
75	that affect minority business enterprises and minority business
76	enterprise suppliers;
77	(n) Develop and advocate proposals for changes in state
78	policies and activities that adversely affect minority business
79	enterprises and minority business enterprise suppliers;
80	(o) Provide to legislative committees and state
81	agencies information on the effects of proposed policies or
82	actions that affect minority business enterprises and minority
83	business enterprise suppliers;
84	(p) Enlist the assistance of public and private
85	agencies, businesses and other organizations in disseminating
86	information about state programs and services that benefit
87	minority business enterprises and minority business enterprise
88	suppliers and information regarding means by which minority
89	business enterprises and minority business enterprise suppliers
90	can use those programs and services;
91	(q) Identify sources of financial assistance for
92	minority business enterprises, match minority business enterprises
93	and minority business enterprise suppliers with sources of
94	financial assistance, and assist minority business enterprises and
95	minority business enterprise suppliers with the preparation of
96	applications for loans from governmental or private sources;
