AN ACT TO ESTABLISH A SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM ADMINISTERED BY THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF STATE INSTITUTIONS OF HIGHER LEARNING FOR 3 FAMILY PROTECTION WORKERS WHO ARE EMPLOYED BY THE DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES TO OBTAIN THE COLLEGE EDUCATION NECESSARY TO BECOME LICENSED AS SOCIAL WORKERS AND BECOME FAMILY PROTECTION 5 6 SPECIALISTS FOR THE DEPARTMENT; TO PROVIDE THAT ANY PERSON WHO 7 RECEIVES A SCHOLARSHIP UNDER THE PROGRAM, OBTAINS A COLLEGE DEGREE NECESSARY TO BECOME LICENSED AS A SOCIAL WORKER AND RECEIVES SUCH 8 9 A LICENSE, SHALL RENDER SERVICE AS A FAMILY PROTECTION SPECIALIST FOR THE DEPARTMENT FOR A PERIOD OF NOT LESS THAN THREE YEARS FROM 10 THE DATE THAT THE PERSON BECAME A FAMILY PROTECTION SPECIALIST; TO 11 12 PROVIDE THAT ANY PERSON WHO RECEIVES A SCHOLARSHIP UNDER THE 13 PROGRAM WHO FAILS TO COMPLETE A PROGRAM OF STUDY NECESSARY TO BECOME LICENSED AS A SOCIAL WORKER, AND ANY PERSON WHO RECEIVES A 14 SCHOLARSHIP UNDER THE PROGRAM WHO FAILS TO COMPLETE HIS OR HER 15 16 SERVICE OBLIGATION AS A FAMILY PROTECTION SPECIALIST FOR THE DEPARTMENT FOR NOT LESS THAN THREE YEARS, SHALL BECOME LIABLE IMMEDIATELY TO THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES FOR THE SUM OF ALL 17 18 SCHOLARSHIP AWARDS RECEIVED, PLUS INTEREST; AND FOR RELATED 19 20 PURPOSES. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 2.1 **SECTION 1.** (1) There is established a scholarship program to encourage family protection workers employed by the Department

26 certified social worker and become a family protection specialist

(2) Any person who is employed as a family protection worker 28

29 for the Department of Human Services shall be eligible for a

34 necessary to become licensed as a social worker, master social

worker or certified social worker and become a family protection 35

36 specialist for the department. The annual amount of a scholarship

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- 37 award under the program shall be equal to the total cost of
- 38 tuition and fees at the college or university in which the student
- 39 is enrolled, not to exceed an amount equal to the highest total
- 40 cost of tuition and fees assessed by a state institution of higher
- 41 learning during that school year.
- 42 (3) Scholarship awards made under the program shall be
- 43 available to both full-time and part-time students. Students
- 44 enrolling on a full-time basis may receive a maximum of two (2)
- 45 annual awards. The maximum number of scholarship awards that may
- 46 be made to students attending school on a part-time basis, and the
- 47 maximum time period for part-time students to complete the number
- 48 of academic hours necessary to obtain the necessary degree, shall
- 49 be established by rules and regulations of the Board of Trustees
- 50 of State Institutions of Higher Learning. Scholarships under the
- 51 program shall not be based upon an applicant's eligibility for
- 52 financial aid. A student must maintain a "C" average or higher in
- 53 his or her college coursework in order to continue receiving the
- 54 scholarship.
- 55 (4) After a person who received a scholarship under the
- 56 program has obtained a college degree that is necessary to become
- 57 licensed as a social worker, master social worker or certified
- 58 social worker and has received such a license from the Board of
- 59 Examiners for Social Workers and Marriage and Family Therapists,
- 60 the person shall render service as a family protection specialist
- 61 for the Department of Human Services for a period of not less than
- 62 three (3) years from the date that the person became a family
- 63 protection specialist.
- (5) Any person who receives a scholarship under the program
- 65 who fails to complete a program of study that is necessary to
- 66 become licensed as a social worker, master social worker or

- 67 certified social worker, or who fails to receive such a license
- 68 from the Board of Examiners for Social Workers and Marriage and
- 69 Family Therapists, shall become liable immediately to the Board of

Trustees of State Institutions of Higher Learning for the sum of 70 71 all scholarship awards made to that person, plus interest accruing 72 at the current Stafford Loan rate at the time the person 73 discontinues his or her participation in the program. Any person 74 who fails to complete his or her service obligation as a family 75 protection specialist for the Department of Human Services for not 76 less than three (3) years, as required under subsection (4) of 77 this section, shall become liable immediately to the board for the 78 sum of all scholarship awards made to that person, plus interest 79 accruing at the current Stafford Loan rate at the time the person discontinues his or her service. - It is the intent of the Legislature that the pursuit of 84 85 necessary college education by family protection workers through 86 the scholarship program shall not interfere with the duties of the 87 family protection workers with the Department of Human Services. The department shall promulgate regulations regarding family 88 protection workers who participate in the scholarship program to 89 90 ensure that such participation does not interfere with their 91 duties with the department.
- 92 The Board of Trustees of State Institutions of Higher Learning shall promulgate rules and regulations necessary for the 93 94 proper administration of the scholarship program established under 95 this section. The board shall be the administering agency of the 96 program.
- 97 If insufficient funds are available to fully fund 98 scholarship awards to all eligible students, the Board of Trustees 99 of State Institutions of Higher Learning shall make the awards to first-time students on a first-come, first-served basis; however, 100 101 priority consideration shall be given to persons previously 102 receiving awards under the program.

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103 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from 104 and after July 1, 2007.
