HOUSE BILL NO. 514

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 49-1-15, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO REVISE THE MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS OF PERSONS WHO MAY BE APPOINTED AS CONSERVATION OFFICERS FOR THE DEPARTMENT OF WILDLIFE, FISHERIES AND PARKS; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSE.

- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 6 **SECTION 1.** Section 49-1-15, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 7 amended as follows:
- 8 49-1-15. (1) All appointments of conservation officers
- 9 shall be under rules adopted and promulgated by the commission.
- 10 No person shall be appointed from and after July 1, 2007, unless
- 11 he meets the following requirements:
- 12 (a) Is at least twenty-one (21) years of age; and
- (b) (i) Has successfully completed sixty-four (64)
- 14 semester hours at an accredited community college or university;
- 15 (ii) has an associate degree from an accredited community college;
- 16 (iii) has passed the Law Enforcement Academy and has at least five
- 17 (5) years experience in law enforcement; or (iv) has a minimum of
- 18 three and one-half (3-1/2) years of military service.
- 19 (2) Each applicant, prior to entering into performance of
- 20 his duties, at the expense of the department, shall attend and
- 21 complete an appropriate curriculum in the field of law enforcement
- 22 at the Mississippi Law Enforcement Officers' Training Academy or
- 23 other training academy whose curriculum complies with requirements
- 24 of the Board on Law Enforcement Officer Standards and Training.
- 25 Conservation officers shall, on a periodic basis, be required to
- 26 successfully complete additional advanced courses in law
- 27 enforcement in order that they will be properly improved and
- 28 trained in the modern, technical advances of law enforcement.

29 **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from

30 and after July 1, 2007.
