## HOUSE BILL NO. 540

1 2 3	AN ACT TO AMEND SECTIONS 23-15-627 AND 23-15-631, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO PROHIBIT THE ISSUANCE OF AN ABSENTEE BALLOT TO INCARCERATED PERSONS; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
5	SECTION 1. Section 23-15-627, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
6	amended as follows:
7	23-15-627. The registrar shall be responsible for furnishing
8	an absentee ballot application form to any elector authorized to
9	receive an absentee ballot. Absentee ballot applications shall be
10	furnished to a person only upon the oral or written request of the
11	elector who seeks to vote by absentee ballot; however, the parent,
12	child, spouse, sibling, legal guardian, those empowered with a
13	power of attorney for that elector's affairs or agent of the
14	elector may orally request an absentee ballot application on
15	behalf of the elector. An absentee ballot application must have
16	the seal of the circuit or municipal clerk affixed to it and be
17	initialed by the registrar or his deputy in order to be utilized
18	to obtain an absentee ballot. A reproduction of an absentee
19	ballot application shall not be valid unless it is a reproduction
20	provided by the office of the registrar of the jurisdiction in
21	which the election is being held and which contains the seal and
22	initials required by this section. An application shall not be
23	accepted from a person who is imprisoned at the time of making the
24	application. Such application shall be substantially in the
25	following form:

115	SECTION 2. Section 23-15-631, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
116	amended as follows:
117	23-15-631. (1) The registrar shall enclose with each ballot
118	provided to an absent elector separate printed instructions
119	furnished by him containing the following:
120	(a) All absentee voters, excepting those with temporary
121	or permanent physical disabilities or those who are sixty-five
122	(65) years of age or older, who mark their ballots in the county
123	of the residence shall use the registrar of that county as the
124	witness. The absentee voter shall come to the office of the
125	registrar and neither the registrar nor his deputy shall be
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- required to go out of the registrar's office to serve as an attesting witness.
- 128 (b) Upon receipt of the enclosed ballot, you will not
- 129 mark the ballot except in view or sight of the attesting witness.
- 130 In the sight or view of the attesting witness, mark the ballot
- 131 according to instructions.
- 132 (c) After marking the ballot, fill out and sign the
- 133 "ELECTOR'S CERTIFICATE" on back of the envelope so that the
- 134 signature shall be across the flap of the envelope so as to insure
- 135 the integrity of the ballot. All absent electors shall have the
- 136 attesting witness sign the "ATTESTING WITNESS CERTIFICATE" across
- 137 the flap on back of the envelope. Place necessary postage on the
- 138 envelope and deposit it in the post office or some government
- 139 receptacle provided for deposit of mail so that the absent
- 140 elector's ballot, excepting presidential absentee ballots, will
- 141 reach the registrar in which your precinct is located not later
- 142 than 5:00 p.m. on the day preceding the date of the election.
- Any notary public, United States postmaster, assistant United
- 144 States postmaster, United States postal supervisor, clerk in
- 145 charge of a contract postal station, or any officer having
- 146 authority to administer an oath or take an acknowledgment may be
- 147 an attesting witness; provided, however, that in the case of an
- 148 absent elector who is temporarily or permanently physically
- 149 disabled, the attesting witness may be any person eighteen (18)
- 150 years of age or older and such person is not required to have the
- 151 authority to administer an oath. If a postmaster, assistant
- 152 postmaster, postal supervisor, or clerk in charge of a contract
- 153 postal station acts as an attesting witness, his signature on the
- 154 elector's certificate must be authenticated by the cancellation
- 155 stamp of their respective post offices. If one or the other
- 156 officers herein named acts as attesting witness, his signature on
- 157 the elector's certificate, together with his title and address,
- 158 but no seal, shall be required. Any affidavits made by an absent

elector who is in the Armed Forces may be executed before a commissioned officer, warrant officer, or noncommissioned officer not lower in grade than sergeant rating or any person authorized

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to administer oaths.

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- (d) When the application accompanies the ballot it
  shall not be returned in the same envelope as the ballot but shall
  be returned in a separate preaddressed envelope provided by the
  registrar.
- (e) A person who is a candidate for public office may
  not be an attesting witness for any absentee ballot upon which the
  person's name appears.
- 170 (f) Any voter casting an absentee ballot who declares 171 that he requires assistance to vote by reason of blindness, temporary or permanent physical disability or inability to read or 172 write, shall be entitled to receive assistance in the marking of 173 174 his absentee ballot and in completing the affidavit on the 175 absentee ballot envelope. The voter may be given assistance by anyone of the voter's choice other than a candidate whose name 176 177 appears on the absentee ballot being marked, or the voter's 178 employer, or agent of that employer. In order to ensure the 179 integrity of the ballot, any person who provides assistance to an 180 absentee voter shall be required to sign and complete the 181 "Certificate of Person Providing Voter Assistance" on the absentee 182 ballot envelope.
- 183 <u>(g) Any person who is currently serving a sentence of</u> 184 imprisonment may not make an application for an absentee ballot.
- 185 (2) The foregoing instructions required to be provided by
  186 the registrar to the elector shall also constitute the substantive
  187 law pertaining to the handling of absentee ballots by the elector
  188 and registrar.
- SECTION 3. The Attorney General of the State of Mississippi shall submit this act, immediately upon approval by the Governor, or upon approval by the Legislature subsequent to a veto, to the H. B. No. 540 \* HR40/R249\*

193	District Court for the District of Columbia in accordance with the
194	provisions of the Voting Rights Act of 1965, as amended and

section 4. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after the date it is effectuated under Section 5 of the Voting Rights Act of 1965, as amended and extended.
