## HOUSE BILL NO. 639

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 71-3-51, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO
REMOVE REVIEW OF WORKERS' COMPENSATION CLAIMS BY CIRCUIT COURTS;
TO PROVIDE FOR DIRECT APPEAL TO THE MISSISSIPPI SUPREME COURT FROM
THE WORKERS' COMPENSATION COMMISSION; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
SECTION 1. Section 71-3-51, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
amended as follows:

8 71-3-51. The final award of the commission shall be 9 conclusive and binding unless either party to the controversy 10 shall, within thirty (30) days from the date of its filing in the 11 office of the commission and notification to the parties, appeal 12 therefrom to the <u>Supreme Court of Mississippi</u>.

Such appeal may be taken by filing notice of appeal with the 13 commission, whereupon the commission shall under its certificate 14 transmit to the Supreme Court all documents and papers on file in 15 16 the matter, together with a transcript of the evidence, the 17 findings, and award, which shall thereupon become the record of the cause. Appeals shall be considered only upon the record as 18 made before the commission. The Supreme Court shall always be 19 deemed open for hearing of such appeals, the justices may hear the 20 21 same at termtime by panel or sitting en banc. The Supreme Court 22 shall review all questions of law and of fact. If no prejudicial error be found, the matter shall be affirmed and remanded to the 23 commission for enforcement. If prejudicial error be found, the 24 same shall be reversed and the Supreme Court shall enter such 25 26 judgment or award as the commission should have entered. \* \* \* No controversy shall be heard by the commission or an award 27

29 either before a federal court or in any court in this state.

Any award of compensation made by the <u>commission</u> and appealed to the Supreme Court shall bear the same interest and penalties as do other judgments awarded in the <u>commission hearing</u>.

33 **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from 34 and after July 1, 2007.
