## HOUSE BILL NO. 664

1 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 97-17-70, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, 2 TO CLARIFY DEFENSES TO THE CRIME OF RECEIVING STOLEN PROPERTY; AND 3 FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
SECTION 1. Section 97-17-70, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
amended as follows:

97-17-70. (1) A person commits the crime of receiving stolen property if he intentionally possesses, receives, retains or disposes of stolen property knowing that it has been stolen or having reasonable grounds to believe it has been stolen, unless the property is possessed, received, retained or disposed of with intent to restore it to the owner.

13 (2) The fact that the person who stole the property has not 14 been convicted, apprehended or identified is not a defense to a 15 charge of receiving stolen property.

16 (3) The fact that the person charged hereunder is the person 17 who stole the property is not a defense to a charge of receiving 18 stolen property; provided, however, that no person shall be 19 charged in the same county with both stealing and receiving the 20 same property. Proof that such person stole the property shall be 21 prima facie evidence that said person knew the property had been 22 stolen.

23 (4) Any person who shall be convicted of receiving stolen 24 property which exceeds Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) in value 25 shall be committed to the custody of the State Department of 26 Corrections for a term not exceeding ten (10) years or by a fine 27 of not more than Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00), or both.

28 (5) Any person who shall be convicted of receiving stolen 29 property which does not exceed Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) in 30 value shall be punished by imprisonment for not more than six (6) 31 months or by a fine of not more than One Thousand Dollars 32 (\$1,000.00), or both.

33 **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from 34 and after July 1, 2007.
