- 6 DRIVER'S LICENSE; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
- 7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 8 **SECTION 1.** Section 63-1-9, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 9 amended as follows:

- 10 63-1-9. (1) No driver's license, intermediate license or
- 11 temporary learning permit shall be issued pursuant to this
- 12 article:
- 13 (a) To any person under the age of eighteen (18) years
- 14 except as provided in this article.
- 15 (b) To any person whose license to operate a motor
- 16 vehicle on the highways of Mississippi has been previously revoked
- 17 or suspended by this state or any other state and/or territory of
- 18 the United States or the District of Columbia, and such revocation
- 19 or suspension period has not expired.
- 20 (c) To any person who is an habitual drunkard or who is
- 21 addicted to the use of other narcotic drugs.
- 22 (d) To any person who would not be able by reason of
- 23 physical or mental disability, in the opinion of the commissioner
- 24 or other person authorized to grant an operator's license, to
- 25 operate a motor vehicle on the highways with safety. However,
- 26 persons who have one (1) arm or leg, or have arms or legs
- 27 deformed, and have their car provided with mechanical devices
- 28 whereby they are able to drive in a safe manner over the highways,
- 29 if otherwise qualified, shall receive an operator's license the H. B. No. 708 * HR40/R1325* $_{\rm 07/HR40/R1325}$

- 30 same as other persons. Moreover, deafness shall not be a bar to
- 31 obtaining a license.
- 32 (e) To any person who is under the age of seventeen
- 33 (17) years to drive any motor vehicle while in use as a school bus
- 34 for the transportation of pupils to or from school, or to drive
- 35 any motor vehicle while in use as a public or common carrier of
- 36 persons or property.
- 37 (f) To any person as an operator who has previously
- 38 been adjudged to be afflicted with and suffering from any mental
- 39 disability and who has not at time of application been restored to
- 40 mental competency.
- 41 (g) To any unmarried person under the age of eighteen
- 42 (18) years who does not at the time of application present a
- 43 diploma or other certificate of high school graduation or a
- 44 general education development certificate issued to the person in
- 45 this state or any other state, or documentation that the person:
- 46 (i) Is enrolled and making satisfactory progress
- 47 in a course leading to a general education development
- 48 certificate;
- 49 (ii) Is enrolled in school in this state or any
- 50 other state;
- 51 (iii) Is enrolled in a "nonpublic school," as such
- 52 term is defined in Section 37-13-91(2)(i); or
- (iv) Is unable to attend any school program due to
- 54 circumstances deemed acceptable as set out in Section 63-1-10.
- (h) To any person under the age of eighteen (18) years
- 56 who has been convicted under Section 63-11-30.
- 57 (2) All permits and licenses issued on or before June 30,
- 58 2007, shall be valid according to the terms upon which issued.
- 59 From and after July 1, 2007:
- 60 (a) A temporary driving permit may be issued to any
- 61 person who is at least <u>sixteen (16)</u> years of age who otherwise
- 62 meets the requirements of this article.

- (b) An intermediate license may be issued to any person who is at least sixteen (16) years of age who otherwise meets the requirements of this article and who has held a temporary driving permit for at least twelve (12) months without any conviction under Section 63-11-30 or of a moving violation. Any conviction under Section 63-11-30 or of a moving violation shall restart the
- 69 twelve-month requirement for the holding of a temporary driving
- 70 permit before an applicant can qualify for an intermediate
- 71 license.
- 72 (c) A driver's license may be issued to any person who
- 73 is at least seventeen (17) years of age who otherwise meets the
- 74 requirements of this article and who has held an intermediate
- 75 license for at least $\underline{\text{twelve (12)}}$ months without any conviction
- 76 under Section 63-11-30 or of a moving violation. Any conviction
- 77 under Section 63-11-30 or of a moving violation shall restart the
- 78 twelve-month requirement for the holding of an intermediate
- 79 license before an applicant can qualify for a driver's license.
- 80 However, a person who is at least seventeen (17) years of age who
- 81 has been issued a temporary driving permit and who has never been
- 82 convicted under Section 63-11-30 or of a moving violation shall
- 83 not be required to have held an intermediate license.
- 84 (d) An applicant for a Mississippi driver's license
- 85 who, at the time of application, is at least seventeen (17) years
- 86 of age and who has held a valid motor vehicle driver's license
- 87 issued by another state for at least twelve (12) months shall not
- 88 be required to hold a temporary driving permit or an intermediate
- 89 license before being issued a driver's license.
- 90 (3) The commissioner shall ensure that the temporary driving
- 91 permit, intermediate license and driver's license issued under
- 92 this article are clear, distinct and easily distinguishable from
- 93 one another.
- 94 **SECTION 2.** Section 63-1-21, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 95 amended as follows:

- 96 63-1-21. (1) Every applicant for a new or original driver's 97 or operator's license, except persons holding an out-of-state 98 license, shall first obtain a temporary driving permit upon the 99 payment of a fee of One Dollar (\$1.00) to the Department of Public
- 100 Safety and upon the successful completion of the examination
- 101 provided for in Section 63-1-33 and the payment of the fee for
- 102 such examination provided for in Section 63-1-43.
- 103 (2) A temporary driving permit entitles the holder, provided
- 104 the permit is in his immediate possession, to drive a motor
- 105 vehicle other than a motorcycle on the highways of the State of
- 106 Mississippi only when accompanied by a licensed operator who is at
- 107 least twenty-one (21) years of age and who is actually occupying
- 108 the seat beside the driver. A temporary driving permit may be
- 109 issued to any applicant who is at least sixteen (16) years of age.
- A temporary driving permit shall be valid for a period of one (1) 110
- 111 year from the date of issue.
- 112 An intermediate license allows unsupervised driving from
- 6:00 a.m. to 10:00 p.m. At all other times the intermediate 113
- 114 licensee must be supervised by a parent, guardian or other person
- 115 age twenty-one (21) years or older who holds a valid driver's
- 116 license under this article and who is actually occupying the seat
- 117 beside the driver.

- 118 (4)The fee for issuance of an intermediate license shall be
- 119 Five Dollars (\$5.00).
- 120 Except as otherwise provided by Section 63-1-6, every
- applicant for a restricted motorcycle operator's license or a 121
- 122 motorcycle endorsement shall first obtain a temporary motorcycle
- 123 driving permit upon the payment of a fee of One Dollar (\$1.00) to
- the Department of Public Safety, and upon the successful 124
- 125 completion of the examination provided for in Section 63-1-33, and
- payment of the fee for said examination provided for in Section 126
- 127 63-1-43. All applicants for such temporary permit shall (a) be at

129	under the direct supervision of a person at least twenty-one (21)			
130	years of age who possesses either a valid driver's or operator's			
131	license with a motorcycle endorsement or a valid restricted			
132	motorcycle operator's license; (c) be prohibited from transporting			
133	a passenger on a motorcycle; (d) be prohibited from operating a			
134	motorcycle upon any controlled access highway; and (e) be			
135	prohibited from operating a motorcycle during the hours of 6:00			
136	p.m. through 6:00 a.m. Temporary motorcycle driving permits shall			
137	be valid for the same period of time and may be renewed upon the			
138	same conditions as temporary driving permits issued for vehicles			
139	other than motorcycles.			
140	SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from
