HOUSE BILL NO. 818

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 71-1-1, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO 1 REQUIRE THE STATE BOARD OF HEALTH TO ESTABLISH AN OCCUPATIONAL 2 HEALTH AND SAFETY PROGRAM; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 3 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: SECTION 1. Section 71-1-1, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 5 amended as follows: 6 7 71-1-1. The State Board of Health shall establish an 8 occupational health and safety program and is empowered: (a) To employ * * * qualified personnel as staff to 9 carry out the duties and responsibilities set forth herein; 10 11 (b) To develop and make available upon request to all 12 employers of the state, including public employers, information, consultation and assistance related to safety and health laws, 13 regulations, measures and standards, and to participate and assist 14 with training and educational programs that are directed toward 15 employee safety and disease prevention; 16 (c) To employ * * * personnel and procure * * * 17 equipment as necessary to provide on-site consultive services 18 related to assistance, information, education or training of 19 employers and employees toward compliance with safety and health 20 standards and toward the establishment of safety and health 21 programs to prevent work-connected disabilities; 22 (d) To collect, compile and report statistics related 23 to work-connected disabilities in Mississippi and such statistical 24 25 work shall be performed in cooperation with other statistic-gathering agencies with the federal and state 26

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27 governments. Such statistical reports as may be available shall28 be made known to employers and employees.

(e) To receive such federal or state grants and
appropriations as available to further the education, training and
assistance to the employers and employees of Mississippi in
preventing work-connected disabilities.

33 (f) Nothing in this section shall be construed as 34 authorizing the State Board of Health to administer or enforce in 35 any way the Federal Occupational Safety and Health Act, known as 36 OSHA.

37 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from38 and after July 1, 2007.
