HOUSE BILL NO. 845

1	AN ACT TO ESTABLISH THE YOUTH COURT DEFENDER STANDARDS
2	COUNCIL; TO PROVIDE THE PURPOSE AND MEMBERSHIP OF THE COUNCIL; TO
3	PROVIDE THAT THE COUNCIL SHALL EMPLOY AN EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR; TO
4	PROVIDE THAT THE COUNCIL, FOR BUDGETARY PURPOSES ONLY, SHALL
5	OPERATE UNDER THE AUTHORITY OF THE OFFICE OF ADMINISTRATIVE
6	COURTS; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

- BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 7
- SECTION 1. (1) There is established the Youth Court 8
- 9 Defender Standards Council. The purpose of the council is to
- 10 establish, implement and enforce polices and standards for a
- comprehensive and effective system of legal representation for 11
- 12 children in youth court delinquency proceedings throughout the
- State of Mississippi. The standards for the council shall 13
- include, but are not limited to, the following: 14
- (a) Standards for maximum caseloads for youth court 15
- 16 defenders taking into consideration the defender's youth court
- 17 caseload and non-youth court caseload;
- (b) Standards for minimum education, training and 18
- experience of attorneys assigned as youth court defenders; 19
- (c) Standards for assessing the need for expert, 20
- 21 investigative and social services in youth court public defender
- 22 offices and on individual cases; and
- 23 (d) Standards for establishing salary ranges for
- employees of youth court defender offices and reasonable hourly 24
- 25 rates to be paid attorneys and defense team members in individual
- 26 cases.
- 27 (2) The membership of the council shall consist of the
- following five (5) members as follows: 28

- 29 (a) One member appointed by the Youth Court Judges
- 30 Conference;
- 31 (b) One member appointed by the Director of the
- 32 Division of Youth Services;
- 33 (c) One member appointed by the President of the County
- 34 Supervisors Association;
- 35 (d) One member appointed by the Mississippi Public
- 36 Defender Association who must be an attorney with experience in
- 37 youth court defense; and
- 38 (e) One member appointed by the Mississippi Bar
- 39 Association.
- 40 (3) Council members shall serve for three (3) years and
- 41 shall be paid for travel expenses to meetings, as provided in
- 42 Section 25-3-41, which shall be the members only compensation for
- 43 serving on the council. At the first meeting, which shall be
- 44 organized by the Administrative Office of Courts within ninety
- 45 (90) days of the effective date of this act, the council shall
- 46 elect a chairperson from its membership and adopt rules and
- 47 procedures for conducting its business.
- 48 (4) The council shall employ an executive director who shall
- 49 be an attorney licensed to practice in the State of Mississippi
- 50 and who shall have experience in the representation of children in
- 51 Youth Court. The executive director may also serve as a resource
- 52 counsel to youth court defenders throughout the state. The
- 53 director shall be compensated at a rate determined by the council
- 54 but such compensation shall not exceed 90% of the pay for the
- 55 Director of the Administrative Office of Courts.
- 56 (5) The Administrative Office of Courts shall provide
- 57 suitable office space, reasonable office expenses and necessary
- 58 travel costs for the council and executive director and shall
- 59 provide administrative and fiscal support to the council. For
- 60 budget purposes only the council shall operate under the authority
- of the Administrative Office of Courts.

- 62 (6) The council shall cooperate with any individual, private
- 63 or public agency, whether state, local or federal, or with any
- 64 public or private law school, with any public or private
- 65 institution of higher learning to obtain by gift, grant or
- 66 otherwise any financial, professional, investigatory, training,
- 67 education or research or other assistance; provided, however, that
- 68 any grants or any financial assistance received for the purposes
- 69 set out in this subsection shall be paid over to the
- 70 Administrative Office of Courts and administered consistent with
- 71 the provisions of this act and the rules and regulations of the
- 72 Mississippi Department of Finance and Administration.
- 73 **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 74 and after July 1, 2007.
