## COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE FOR HOUSE BILL NO. 864

AN ACT TO PROVIDE FOR THE WAIVER OF TUITION AND REQUIRED FEES 1 2 AT THE STATE INSTITUTIONS OF HIGHER LEARNING AND COMMUNITY AND 3 JUNIOR COLLEGES FOR THE CHILDREN OF DECEASED VETERANS OF THE 4 UNITED STATES ARMED FORCES OR THE MISSISSIPPI NATIONAL GUARD WHO WERE KILLED IN THE LINE OF DUTY AND THE CHILDREN OF CERTAIN 5 DISABLED VETERANS OF THE UNITED STATES ARMED FORCES OR THE 6 7 MISSISSIPPI NATIONAL GUARD; TO REQUIRE APPLICATIONS FOR A WAIVER 8 TO INCLUDE DOCUMENTATION CONCERNING THE DECEASED VETERAN'S DEATH OR THE DECEASED VETERAN'S DEATH OR THE VETERAN'S DISABILITY; TO 9 PROVIDE THAT TUITION MAY BE WAIVED FOR BOTH FULL-TIME AND 10 PART-TIME STUDENTS; TO PROVIDE THAT THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF STATE 11 INSTITUTIONS OF HIGHER LEARNING SHALL BE THE ADMINISTERING AGENCY 12 13 OF THE TUITION WAIVER PROGRAM; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 14

15 SECTION 1. (1) Beginning with the 2007-2008 academic year, any resident of the State of Mississippi who is (a) the child of a 16 deceased veteran of the United States Armed Forces or deceased 17 18 veteran of the Mississippi National Guard on active federal duty who was killed in the line of duty, or (b) the child of an 19 honorably discharged veteran of the United States Armed Forces or 20 an honorably discharged veteran of the Mississippi National Guard 21 22 whose disability occurred while on active federal duty who has a service-connected disability that is permanently and no less than 23 seventy percent (70%) disabling according to the rules and 24 25 regulations of the United States Department of Veterans Affairs, may apply for a waiver of tuition at any state institution of 26 27 higher learning or public community or junior college in the state. For the purposes of this section, the term "child" means a 28 29 natural child, legally adopted child or stepchild.

(2) A child of a deceased or disabled veteran who qualifies 30 for a tuition waiver under this section who is enrolled in or 31 accepted for enrollment at a state institution of higher learning 32

33 or a public community or junior college in Mississippi may apply 34 for a waiver of tuition. In order to be eligible, a child may not 35 have reached the age of twenty-three (23) years on the first day of the semester or term for which the child is enrolling; however, 36 37 any child who has begun earning academic credit in furtherance of 38 an associate or baccalaureate degree or certificate program before 39 attaining the age of twenty-three (23) years whose college 40 instruction is interrupted for any reason is eligible to receive academic waivers in furtherance of the degree or certificate 41 42 toward which the student is working, subject to the conditions prescribed in subsection (3). An application must be accompanied 43 44 by proper proof that the deceased veteran is a veteran of the United States Armed Forces or the Mississippi National Guard and 45 46 that the veteran was killed in the line of duty, or the veteran is an honorably discharged veteran of the United States Armed Forces 47 48 or the Mississippi National Guard and that the veteran has a 49 service-connected disability that is permanently and no less than 50 seventy percent (70%) disabling according to the rules and regulations of the United States Department of Veterans Affairs. 51

(3) A waiver of tuition awarded under this section may not 52 exceed the actual cost of tuition at the institution or college at 53 which the child of a veteran is enrolled or accepted for 54 55 enrollment. The amount of tuition waived for the child of a disabled veteran shall be reduced by the amount that such child 56 57 receives from any grant under a federal educational assistance 58 program or any other source. For purposes of this section, the 59 term "tuition" means the semester or term charges and all required fees; however, the term "tuition" does not include housing costs, 60 books, food, school supplies, materials, dues or fees for 61 extracurricular activities or any costs, fees or expenses for or 62 63 associated with a summer session. Both full-time and part-time 64 students may apply for a waiver under this section. Students 65 enrolling on a full-time basis may receive a maximum of four (4) \* HR03/ R1292CS. 2\* H. B. 66 annual waivers, and in those instances when a degree program 67 requires five (5) years for completion, five (5) annual waivers. 68 The number of waivers which may be granted to a student attending 69 school on a part-time basis may not exceed the length of time 70 required to complete the associate or baccalaureate degree or 71 certificate program toward which the student is working. A person 72 who has a baccalaureate degree is not eligible for a waiver of tuition under this section, and any person who has an associate 73 74 degree may receive waivers only in furtherance of a baccalaureate 75 degree.

(4) As a condition for renewal of a waiver of tuition, a
student must make steady academic progress toward a certificate or
associate or baccalaureate degree, as certified by the
institution's registrar, and must maintain a cumulative grade
point average of at least 2.00 calculated on a 4.00 scale at the
end of each term.

(5) The Board of Trustees of State Institutions of Higher
Learning and the State Board for Community and Junior Colleges
jointly shall promulgate rules and regulations necessary to carry
out the purposes of this section. The Board of Trustees of State
Institutions of Higher Learning is the administering agency of the
tuition waiver program.

88 (6) It is the intent of the Legislature that all children of deceased or disabled veterans who are eligible for a waiver of 89 90 tuition under this section be granted a waiver provided that 91 monies are specifically appropriated by the Legislature to 92 sufficiently reimburse the state institutions of higher learning and public community and junior colleges for the losses they incur 93 94 in implementing the tuition waiver program. If the Legislature 95 specifically appropriates monies to implement the program but such funding is insufficient at a state institution or community or 96 97 junior college to provide a waiver of tuition for all eligible 98 applicants at that institution or college, the board shall grant \* HR03/ R1292CS. 2\* H. 99 the tuition waivers to first-time students on a first-come,

100 first-served basis; however, priority consideration must be given 101 to persons previously receiving waivers under this section who are 102 making steady academic progress toward completion of a certificate 103 program or associate or baccalaureate degree.

104 **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from 105 and after July 1, 2007.
