HOUSE BILL NO. 876

1 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 97-9-73, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO 2 REVISE THE PENALTIES FOR FLEEING OR ELUDING A LAW ENFORCEMENT 3 OFFICER IN A MOTOR VEHICLE; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
SECTION 1. Section 97-9-73, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
amended as follows:

7 97-9-73. (1) It shall be unlawful for any person to obstruct or resist by force, or violence, or threats, or in any 8 other manner, his lawful arrest or the lawful arrest of another 9 person by any state, local or federal law enforcement officer, and 10 11 any person or persons so doing shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof, shall be punished by a fine of not 12 more than Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00), or by imprisonment in 13 the county jail not more than six (6) months, or both. 14

15 (2) The driver of a motor vehicle who is given a visible or audible signal by a law enforcement officer by hand, voice, 16 emergency light or siren directing the driver to bring his motor 17 18 vehicle to a stop when such signal is given by a law enforcement officer acting in the lawful performance of duty who has a 19 20 reasonable suspicion to believe that the driver in question has committed a crime, and who willfully fails to obey such direction, 21 shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction shall be 22 punished by a fine not to exceed One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) 23 or imprisoned in the county jail for a term not to exceed six (6) 24 months, or both. 25 (3) Any person who is guilty of violating subsection (2) of 26 27 this section by operating a motor vehicle in such a manner as to

indicate a reckless or willful disregard for the safety of persons 28 or property, or who so operates a motor vehicle in a manner 29 manifesting extreme indifference to the value of human life, shall 30 31 be guilty of a felony, and upon conviction thereof, shall be 32 punished by a fine not to exceed Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00), or by commitment to the custody of the State 33 Department of Corrections for not more than five (5) years, or 34 35 both. (4) It shall not be unlawful for the driver of a motor 36 vehicle after dusk to proceed to the nearest well-lighted, public 37 38 area before stopping as long as the driver does not exceed the 39 speed limit. 40 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from

41 and after July 1, 2007.
