HOUSE BILL NO. 911

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 49-7-31.5, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, 1 2 TO ALLOW LANDOWNERS TO TAKE NUISANCE ANIMALS, ON PROPERTY OWNED OR 3 LEASED BY THEM, WITH ANY WEAPON, WITH OR WITHOUT THE AID OF LIGHT WITH A PERMIT ISSUED BY THE DEPARTMENT OF WILDLIFE, FISHERIES AND 4 PARKS; TO ADD SKUNKS AND FOXES TO THE CLASS OF ANIMALS FOR WHICH 5 б IT IS NOT UNLAWFUL TO HUNT OR TRAP DURING OPEN SEASON FOR THE 7 TAKING OF FUR-BEARING ANIMALS; TO PROHIBIT THE HUNTING OR TAKING OF NUISANCE ANIMALS WITH THE USE OF LIGHT ON OR FROM PUBLIC ROADS OR LEVEES; TO AUTHORIZE THE HUNTING OF NUISANCE ANIMALS WITH 8 9 ELECTRONIC CALLS AND BAIT, SUBJECT TO CERTAIN EXCEPTIONS; TO 10 11 EXEMPT THE LANDOWNERS FROM THE LICENSE REQUIREMENTS TO HUNT OR TRAP NUISANCE ANIMALS ON THEIR OWN PROPERTY; TO REQUIRE AGENTS OF 12 LANDOWNERS HUNTING OR TRAPPING NUISANCE ANIMALS TO POSSESS A 13 HUNTING OR TRAPPING LICENSE UNLESS OTHERWISE EXEMPT; TO REQUIRE 14 THE COMMISSION ON WILDLIFE, FISHERIES AND PARKS TO ESTABLISH THE 15 16 RULES AND REGULATIONS ON TRAPPING NUISANCE ANIMALS; TO AUTHORIZE THE SALE OF THE MEAT AND HIDE OF NUISANCE ANIMALS; TO PROHIBIT THE 17 TRAPPING AND RELEASE OF WILD HOGS IN DIFFERENT LOCATIONS AND TO PRESCRIBE PENALTIES FOR VIOLATIONS; TO REQUIRE THE WEARING OF 18 19 HUNTER ORANGE WHEN HUNTING NUISANCE ANIMALS DURING ANY OPEN GUN 20 21 SEASON ON DEER; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

22 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 23 SECTION 1. Section 49-7-31.5, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 24 amended as follows:

49-7-31.5. (1) (a) The hunting of * * * nuisance animals
shall be regulated by the Mississippi Department of Wildlife,
Fisheries and Parks.

(b) Landowners, agricultural leaseholders or their
designated agents may take * * * nuisance animals with any type of
weapon, with or without the aid of light, year-round on lands
owned or leased by them with a permit issued by the Department of
Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks. All other hunters must abide by
commission regulations concerning weapons at night.
(2) The taking of any animal or animals other than beavers,

35 nutria, wild hogs, coyote, skunks or foxes by the use of a trap or

36 traps is unlawful except during the time the season is open for 37 the taking of fur-bearing animals.

38 (3) <u>Nuisance animals</u> may be * * * chased or pursued with
39 dogs, except as provided in Section 49-7-32, year-round by
40 licensed hunters. <u>Nuisance animals may not be hunted or taken</u>
41 <u>with the use of a light on or from public roads or levees.</u>

42 (4) <u>Nuisance animals may be hunted with the aid of</u>
43 electronic calls.

44 (5) Nuisance animals may be trapped with the aid of bait or
45 lures, except during the open hunting season on turkey.

46 (6) No hunting or trapping license is required for
47 landowners hunting or trapping on their own property. Designated
48 agents of the landowner must possess either a hunting license or
49 trapping license, unless otherwise exempt.

50 <u>(7)</u> Traps set for nuisance animals are not required to be 51 <u>tagged or numbered.</u> The commission shall adopt and promulgate 52 <u>rules and regulations regarding the trapping of nuisance animals.</u>

53 (8) The meat and hides of nuisance animals may be bought and
54 sold year-round.

55 (9) Wild hogs may not be caught or trapped and released into 56 the wild at other locations different from the location where the 57 wild hog was caught or trapped, only fox and coyote may be caught 58 and relocated. A violation of this subsection is a Class I

59 violation and is punishable as provided under Section 49-7-141.

60 (10) When hunting nuisance animals during any open gun
61 season for deer, a hunter must wear at least five hundred (500)
62 square inches of solid unbroken fluorescent orange.

63 **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from 64 and after July 1, 2007.
