HOUSE BILL NO. 1031

A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION TO CREATE A STUDY COMMITTEE TO STUDY 1 THE TAX SYSTEM OF THIS STATE AND TO MAKE RECOMMENDATIONS THEREON 2 3 TO THE LEGISLATURE; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 4 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MISSISSIPPI HOUSE OF 5 REPRESENTATIVES, THE SENATE CONCURRING THEREIN, That: (1) There is hereby created a study committee on the tax 6 7 system of Mississippi. The committee shall make a report of its 8 findings and recommendations to the Legislature during the 2007 Regular Legislative Session, including any recommended 9 10 legislation. 11 (2) The task force shall be composed of the following ten (10) members: 12 13 (a) Five (5) members appointed by the Speaker of the 14 Mississippi House of Representatives as follows: 15 (i) The Chairman of the House Ways and Means Committee; and 16 (ii) Four (4) other members of the Mississippi 17 18 House of Representatives. (b) Five (5) members appointed by the Lieutenant 19 Governor of the State of Mississippi as follows: 20 (i) The Chairman of the Senate Finance Committee; 21 22 and (ii) Four (4) other members of the Senate. 23 Appointments shall be made within thirty (30) days after 24 (3) 25 the adoption of this resolution, and, within fifteen (15) days thereafter on a day to be designated jointly by the Speaker of the 26 27 House and the Lieutenant Governor, the task force shall meet and

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organize by selecting from its membership a chairman and a vice 28 29 chairman. The vice chairman shall also serve as secretary and 30 shall be responsible for keeping all records of the task force. Α majority of the members of the task force shall constitute a 31 32 quorum. In the selection of its officers and the adoption of 33 rules, resolutions and reports, an affirmative vote of a majority 34 of the task force shall be required. All members shall be notified in writing of all meetings, such notices to be mailed at 35 least fifteen (15) days before the date on which a meeting is to 36 37 be held.

38 (4) The task force shall study and make recommendations 39 regarding the imposition of state taxes and the granting of tax 40 exemptions in all areas of taxation including, but not limited to, 41 sales taxes, income taxes, privilege taxes, fuel taxes, diversions 42 of taxes and the relationship between state and local taxes.

43 (5) Members of the task force shall be compensated at the 44 per diem rate authorized by Section 25-3-69 and shall be reimbursed in accordance with Section 25-3-41 for mileage and 45 actual expenses incurred in the performance of their duties. 46 47 Members of the task force shall be paid from the contingent 48 expense funds of their respective houses in the same manner as 49 provided for committee meetings when the Legislature is not in 50 However, no per diem or expense for attending meetings session. of the task force will be paid to members of the task force while 51 52 the Legislature is in session. No task force member may incur per 53 diem, travel or other expenses unless previously authorized by 54 vote, at a meeting of the task force, which action shall be 55 recorded in the official minutes of the meeting.

(6) The task force shall use clerical and legal staff
already employed by the Legislature and any other staff assistance
made available to it. To effectuate the purposes of this section,
any department, division, board, bureau, commission or agency of
the state or of any political subdivision thereof shall, at the
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61 request of the chairman of the task force, provide to the task 62 force such facilities, assistance and data as will enable the task 63 force to properly carry out its task.
