HOUSE BILL NO. 1131

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 25-3-35, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO 1 INCREASE THE SALARIES OF THE JUSTICES OF THE SUPREME COURT AND 2 3 JUDGES OF THE COURT OF APPEALS; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 5 SECTION 1. Section 25-3-35, Mississippi Code of 1972, is amended as follows: 6 7 25-3-35. (1) The annual salaries of the following judges are fixed as follows, to begin at the commencement of the next 8 9 term of office immediately succeeding the existing term: Chief Justice of the Supreme Court..... \$153,000.00 10

11 Presiding Justice of the Supreme Court..... 151,000.00 Associate Justices of the Supreme Court, each.... 12 150,000.00 13 However, in addition to their present official duties, there are imposed upon the Supreme Court justices the extra duties of 14 15 making a special study of existing laws and reporting to each regular session of the Legislature such constructive suggestions 16 17 as they may deem necessary for the improvement of the administration of justice, and of identifying and directing the 18 State Librarian to apply for grants and donations from any public 19 20 or private source for the purpose of enhancing the holdings of the state law library, and of advising and counseling with the State 21 Librarian in the selection of law books for purchase and use in 2.2 the State Law Library, advising with the librarian thereof upon 23 the removal from the library of any books which may be the least 24 frequently used, and for the placing of same in a convenient 25 location so as to provide additional space for such books and 26 27 other current publications which may be more frequently used or

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called for. For such extra services each justice, from and after 28 29 January 1, 2008, shall receive a sum sufficient when added to the 30 present salaries of the justices to aggregate One Hundred Fifty-Three Thousand Dollars (\$153,000.00) for the Chief Justice, 31 32 One Hundred Fifty-One Thousand Dollars (\$151,000.00) for the 33 presiding justice, and One Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars 34 (\$150,000.00) for associate justices, per annum. As each existing 35 term expires and the above-captioned salaries become effective in 36 due course, the extra duties and compensation provided for shall 37 cease.

38 The fixed salaries as specified in this subsection (1) shall 39 be the exclusive and total compensation which can be reported to 40 the Public Employees' Retirement System for retirement purposes; 41 however, any judge in office on December 31, 2003, may continue to 42 report his expense allowance as part of his compensation for 43 retirement purposes.

44 (2) The annual salaries of the judges of the Court of
45 Appeals of Mississippi are fixed as follows, to begin at the
46 commencement of the next term of office immediately succeeding the
47 existing term:

Chief Judge of the Court of Appeals \$143,000.00 48 49 Associate Judges of the Court of Appeals, each... 140,000.00 50 However, in addition to their present official duties, there are imposed upon the judges of the Court of Appeals the extra 51 52 duties of making a special study of existing laws and reporting to the Supreme Court of the State of Mississippi such constructive 53 54 suggestions as they may deem necessary for the improvement of the 55 administration of justice, and assisting in advising and counseling with the State Librarian in the selection of law books 56 57 for purchase and use in the State Law Library, assisting in advising with the librarian thereof upon the removal from the 58 59 library of any books which may be the least frequently used, and 60 for the placing of same in a convenient location so as to provide * HR40/ R1160* H. 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additional space for such books and other current publications 61 62 which may be more frequently used or called for. For such extra services each judge, from and after January 1, 2008, shall receive 63 64 a sum sufficient when added to the present salaries of the judges 65 to aggregate One Hundred Forty-Three Thousand Dollars 66 (\$143,000.00) for the Chief Judge and One Hundred Forty Thousand Dollars (\$140,000.00) for associate judges, per annum. As each 67 68 existing term expires and the above-captioned salaries become effective in due course, the extra duties and compensation 69 70 provided for shall cease.

The fixed salaries as specified in this subsection (2) shall be the exclusive and total compensation which can be reported to the Public Employees' Retirement System for retirement purposes; however, any judge in office on December 31, 2003, may continue to report his expense allowance as part of his compensation for retirement purposes.

77 (3)The annual salaries of the chancery and circuit court 78 judges are fixed as follows, to begin at the commencement of the 79 next term of office immediately succeeding the existing term: 80 Chancery Judges, each..... \$104,170.00 81 Circuit Judges, each..... 104,170.00 82 In addition to their present official duties, there are 83 imposed upon the chancery and circuit court judges the extra duties of making a special study of existing laws relating to 84

85 trial courts and reporting to the Supreme Court of the State of Mississippi such constructive suggestions as they may deem 86 87 necessary for the improvement of the administration of justice, which shall be recommended to the Legislature by the Supreme Court 88 in the manner provided by law. The judges shall advise and 89 90 supervise in the purchase of law books for the libraries of each district, and shall study and evaluate the inventory of books and 91 92 facilities now existing in the libraries of each district to effect the removal and relocation of obsolete publications so as 93 * HR40/ R1160* H. 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to provide additional space for those books and current 94 95 publications more frequently used. The judges shall seek and identify any grants and donations from any public or private 96 97 source for the purpose of enhancing the holdings of the libraries 98 of each district. The judges shall study the existing rules 99 promulgated by the circuit and chancery court judicial 100 associations governing the operation of chancery and circuit 101 courts, and revise the same pursuant to existing laws. For such 102 extra services each judge, from and after January 1, 2004, shall 103 receive a sum sufficient when added to the present salaries of the 104 judges to aggregate One Hundred Four Thousand One Hundred Seventy 105 Dollars (\$104,170.00) per annum for each judge. Upon the 106 expiration of the existing term, the above-captioned salaries 107 become effective in due course, and the extra duties and compensation provided for shall cease. 108

109 (4) The Supreme Court shall prepare a payroll for chancery
110 judges and circuit judges and submit such payroll to the
111 Department of Finance and Administration.

(5) The annual salary of the full-time district attorneys shall be Ninety-five Thousand Seven Hundred Ninety-six Dollars (\$95,796.00).

115 (6) The annual salary of the full-time legal assistants 116 shall be not less than Fifteen Thousand Dollars (\$15,000.00) nor 117 more than eighty percent (80%) of the salary of the district 118 attorney for legal assistants who have been licensed to practice law for five (5) years or less; eighty-five percent (85%) of the 119 120 salary of the district attorney for legal assistants who have been 121 licensed to practice law for at least five (5) years but less than fifteen (15) years; and ninety percent (90%) of the salary of the 122 123 district attorney for legal assistants who have been licensed to practice law for at least fifteen (15) years or more. 124
