COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE FOR HOUSE BILL NO. 1132

AN ACT TO PROVIDE FOR A SCHOOL NURSE PROGRAM TO BE 1 2 ADMINISTERED BY THE STATE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION THROUGH THE OFFICE OF HEALTHY SCHOOLS; TO SPECIFY THE RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE 3 4 NURSES IN THE PROGRAM; TO PRESCRIBE THE DUTIES OF THE OFFICE OF HEALTHY SCHOOLS IN ADMINISTERING THE PROGRAM; TO ESTABLISH IN THE 5 б STATE TREASURY A SPECIAL FUND TO BE KNOWN AS THE SCHOOL NURSE 7 PROGRAM FUND; TO PROVIDE THAT A CERTAIN AMOUNT FROM THE TOBACCO 8 SETTLEMENT INSTALLMENT PAYMENTS RECEIVED BY THE STATE EACH YEAR 9 SHALL BE DEPOSITED INTO THE SPECIAL FUND; TO PROVIDE THAT THE LEGISLATURE SHALL ANNUALLY APPROPRIATE THE FUNDS IN THE SPECIAL 10 11 FUND TO THE STATE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION, WHICH SHALL EXPEND THE FUNDS SOLELY FOR THE PURPOSES SPECIFIED IN THIS ACT; TO AMEND 12 SECTION 43-13-405, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO CONFORM TO THE 13 PRECEDING PROVISION; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 14

15BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:16SECTION 1.16This act shall be known as the Mary Sprayberry

17 School Nurse Reorganization Act of 2007.

18 <u>SECTION 2.</u> The Mississippi Legislature makes the following 19 findings:

20 (a) School nurses play a vital role in improving the 21 health and well-being of our children and make a health difference 22 in every child's future. Nurses have been a part of the school setting since the late 1800s when they provided student 23 inspections to identify those with communicable diseases who 24 25 needed treatment. While the students of today have very different 26 health needs than those in earlier days, school nurses are still critically important to ensure that the health needs of each child 27 are met. Today, school nursing is recognized as a specialized 28 29 practice that advances the well-being, academic success and lifelong achievement of students. To this end, school nurses are 30 31 a very critical component for the implementation of a coordinated approach to school health. 32

(b) The State Department of Education is a leader in 33 34 the healthy school environment initiative for the state and this 35 act represents a logical approach to expanding the department's commitment to school health. Recognizing coordinated school 36 37 health programs as a powerful tool for improving student health 38 and academic achievement, the State Board of Education approved 39 the reorganization of the State Department of Education to bring the school health-related resources under one (1) office by 40 establishing the Office of Healthy Schools in January 2004. 41

42 (c) The Office of Healthy Schools, which is funded by 43 The Bower Foundation, has launched the "Health is Academic" 44 Initiative to promote health and wellness in Mississippi's public schools. School nurses play a pivotal role in the following 45 46 components of this initiative: Start-Up Grant; John D. Bower, MD School Health Network Grant; EPSDT School Nurses; Medicaid 47 48 School-Based Administrative Claiming; and Local School Wellness 49 Policy.

Currently, there are over three hundred sixty (360) 50 (d) school nurses serving approximately four hundred ninety-four 51 52 thousand thirty-eight (494,038) students in Mississippi schools. 53 With one (1) school nurse for every one thousand three hundred 54 seventy-two (1,372) children, our schools fall short of the 55 federally recommended nurse student ratio of one (1) nurse for every seven hundred fifty (750) students. The existing three 56 hundred sixty (360) school nurses are funded by the Mississippi 57 Legislature, local school districts, local hospitals, federal 58 59 government, The Bower Foundation and The Partnership for a Healthy Mississippi. The nurses provide services to increasingly large 60 numbers of students, often at more than one (1) school building. 61 SECTION 3. (1) The State Department of Education is 62 designated as the state agency responsible for the administration 63 64 and supervision of the school nurse program as an education and wellness curriculum in the schools of the State of Mississippi. 65 * HR07/ R1611CS*

70 (2) The State Department of Education, through the Office of 71 Healthy Schools, shall develop standards, procedures and criteria 72 for the school nurse programs in kindergarten through Grade 12. The Office of Healthy Schools of the State Department of Education 73 shall assume the responsibility for promoting a statewide school 74 75 nurse program designed to prepare local school districts to 76 incorporate the school program into their local educational 77 programs.

78 (3) From and after July 1, 2007, the School Nurse 79 Intervention Program administered and funded by the State Department of Health shall be transferred to the Office of Healthy 80 81 Schools of the State Department of Education. Any administrative 82 personnel employed by the State Department of Health for the administration of school nurses under the School Nurse 83 84 Intervention Program may be considered for employment by the 85 Office of Healthy Schools of the State Department of Education for the purpose of coordinating the employment of school nurses in the 86 87 school districts. From and after July 1, 2007, the school nurse 88 program administered and funded by the Partnership for a Healthy Mississippi, Inc., shall be transferred to the Office of Healthy 89 90 Schools of the State Department of Education. Any administrative personnel formerly employed by the Partnership for a Healthy 91 92 Mississippi, Inc., for the administration of school nurses in the public schools may be considered for employment by the Office of 93 Healthy Schools of the State Department of Education for the 94 purpose of coordinating the employment of school nurses in the 95 school districts. All records and unexpended balances of accounts 96 97 in the School Nurse Intervention Program and the Partnership for a 98 Healthy Mississippi, Inc., relating to the employment of school * HR07/ R1611CS* H. nurses shall be transferred to the Office of Healthy Schools in 99 100 the State Department of Education in accordance with the transfer 101 of responsibility under this act. 102 (4) The nurses in the school nurse program shall have the 103 following specific responsibilities: Serve as the coordinator of the health services 104 (a) 105 program and provide nursing care; 106 Provide health education to students; (b) 107 Implement activities to promote health and prevent (C) 108 tobacco, alcohol and substance use and abuse; 109 Identify health and safety concerns in the school (d) 110 environment and promote a nurturing social environment; 111 (e) Administer medications and help students manage their health problems; 112 Support healthy food services programs; 113 (f) 114 Promote healthy physical education, sports policies (g) 115 and practices; Promote dropout prevention programs; and 116 (h) 117 Participate in allied health programs to introduce (i) 118 students to health careers. The Office of Healthy Schools of the State Department of 119 (5) 120 Education shall provide resources to all school nurses so that 121 those schools with school nurses will be prepared to provide 122 health education in Mississippi schools and support the 123 Mississippi Comprehensive Health Framework, Mississippi Physical 124 Education Framework, Wellness Policy, coordinated approach to 125 school health, and other resources required by the State Board of 126 Education. In administering the school nurse program, the Office of 127 (6) 128 Healthy Schools and the State Department of Education shall perform the following duties: 129 130 (a) Execute any contracts, agreements or other

(b) Receive grants or any other contributions made to
the State Board of Education to be used for specific purposes
related to the goals of this act;

137 (c) Submit an annual report to the Legislature138 regarding the operation of the School Nurse Intervention Program;

(d) Submit to the State Auditor any financial records
that are necessary for the Auditor to perform an annual audit of
the commission as required by law;

142 (e) Adopt any rules or regulations that are necessary143 to carry out the purposes of this act; and

144 (f) Take any other actions that are necessary to carry 145 out the purposes of this act.

146 <u>SECTION 4.</u> (1) There is established in the State Treasury a 147 special fund to be known as the School Nurse Program Fund, which 148 shall be comprised of the funds specified in subsection (2) of 149 this section and any other funds that are authorized or required 150 to be deposited into the special fund.

151 (2) From the tobacco settlement installment payments that 152 the State of Mississippi receives during each calendar year, the 153 sum of Seven Million Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$7,500,000.00) 154 shall be deposited into the special fund.

(3) The Legislature shall annually appropriate the funds in the special fund to the Office of Healthy Schools of the State Department of Education, which shall expend the funds solely for the purposes specified in Section 3 of this act. None of the funds in the special fund may be transferred to any other fund or appropriated or expended for any other purpose.

(4) All income from the investment of the funds in the
special fund shall be credited to the account of the special fund.
Any funds in the special fund at the end of a fiscal year shall
not lapse into the State General Fund.

43-13-405. (1) In accordance with the purposes of this 167 168 article, there is established in the State Treasury the Health 169 Care Trust Fund, into which shall be deposited Two Hundred Eighty Million Dollars (\$280,000,000.00) of the funds received by the 170 State of Mississippi as a result of the tobacco settlement as of 171 the end of fiscal year 1999, and all tobacco settlement 172 installment payments made in subsequent years for which the use or 173 174 purpose for expenditure is not restricted by the terms of the 175 settlement, except as otherwise provided in Section 43-13-407(2) and (3) and Section 4 of this act. All income from the investment 176 177 of the funds in the Health Care Trust Fund shall be credited to the account of the Health Care Trust Fund. The funds in the 178 Health Care Trust Fund at the end of a fiscal year shall not lapse 179 180 into the State General Fund.

181 (2) The Health Care Trust Fund shall remain inviolate and 182 shall never be expended, except as provided in this article. The 183 Legislature shall appropriate from the Health Care Trust Fund such 184 sums as are necessary to recoup any funds lost as a result of any 185 of the following actions:

(a) The federal Centers for Medicare and Medicaid
Services, or other agency of the federal government, is successful
in recouping tobacco settlement funds from the State of
Mississippi;

(b) The federal share of funds for the support of the
Mississippi Medicaid Program is reduced directly or indirectly as
a result of the tobacco settlement;

193 (c) Federal funding for any other program is reduced as194 a result of the tobacco settlement; or

195 (d) Tobacco cessation programs are mandated by the196 federal government or court order.

197 (3) This section shall stand repealed on July 1, 2010.
