HOUSE BILL NO. 1132

AN ACT TO PROVIDE FOR A SCHOOL NURSE PROGRAM TO BE ADMINISTERED BY THE STATE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION THROUGH THE OFFICE OF HEALTHY SCHOOLS; TO SPECIFY THE RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE 3 NURSES IN THE PROGRAM; TO PRESCRIBE THE DUTIES OF THE OFFICE OF HEALTHY SCHOOLS IN ADMINISTERING THE PROGRAM; TO ESTABLISH IN THE 6 STATE TREASURY A SPECIAL FUND TO BE KNOWN AS THE SCHOOL NURSE 7 PROGRAM FUND; TO PROVIDE THAT A CERTAIN AMOUNT FROM THE TOBACCO 8 SETTLEMENT INSTALLMENT PAYMENTS RECEIVED BY THE STATE EACH YEAR 9 SHALL BE DEPOSITED INTO THE SPECIAL FUND; TO PROVIDE THAT THE LEGISLATURE SHALL ANNUALLY APPROPRIATE THE FUNDS IN THE SPECIAL 10 11 FUND TO THE STATE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION, WHICH SHALL EXPEND THE FUNDS SOLELY FOR THE PURPOSES SPECIFIED IN THIS ACT; TO AMEND 12 SECTION 43-13-405, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO CONFORM TO THE 13 PRECEDING PROVISION; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 14

- BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 16 **SECTION 1.** This act shall be known as the Mary Sprayberry
- 17 School Nurse Reorganization Act of 2007.
- 18 <u>SECTION 2.</u> The Mississippi Legislature makes the following 19 findings:
- 20 (a) School nurses play a vital role in improving the
- 21 health and well-being of our children and make a health difference
- 22 in every child's future. Nurses have been a part of the school
- 23 setting since the late 1800s when they provided student
- 24 inspections to identify those with communicable diseases who
- 25 needed treatment. While the students of today have very different
- 26 health needs than those in earlier days, school nurses are still
- 27 critically important to ensure that the health needs of each child
- 28 are met. Today, school nursing is recognized as a specialized
- 29 practice that advances the well-being, academic success and
- 30 lifelong achievement of students. To this end, school nurses take
- 31 a leadership role in serving as the coordinator of all school
- 32 health programs.

(b) The State Department of Education is a leader in 33 34 the healthy school environment initiative for the state and this 35 act represents a logical approach to expanding the department's commitment to school health. Recognizing coordinated school 36 37 health programs as a powerful tool for improving student health 38 and academic achievement, the State Board of Education approved 39 the reorganization of the State Department of Education to bring the school health-related resources under one (1) office by 40 establishing the Office of Healthy Schools in January 2004. 41 42 The Office of Healthy Schools, which is funded by 43 The Bower Foundation, has launched the "Health is Academic" 44 Initiative to promote health and wellness in Mississippi's public schools. School nurses play a pivotal role in the following 45 46 components of this initiative: Start-Up Grant; John D. Bower, MD School Health Network Grant; EPSDT School Nurses; Medicaid 47 48 School-Based Administrative Claiming; and Local School Wellness 49 Policy. Currently, there are over three hundred sixty (360) 50 school nurses serving approximately four hundred ninety-four 51 52 thousand thirty-eight (494,038) students in Mississippi schools. 53 With one (1) school nurse for every one thousand three hundred 54 seventy-two (1,372) children, our schools fall short of the 55 federally recommended nurse student ratio of one (1) nurse for every seven hundred fifty (750) students. The existing three 56 hundred sixty (360) school nurses are funded by the Mississippi 57 Legislature, local school districts, local hospitals, federal 58 59 government, The Bower Foundation and The Partnership for a Healthy Mississippi. The nurses provide services to increasingly large 60 numbers of students, often at more than one (1) school building. 61 SECTION 3. (1) The State Department of Education is 62 designated as the state agency responsible for the administration 63 64 and supervision of the school nurse program as an education and wellness curriculum in the schools of the State of Mississippi. 65

- 66 It is the intent of the Legislature that all funds made available
- 67 to the State Department of Education for the purpose of employing
- 68 school nurses shall be administered by the State Department of
- 69 Education.
- 70 (2) The State Department of Education, through the Office of
- 71 Healthy Schools, shall develop standards, procedures and criteria
- 72 for the school nurse programs in kindergarten through Grade 12.
- 73 The Office of Healthy Schools of the State Department of Education
- 74 shall assume the responsibility for promoting a statewide school
- 75 nurse program designed to prepare local school districts to
- 76 incorporate the school program into their local educational
- 77 programs.
- 78 (3) From and after July 1, 2007, the School Nurse
- 79 Intervention Program administered and funded by the State
- 80 Department of Health shall be transferred to the Office of Healthy
- 81 Schools of the State Department of Education. Any administrative
- 82 personnel employed by the State Department of Health for the
- 83 administration of school nurses under the School Nurse
- 84 Intervention Program may be employed by the Office of Healthy
- 85 Schools of the State Department of Education for the purpose of
- 86 coordinating the employment of school nurses in the school
- 87 districts. From and after July 1, 2007, the school nurse program
- 88 administered and funded by the Partnership for a Healthy
- 89 Mississippi, Inc., shall be transferred to the Office of Healthy
- 90 Schools of the State Department of Education. Any administrative
- 91 personnel formerly employed by the Partnership for a Healthy
- 92 Mississippi, Inc., for the administration of school nurses in the
- 93 public schools may be employed by the Office of Healthy Schools of
- 94 the State Department of Education for the purpose of coordinating
- 95 the employment of school nurses in the school districts. All
- 96 records and unexpended balances of accounts in the School Nurse
- 97 Intervention Program and the Partnership for a Healthy
- 98 Mississippi, Inc., relating to the employment of school nurses

- 99 shall be transferred to the Office of Healthy Schools in the State
- 100 Department of Education in accordance with the transfer of
- 101 responsibility under this act.
- 102 (4) The nurses in the school nurse program shall have the
- 103 following specific responsibilities:
- 104 (a) Serve as the coordinator of the health services
- 105 program and provide nursing care;
- 106 (b) Provide health education to students;
- 107 (c) Implement activities to promote health and prevent
- 108 tobacco, alcohol and substance use and abuse;
- 109 (d) Identify health and safety concerns in the school
- 110 environment and promote a nurturing social environment;
- (e) Administer medications and help students manage
- 112 their health problems;
- 113 (f) Support healthy food services programs;
- 114 (g) Promote healthy physical education, sports policies
- 115 and practices;
- (h) Promote dropout prevention programs; and
- (i) Participate in allied health programs to introduce
- 118 students to health careers.
- 119 (5) The Office of Healthy Schools of the State Department of
- 120 Education shall provide resources to all school nurses so that
- 121 those schools with school nurses will be prepared to achieve the
- 122 goal of forty-five (45) minutes per week of health education in
- 123 Mississippi schools and support the wellness curriculum required
- 124 by law.
- 125 (6) In administering the school nurse program, the Office of
- 126 Healthy Schools and the State Department of Education shall
- 127 perform the following duties:
- 128 (a) Execute any contracts, agreements or other
- 129 documents with any governmental agency or any person, corporation,
- 130 association, partnership or other organization or entity that are
- 131 necessary to accomplish the purposes of this act;

- 132 (b) Receive grants, bequeaths, gifts, donations or any
- 133 other contributions made to the commission to be used for specific
- 134 purposes related to the goals of this act;
- 135 (c) Submit an annual report to the Legislature
- 136 regarding the operation of the commission;
- 137 (d) Submit to the State Auditor any financial records
- 138 that are necessary for the Auditor to perform an annual audit of
- 139 the commission as required by law;
- 140 (e) Adopt any rules or regulations that are necessary
- 141 to carry out the purposes of this act; and
- 142 (f) Take any other actions that are necessary to carry
- 143 out the purposes of this act.
- 144 **SECTION 4.** (1) There is established in the State Treasury a
- 145 special fund to be known as the School Nurse Program Fund, which
- 146 shall be comprised of the funds specified in subsection (2) of
- 147 this section and any other funds that are authorized or required
- 148 to be deposited into the special fund.
- 149 (2) From the tobacco settlement installment payments that
- 150 the State of Mississippi receives during each calendar year, the
- sum of Seven Million Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$7,500,000.00)
- 152 shall be deposited into the special fund.
- 153 (3) The Legislature shall annually appropriate the funds in
- 154 the special fund to the Office of Healthy Schools of the State
- 155 Department of Education, which shall expend the funds solely for
- 156 the purposes specified in Section 3 of this act. None of the
- 157 funds in the special fund may be transferred to any other fund or
- 158 appropriated or expended for any other purpose.
- 159 (4) All income from the investment of the funds in the
- 160 special fund shall be credited to the account of the special fund.
- 161 Any funds in the special fund at the end of a fiscal year shall
- 162 not lapse into the State General Fund.
- 163 **SECTION 5.** Section 43-13-405, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 164 amended as follows:

165 43-13-405. (1) In accordance with the purposes of this 166 article, there is established in the State Treasury the Health 167 Care Trust Fund, into which shall be deposited Two Hundred Eighty 168 Million Dollars (\$280,000,000.00) of the funds received by the 169 State of Mississippi as a result of the tobacco settlement as of 170 the end of fiscal year 1999, and all tobacco settlement 171 installment payments made in subsequent years for which the use or purpose for expenditure is not restricted by the terms of the 172 settlement, except as otherwise provided in Section 43-13-407(2) 173 174 and (3) and Section 2 of this act. All income from the investment 175 of the funds in the Health Care Trust Fund shall be credited to the account of the Health Care Trust Fund. 176 The funds in the 177 Health Care Trust Fund at the end of a fiscal year shall not lapse

(2) The Health Care Trust Fund shall remain inviolate and shall never be expended, except as provided in this article. The Legislature shall appropriate from the Health Care Trust Fund such sums as are necessary to recoup any funds lost as a result of any of the following actions:

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- 184 (a) The federal Centers for Medicare and Medicaid

 185 Services, or other agency of the federal government, is successful

 186 in recouping tobacco settlement funds from the State of

 187 Mississippi;
- 188 (b) The federal share of funds for the support of the
 189 Mississippi Medicaid Program is reduced directly or indirectly as
 190 a result of the tobacco settlement;
- 191 (c) Federal funding for any other program is reduced as
 192 a result of the tobacco settlement; or
- 193 (d) Tobacco cessation programs are mandated by the 194 federal government or court order.
- 195 (3) This section shall stand repealed on July 1, 2010.
- 196 **SECTION 6.** This act shall take effect and be in force from 197 and after its passage.
