## HOUSE BILL NO. 1172

- AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 25-3-9, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO REVISE HOW THE SALARIES OF CERTAIN COUNTY PROSECUTING ATTORNEYS ARE CALCULATED; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 5 **SECTION 1.** Section 25-3-9, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 6 amended as follows:
- 7 25-3-9. (1) Except as provided in subsections (2), (3) and
- 8 (4) of this section, the county prosecuting attorney may receive
- 9 for his services an annual salary to be paid by the board of
- 10 supervisors as follows:
- 11 (a) For counties with a total population of more than
- 12 two hundred thousand (200,000), a salary not to exceed
- 13 Twenty-eight Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$28,500.00).
- 14 (b) For counties with a total population of more than
- one hundred thousand (100,000) and not more than two hundred
- 16 thousand (200,000), a salary not to exceed Twenty-six Thousand
- 17 Five Hundred Dollars (\$26,500.00).
- 18 (c) For counties with a total population of more than
- 19 fifty thousand (50,000) and not more than one hundred thousand
- (100,000), a salary not to exceed Twenty-one Thousand Seven
- 21 Hundred Dollars (\$21,700.00).
- 22 (d) For counties with a total population of more than
- 23 thirty-five thousand (35,000) and not more than fifty thousand
- 24 (50,000), a salary not to exceed Twenty Thousand Four Hundred
- 25 Dollars (\$20,400.00).
- 26 (e) For counties with a total population of more than
- 27 twenty-five thousand (25,000) and not more than thirty-five

- In all cases of conviction there shall be taxed against the

- 49 (\$3.00), which shall be turned in to the county treasury as a part
- of the general county funds; however, the Three Dollars (\$3.00)
- 51 shall not be taxed in any case in which it is not the specific
- 52 duty of the county attorney to appear and prosecute.
- From and after October 1, 1993, in addition to the salaries

- 431 (5) (a) In any case where a county has a sitting full-time 432 county court judge, such county shall employ the elected county prosecutor as a full-time prosecutor, pay compensation to such 433 434 full-time prosecuting attorney in an amount of not more than ninety percent (90%) of the annual compensation and salary of the 435 county court judge of such county, and provide adequate office 436 437 space and reasonable office expenses to the county prosecuting 438 attorney.
- (b) In the event the county prosecuting attorney elects
  that the job be classified as part time rather than full time, the
  prosecutor shall notify the board of supervisors of such county
  that he has elected to be a part time prosecutor and be paid
  pursuant to the provisions of this section.
- shall submit this act, immediately upon approval by the Governor, or upon approval by the Legislature subsequent to a veto, to the Attorney General of the United States or to the United States

  District Court for the District of Columbia in accordance with the provisions of the Voting Rights Act of 1965, as amended and extended.
- SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after the date it is effectuated under Section 5 of the Voting Rights Act of 1965, as amended and extended.
