9	SECTION 1. (1) There is created joint legislative study

12	committee shall make recommendations on all aspects of family
13	services with an emphasis on government assistance, child care,
14	promoting educational enhancement, unemployment, youth involvement
15	and crime deterrence, crisis intervention and reducing disparities
