HOUSE BILL NO. 1240

- AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 25-3-25, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO CLARIFY THE SALARY SUPPLEMENT OF CERTAIN SHERIFFS; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 5 **SECTION 1.** Section 25-3-25, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 6 amended as follows:
- 7 25-3-25. (1) Except as otherwise provided in subsections
- 8 (2) through (9), the salaries of sheriffs of the various counties
- 9 are fixed as full compensation for their services.
- 10 From and after October 1, 1998, the annual salary for each
- 11 sheriff shall be based upon the total population of his county
- 12 according to the latest federal decennial census in the following
- 13 categories and for the following amounts; however, no sheriff
- 14 shall be paid less than the salary authorized under this section
- 15 to be paid the sheriff based upon the population of the county
- 16 according to the 1980 federal decennial census:
- 17 (a) For counties with a total population of more than
- 18 two hundred thousand (200,000), a salary of Ninety Thousand
- 19 Dollars (\$90,000.00).
- 20 (b) For counties with a total population of more than
- 21 one hundred thousand (100,000) and not more than two hundred
- 22 thousand (200,000), a salary of Eighty-four Thousand Dollars
- 23 (\$84,000.00).
- 24 (c) For counties with a total population of more than
- 25 forty-five thousand (45,000) and not more than one hundred
- 26 thousand (100,000), a salary of Seventy-eight Thousand Dollars
- 27 (\$78,000.00).

- 28 (d) For counties with a total population of more than
- 29 thirty-four thousand (34,000) and not more than forty-five
- 30 thousand (45,000), a salary of Seventy-two Thousand Dollars
- 31 (\$72,000.00).
- 32 (e) For counties with a total population of more than
- 33 twenty-five thousand (25,000) and not more than thirty-four
- 34 thousand (34,000), a salary of Sixty-two Thousand Four Hundred
- 35 Dollars (\$62,400.00).
- 36 (f) For counties with a total population of more than
- 37 fifteen thousand (15,000) and not more than twenty-five thousand
- 38 (25,000), a salary of Sixty Thousand Dollars (\$60,000.00).
- 39 (g) For counties with a total population of more than
- 40 nine thousand five hundred (9,500) and not more than fifteen
- 41 thousand (15,000), a salary of Fifty-six Thousand Four Hundred
- 42 Dollars (\$56,400.00).
- (h) For counties with a total population of not more
- 44 than nine thousand five hundred (9,500), a salary of Fifty-five
- 45 Thousand Dollars (\$55,000.00).
- 46 (2) In addition to the salary provided for in subsection (1)
- 47 of this section, the Board of Supervisors of Leflore County, in
- 48 its discretion, may pay an annual supplement to the sheriff of the
- 49 county in an amount not to exceed Ten Thousand Dollars
- 50 (\$10,000.00). The Legislature finds and declares that the annual
- 51 supplement authorized by this subsection is justified in such
- 52 county for the following reasons:
- 53 (a) The Mississippi Department of Corrections operates
- 54 and maintains a restitution center within the county;
- 55 (b) The Mississippi Department of Corrections operates
- 56 and maintains a community work center within the county;
- 57 (c) There is a resident circuit court judge in the
- 58 county whose office is located at the Leflore County Courthouse;
- 59 (d) There is a resident chancery court judge in the
- 60 county whose office is located at the Leflore County Courthouse;

- (e) The Magistrate for the Fourth Circuit Court
- 62 District is located in the county and maintains his office at the
- 63 Leflore County Courthouse;
- (f) The Region VI Mental Health-Mental Retardation
- 65 Center, which serves a multicounty area, calls upon the sheriff to
- 66 provide security for out-of-town mental patients, as well as
- 67 patients from within the county;
- 68 (g) The increased activity of the Child Support
- 69 Division of the Department of Human Services in enforcing in the
- 70 courts parental obligations has imposed additional duties on the
- 71 sheriff; and
- 72 (h) The dispatchers of the enhanced E-911 system in
- 73 place in Leflore County has been placed under the direction and
- 74 control of the sheriff.
- 75 (3) In addition to the salary provided for in subsection (1)
- 76 of this section, the Board of Supervisors of Rankin County, in its
- 77 discretion, may pay an annual supplement to the sheriff of the
- 78 county in an amount not to exceed Ten Thousand Dollars
- 79 (\$10,000.00). The Legislature finds and declares that the annual
- 80 supplement authorized by this subsection is justified in such
- 81 county for the following reasons:
- 82 (a) The Mississippi Department of Corrections operates
- 83 and maintains the Central Mississippi Correctional Facility within
- 84 the county;
- 85 (b) The State Hospital is operated and maintained
- 86 within the county at Whitfield;
- 87 (c) Hudspeth Regional Center, a facility maintained for
- 88 the care and treatment of the mentally retarded, is located within
- 89 the county;
- 90 (d) The Mississippi Law Enforcement Officers Training
- 91 Academy is operated and maintained within the county;
- 92 (e) The State Fire Academy is operated and maintained
- 93 within the county;

- 94 (f) The Pearl River Valley Water Supply District,
- 95 ordinarily known as the "Reservoir District," is located within
- 96 the county;
- 97 (g) The Jackson International Airport is located within
- 98 the county;
- 99 (h) The patrolling of the state properties located
- 100 within the county has imposed additional duties on the sheriff;
- 101 and
- 102 (i) The sheriff, in addition to providing security to
- 103 the nearly one hundred thousand (100,000) residents of the county,
- 104 has the duty to investigate, solve and assist in the prosecution
- 105 of any misdemeanor or felony committed upon any state property
- 106 located in Rankin County.
- 107 (4) In addition to the salary provided for in subsection (1)
- 108 of this section, the Board of Supervisors of Neshoba County shall
- 109 pay an annual supplement to the sheriff of the county an amount
- 110 equal to Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00).
- 111 (5) In addition to the salary provided for in subsection (1)
- 112 of this section, the Board of Supervisors of Tunica County, in its
- 113 discretion, may pay an annual supplement to the sheriff of the
- 114 county an amount equal to Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00),
- 115 payable beginning April 1, 1997.
- 116 (6) In addition to the salary provided for in subsection (1)
- 117 of this section, the Board of Supervisors of Hinds County shall
- 118 pay an annual supplement to the sheriff of the county in an amount
- 119 equal to Fifteen Thousand Dollars (\$15,000.00). The Legislature
- 120 finds and declares that the annual supplement authorized by this
- 121 subsection is justified in such county for the following reasons:
- 122 (a) Hinds County has the greatest population of any
- 123 county, two hundred fifty-four thousand four hundred forty-one
- 124 (254,441) by the 1990 census, being almost one hundred thousand
- 125 (100,000) more than the next most populous county;

- 126 (b) Hinds County is home to the State Capitol and the
- 127 seat of all state government offices;
- 128 (c) Hinds County is the third largest county in
- 129 geographic area, containing eight hundred seventy-five (875)
- 130 square miles;
- (d) Hinds County is comprised of two (2) judicial
- 132 districts, each having a courthouse and county office buildings;
- (e) There are four (4) resident circuit judges, four
- 134 (4) resident chancery judges, and three (3) resident county judges
- in Hinds County, the most of any county, with the sheriff acting
- 136 as chief executive officer and provider of bailiff services for
- 137 all;
- 138 (f) The main offices for the clerk and most of the
- 139 judges and magistrates for the United States District Court for
- 140 the Southern District of Mississippi are located within the
- 141 county;
- 142 (q) The state's only urban university, Jackson State
- 143 University, is located within the county;
- (h) The University of Mississippi Medical Center,
- 145 combining the medical school, dental school, nursing school and
- 146 hospital, is located within the county;
- 147 (i) Mississippi Veterans Memorial Stadium, the state's
- 148 largest sports arena, is located within the county;
- 149 (j) The Mississippi State Fairgrounds, including the
- 150 Coliseum and Trade Mart, are located within the county;
- 151 (k) Hinds County has the largest criminal population in
- 152 the state, such that the Hinds County Sheriff's Department
- 153 operates the largest county jail system in the state, housing
- 154 almost one thousand (1,000) inmates in three (3) separate
- 155 detention facilities;
- 156 (1) The Hinds County Sheriff's Department handles more
- 157 mental and drug and alcohol commitments cases than any other
- 158 sheriff's department in the state;

- The Mississippi Department of Corrections maintains 159 (m) 160 a restitution center within the county; (n) The Mississippi Department of Corrections regularly 161 162 houses as many as one hundred (100) state convicts within the 163 Hinds County jail system; and 164 (o) The Hinds County Sheriff's Department is regularly 165 asked to provide security services not only at the Fairgrounds and Memorial Stadium, but also for events at the Mississippi Museum of 166 167 Art and Jackson City Auditorium. 168 (7) In addition to the salary provided for in subsection (1) 169 of this section, the Board of Supervisors of Wilkinson County, in 170 its discretion, may pay an annual supplement to the sheriff of the county in an amount not to exceed Ten Thousand Dollars 171 172 (\$10,000.00). The purpose for this salary supplement is to be added to any salary increase authorized by the Legislature any 173 174 year for all county sheriffs described in subsection (1) of this 175 section, which would result in a salary that would be Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00) higher than the salary otherwise provided in 176 177 subsection (1) for this county's sheriff. The Legislature finds 178 and declares that the annual supplement authorized by this 179 subsection is justified in such county because the Mississippi 180 Department of Corrections contracts for the private incarceration 181 of state inmates at a private correctional facility within the 182 county. In addition to the salary provided for in subsection (1) 183 (8) of this section, the Board of Supervisors of Marshall County, in 184 185 its discretion, may pay an annual supplement to the sheriff of the 186 county in an amount not to exceed Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00). The Legislature finds and declares that the annual 187 188 supplement authorized by this subsection is justified in such county because the Mississippi Department of Corrections contracts 189 190 for the private incarceration of state inmates at a private 191 correctional facility within the county.
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- 192 (9) In addition to the salary provided in subsection (1) of
- 193 this section, the Board of Supervisors of Greene County, in its
- 194 discretion, may pay an annual supplement to the sheriff of the
- 195 county in an amount not to exceed Ten Thousand Dollars
- 196 (\$10,000.00). The Legislature finds and declares that the annual
- 197 supplement authorized by this subsection is justified in such
- 198 county for the following reasons:
- 199 (a) The Mississippi Department of Corrections operates
- 200 and maintains the South Mississippi Correctional Facility within
- 201 the county;
- 202 (b) In 1996, additional facilities to house another one
- 203 thousand four hundred sixteen (1,416) male offenders were
- 204 constructed at the South Mississippi Correctional Facility within
- 205 the county; and
- 206 (c) The patrolling of the state properties located
- 207 within the county has imposed additional duties on the sheriff
- 208 justifying additional compensation.
- 209 (10) In addition to the salary provided in subsection (1) of
- 210 this section, the board of supervisors of any county, in its
- 211 discretion, may pay an annual supplement to the sheriff of the
- 212 county in an amount not to exceed Ten Thousand Dollars
- 213 (\$10,000.00). The amount of the supplement shall be spread on the
- 214 minutes of the board. The annual supplement authorized in this
- 215 subsection shall not be in addition to the annual supplements
- 216 authorized in subsections (2) through (9).
- 217 (11) The salaries provided in this section shall be payable
- 218 monthly on the first day of each calendar month by chancery
- 219 clerk's warrant drawn on the general fund of the county; however,
- 220 the board of supervisors, by resolution duly adopted and entered
- 221 on its minutes, may provide that such salaries shall be paid
- 222 semimonthly on the first and fifteenth day of each month. If a
- 223 pay date falls on a weekend or legal holiday, salary payments

226	SECTION 2. The Attorney General of the State of Mississippi
227	shall submit this act, immediately upon approval by the Governor,
228	or upon approval by the Legislature subsequent to a veto, to the
229	Attorney General of the United States or to the United States
230	District Court for the District of Columbia in accordance with the
231	provisions of the Voting Rights Act of 1965, as amended and
232	extended.
233	SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from
234	and after the date it is effectuated under Section 5 of the Voting

Rights Act of 1965, as amended and extended.
