COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE FOR HOUSE BILL NO. 1267

AN ACT TO CREATE THE CARING FOR MISSISSIPPI INDIVIDUALS WITH 1 2 AUTISM TASK FORCE; TO PROVIDE FOR THE MEMBERSHIP OF THE TASK 3 FORCE; TO SET FORTH THE DUTIES OF THE TASK FORCE; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 4 5 WHEREAS, autism is a complex developmental disability that 6 typically appears during the first three (3) years of life and is 7 part of a group of disorders known as Autism Spectrum Disorders 8 (ASD); and 9 WHEREAS, as of the effective date of this act, at least one (1) in one hundred sixty-six (166) individuals in the United 10 11 States is diagnosed with autism, making it more common than the occurrences in our population of pediatric cancer, diabetes, and 12 13 AIDS combined; and 14 WHEREAS, autism impairs a person's ability to communicate and 15 relate to others; is associated with rigid routines and repetitive 16 behaviors, such as obsessively arranging objects or following very 17 specific routines; is four (4) times more likely to strike boys than girls; and occurs in all racial, ethnic and social groups; 18 19 and WHEREAS, symptoms of the disability can range from very mild 20 21 to quite severe, and autistic behaviors not only make life 22 difficult for those individuals who suffer from the disability, but also make life hard for their families, health care providers 23 24 and teachers; and WHEREAS, families coping with this devastating illness are 25 searching for answers about its causes, diagnosis, prevention and 26 treatment, and while there is no known means to prevent the 27 28 disability, there are indications that early intervention in an * HR40/ R1629CS* H. B. No. 1267 G1/2 29 appropriate educational setting for at least two (2) years during 30 the preschool years can result in significant improvements for 31 many young children with the disorder; and

32 WHEREAS, the Mississippi Legislature recognizes that 33 strategies for how to best identify, treat and accommodate the 34 needs of individuals with autism and of their families are 35 urgently needed in our state; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 36 SECTION 1. (1) The Caring for Mississippi Individuals with 37 38 Autism Task Force is created to study and make recommendations to the Mississippi Legislature regarding the growing incidence of 39 40 autism and Autism Spectrum Disorders (ASD), how to identify, treat and accommodate the needs of individuals with autism and ASD, and 41 ways to improve the delivery and coordination of state services 42 provided to individuals with autism and ASD. Members of the task 43 44 force shall be composed of the following:

(a) Three (3) persons who are the parents of children
with autism or ASD, with one (1) such person to be appointed by
the Governor, one (1) to be appointed by the Lieutenant Governor,
and one (1) to be appointed by the Speaker of the House;

49 (b) One (1) person who is a member of the governing
50 body of a school district, to be appointed by the State
51 Superintendent of Public Education;

52 (c) One (1) person who represents the State Department
53 of Education, to be appointed by the State Superintendent of
54 Public Education;

(d) One (1) person who is the director of special education services in a school district, to be appointed by the State Superintendent of Public Education;

(e) One (1) person who is a representative of the State
Department of Mental Health, to be appointed by the executive
director of the department;

State Department of Mental Health who are from regions in the
state that provide services to individuals with autism or ASD, to
be appointed by the executive director of the department;

(g) One (1) person who is a representative of the University of Mississippi Medical Center and who provides medical or other services to individuals with autism or ASD, to be appointed by the Vice Chancellor of the University of Mississippi Medical Center;

(h) Two (2) persons who are Mississippi pediatricians engaged in the private practice of medicine and who provide treatment to individuals with autism or ASD, to be appointed by the Vice Chancellor of the University of Mississippi Medical Center.

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(2) The task force shall:

(a) Review the best practices of other states with regard to educational, medical and early intervention services provided to individuals diagnosed with autism or ASD and identify the best practices of other states;

80 (b) Review the standard of services provided by local 81 Mississippi school districts and early intervention programs to 82 individuals diagnosed with autism or ASD, identify any additional 83 potential funding sources for school districts, and identify 84 guidelines for measurable educational and instructional goals that 85 can be used by members of the education community for serving 86 children with autism or ASD;

87 (c) Assess the medical availability of services 88 currently provided for early screening, diagnosis and treatment of 89 autism and ASD and provide recommendations for enhancing medical 90 services;

91 (d) Identify the role of higher education in developing 92 a workforce in Mississippi possessing the skills necessary to 93 assist individuals with autism or ASD in medical, educational, and H. B. No. 1267 * HR40/ R1629CS* 07/HR40/R1629CS 94 vocational efforts or in providing additional services associated 95 with autism or ASD;

96 (e) Evaluate and identify any and all additional 97 relevant information and make legislative recommendations 98 regarding the development and implementation of a continuum of 99 educational and medical services for individuals with autism or 100 ASD; and

101 (f) File a report with those standing committees of the 102 Mississippi State Legislature and with those state agencies having 103 jurisdiction over specific recommendations of the task force, not 104 later than December 1, 2007.

(3) The task force shall hold its first meeting not later than April 1, 2007, with the date, time and location of the meeting to be designated by the Governor. At that first meeting, the task force shall elect from among its membership a chairman, vice chairman and any other officers determined to be necessary, and shall set the date, time and location of its next meeting.

111 (4) The State Department of Mental Health shall provide the 112 staff and other support necessary for the Caring for Mississippi 113 Individuals with Autism Task Force to perform its duties.

114 **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from 115 and after its passage.
