## HOUSE BILL NO. 1283

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 73-11-51, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, 1 TO PROVIDE THAT THE STATE BOARD OF FUNERAL SERVICE, IN LIEU OF 2 CERTAIN OTHER LICENSURE REQUIREMENTS, SHALL ISSUE A LICENSE FOR THE PRACTICE OF FUNERAL DIRECTING TO ANY PERSON WHO HAS NOT LESS 3 4 THAN TWENTY YEARS' EXPERIENCE AS AN EMPLOYEE AT A LICENSED FUNERAL 5 ESTABLISHMENT IN MISSISSIPPI, IS PRESENTLY EMPLOYED AT A LICENSED б 7 FUNERAL ESTABLISHMENT IN MISSISSIPPI AND MAKES APPLICATION TO THE BOARD FOR THE LICENSE DURING THE PERIOD FROM JULY 1, 2007, THROUGH 8 JULY 31, 2007; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 9 10 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: SECTION 1. Section 73-11-51, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 11 amended as follows: 12 73-11-51. (1) Except as otherwise provided herein, no 13 14 person shall engage in the business or practice of funeral service, including embalming, and/or funeral directing or hold 15 16 himself out as transacting or practicing or being entitled to transact or practice funeral service, including embalming, and/or 17 funeral directing in this state unless duly licensed under the 18 provisions of this chapter. 19 (2) The board is authorized and empowered to examine 20

applicants for licenses for the practice of funeral service and funeral directing and shall issue the proper license to those persons who successfully pass the applicable examination and otherwise comply with the provisions of this chapter.

25 (3) To be licensed for the practice of funeral directing26 under this chapter, a person must:

27 (a) Be at least eighteen (18) years of age;
28 (b) Have a high school diploma or the equivalent
29 thereof;

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30 (c) Have served as a resident trainee for not less than 31 twenty-four (24) months under the supervision of a person licensed 32 for the practice of funeral service or funeral directing in this 33 state;

34 (d) Have successfully passed a written and/or oral35 examination as prepared or approved by the board; and

(e) Be of good moral character.

37 (4) To be licensed for the practice of funeral service under38 this chapter, a person must:

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(a) Be at least eighteen (18) years of age;

40 (b) Have a high school diploma or the equivalent41 thereof;

42 (c) Have successfully completed twelve (12) months or 43 more of academic and professional instruction from an institution 44 accredited by the United States Department of Education for 45 funeral service education and have a certificate of completion 46 from an institution accredited by the American Board of Funeral 47 Service Education or any other successor recognized by the United 48 States Department of Education for funeral service education;

(d) Have served as a resident trainee for not less than twelve (12) months, either before or after graduation from an accredited institution mentioned above, under the supervision of a person licensed for the practice of funeral service in this state and in an establishment licensed in this state;

55 Funeral Examiners examination as approved by the board; and

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(f) Be of good moral character.

57 All applications for examination and license for the (5) 58 practice of funeral service or funeral directing shall be upon 59 forms furnished by the board and shall be accompanied by an examination fee, a licensing fee and a nonrefundable application 60 61 fee in amounts fixed by the board in accordance with Section The fee for an initial license, however, may be 62 73-11-56. \* HR12/ R1785\* H. 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prorated in proportion to the period of time from the date of 63 64 issuance to the date of biennial license renewal prescribed in subsection (8) of this section. All applications for examination 65 shall be filed with the board office at least sixty (60) days 66 67 before the date of examination. A candidate shall be deemed to have abandoned the application for examination if he does not 68 69 appear on the scheduled date of examination unless such failure to 70 appear has been approved by the board.

The practice of funeral service or funeral directing 71 (6) 72 must be engaged in at a licensed funeral establishment, at least one (1) of which is listed as the licensee's place of business; 73 74 and no person, partnership, corporation, association or other 75 organization shall open or maintain a funeral establishment at 76 which to engage in or conduct or hold himself or itself out as 77 engaging in the practice of funeral service or funeral directing 78 until such establishment has complied with the licensing 79 requirements of this chapter. A license for the practice of 80 funeral service or funeral directing shall be used only at licensed funeral establishments; however, this provision shall not 81 prevent a person licensed for the practice of funeral service or 82 83 funeral directing from conducting a funeral service at a church, a 84 residence, public hall, lodge room or cemetery chapel, if such 85 person maintains a fixed licensed funeral establishment of his own or is in the employ of or an agent of a licensed funeral 86 87 establishment.

Any person holding a valid, unrevoked and unexpired 88 (7) 89 nonreciprocal license in another state or territory having requirements greater than or equal to those of this state as 90 determined by the board may apply for a license to practice in 91 this state by filing with the board a certified statement from the 92 secretary of the licensing board of the state or territory in 93 94 which the applicant holds his license certifying to his qualifications and good standing with that board by having 95 \* HR12/ R1785\* H. 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96 successfully passed a written and/or oral examination on the 97 Mississippi Funeral Service licensing law and rules and 98 regulations as prepared or approved by the board, and by paying a 99 nonrefundable application fee set by the board under Section 100 73-11-56. If the board finds that the applicant has fulfilled 101 substantially similar requirements, the board shall grant such 102 license upon receipt of a fee in an amount equal to the renewal fee set by the board for a license for the practice of funeral 103 service or funeral directing, as the case may be, in this state. 104 105 The board may issue a temporary funeral service or funeral 106 directing work permit before a license is granted, before the next regular meeting of the board, if the applicant for a reciprocal 107 108 license has complied with all requirements, rules and regulations 109 of the board. The temporary permit will expire at the next regular meeting of the board. 110

111 (8) Any person holding a license for the practice of (a) 112 funeral service or funeral directing may have the same renewed for 113 a period of two (2) years by making and filing with the board an application on or before the due date. Payment of the renewal fee 114 115 shall be in an amount set by the board in accordance with Section 116 73-11-56. The board shall mail the notice of renewal and the due 117 date for the payment of the renewal fee to the last known address 118 of each licensee at least thirty (30) days before that date. It is the responsibility of the licensee to notify the board in 119 120 writing of any change of address. An application will be 121 considered late if the application and proper fees are not in the 122 board's office or postmarked by the due date.

(b) If the renewal fee is not paid on or postmarked by the due date, the license of such person shall by operation of law automatically expire and become void without further action of the board. The board may reinstate such license if application for licensure is made within a period of five (5) years, upon payment of the renewal fee for the current year, all renewal fees in

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(9) No license shall be assignable or valid for any personother than the original licensee.

135 (10)The board may, in its discretion, if there is a major 136 disaster or emergency where human death is likely to occur, temporarily authorize the practice of funeral directing and 137 138 funeral service by persons licensed to practice in another state 139 but not licensed to practice in this state, provided that such services are only rendered by members of disaster mortuary teams 140 141 authorized by federal or appropriate local authorities to provide 142 such services. Only persons licensed in this state, however, may sign death certificates. 143

144 (11)A person who is licensed for the practice of funeral 145 service by another state is authorized to make a removal of a deceased person, embalm a deceased person or conduct a funeral or 146 147 burial service in this state, and a funeral director who is 148 licensed by another state is authorized to conduct a funeral or burial service in this state, in the same manner and to the same 149 150 extent as provided by the laws of that state to persons licensed 151 by the State of Mississippi for the practice of funeral service or 152 for the practice of funeral directing. The board is authorized to 153 enter into written agreements with those states detailing the 154 manner and extent to which persons licensed by the State of 155 Mississippi may practice funeral service or directing in that 156 state.

157 (12) Any funeral service technology or mortuary science
158 program accredited by the American Board of Funeral Service
159 Education in the State of Mississippi, as well as students
160 enrolled in such a program, shall be exempt from licensing under
161 this chapter when embalming or otherwise preparing a deceased
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human body for disposition as part of a student practicum 162 163 experience, when the student is directly supervised by an 164 instructor or preceptor who holds a current funeral service 165 license. This exemption shall apply to practicum experiences 166 performed at an accredited institution of funeral service 167 technology or mortuary science program or at a duly licensed 168 funeral establishment or commercial mortuary service. Nothing in 169 this subsection shall be construed to allow any funeral service 170 technology or mortuary science program, or those students enrolled 171 in such a program, to engage in practicum experiences for 172 remuneration.

173 (13) Each application or filing made under this section 174 shall include the social security number(s) of the applicant in 175 accordance with Section 93-11-64.

(14) Notwithstanding any provision of this chapter to the 176 177 contrary, the board shall issue a license for the practice of 178 funeral directing to any person who has not less than twenty (20) 179 years' experience as an employee at a licensed funeral 180 establishment in Mississippi, is presently employed at a licensed 181 funeral establishment in Mississippi and makes application to the 182 board for the license during the period from July 1, 2007, through 183 July 31, 2007.

184 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from 185 and after July 1, 2007.
