HOUSE BILL NO. 1654

AN ACT MAKING AN APPROPRIATION FROM SPECIAL FUNDS IN THE 1 2 STATE TREASURY FOR THE PURPOSE OF DEFRAYING THE ADMINISTRATIVE 3 EXPENSES OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE PUBLIC EMPLOYEES' 4 RETIREMENT SYSTEM AND FOR THE MAINTENANCE AND OPERATION OF THE RETIREMENT SYSTEM BUILDING FOR THE FISCAL YEAR 2008. 5 6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be 7 8 necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State 9 Treasury to the credit of the Administrative Expense Account of the Public Employees' Retirement System for the purpose of 10 defraying the administrative expenses of the Board of Trustees of 11 12 the Public Employees' Retirement System, or out of any money in 13 the State Treasury to the credit of the Retirement System Building Account of the Public Employees' Retirement System for the purpose 14 of maintenance and general operation of the Retirement System 15 Building, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2007, and ending 16 June 30, 2008..... \$ 11,460,285.00. 17 SECTION 2. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of 18 19 Section 1, not more than the amounts set forth below shall be expended for the respective major objects or purposes of 20 21 expenditure: MAJOR OBJECTS OF EXPENDITURE: 2.2 23 Personal Services: Salaries, Wages and Fringe Benefits.. \$ 8,048,985.00 2.4 75,000.00 25 Travel and Subsistence..... Funds are provided herein to adjust the Variable Compensation Plan to ensure that all full-time employees receive a pay increase equal to the realignment component of the Variable Compensation Plan or One Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$1,500.00), whichever is greater.

45 With the funds herein appropriated, it is the intention of 46 the Legislature that it shall be the agency's responsibility to 47 make certain that funds required to be appropriated for "Personal 48 Services" for Fiscal Year 2009 do not exceed Fiscal Year 2008 49 funds appropriated for that purpose, unless programs or positions 50 are added to the agency's Fiscal Year 2009 budget by the 51 Mississippi Legislature. Based on data provided by the Legislative Budget Office, the State Personnel Board shall 52 53 determine and publish the projected annual cost to fully fund all appropriated positions in compliance with the provisions of this 54 55 act. It shall be the responsibility of the agency head to insure that no single personnel action increases this projected annual 56 cost and/or the Fiscal Year 2008 appropriation for "Personal 57 58 Services" when annualized, with the exception of escalated funds. If, at the time the agency takes any action to change "Personal 59 60 Services," the State Personnel Board determines that the agency 61 has taken an action which would cause the agency to exceed this

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62 projected annual cost or the Fiscal Year 2008 "Personal Services" 63 appropriated level, when annualized, then only those actions which 64 reduce the projected annual cost and/or the appropriation 65 requirement will be processed by the State Personnel Board until 66 such time as the requirements of this provision are met.

67 Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with 68 the terms, conditions and procedures established by law or allowable under the terms set forth within this act. The State 69 Personnel Board shall not escalate positions without written 70 71 approval from the Department of Finance and Administration. The 72 Department of Finance and Administration shall not provide written 73 approval to escalate any funds for salaries and/or positions 74 without proof of availability of new or additional funds above the 75 appropriated level.

No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds which are being used for salaries authorized under the provisions of this act and which are withdrawn and no longer available.

80 SECTION 3. It is the intention of the Legislature that the Board of Trustees of the Public Employees' Retirement System shall 81 maintain complete accounting and personnel records related to the 82 83 expenditure of all funds appropriated under this act and that such 84 records shall be in the same format and level of detail as maintained for Fiscal Year 2007. It is further the intention of 85 86 the Legislature that the agency's budget request for Fiscal Year 2009 shall be submitted to the Joint Legislative Budget Committee 87 88 in a format and level of detail comparable to the format and level of detail provided during the Fiscal Year 2008 budget request 89 90 process.

91 SECTION 4. In accordance with the purposes of this article, 92 there shall be established in the State Treasury the Public 93 Employees' Retirement System Building Repair and Maintenance Fund, 94 into which shall be deposited all funds collected as rental income

H. B. No. 1654 07/HR05/A531 PAGE 3 (RM\ST) 95 from the building owned by the system located at 301 North 96 President Street, Jackson, Mississippi. At the end of each fiscal 97 year, any and all unexpended funds shall be transferred to the 98 Administrative Budget Fund of the system.

99 It is the intention of the Legislature that the system have 100 the authority to escalate the Public Employees' Retirement System 101 Building Repair and Maintenance Fund in an amount not to exceed Two Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$200,000.00) for repair and 102 maintenance of the buildings owned by the system. 103 All 104 expenditures from the Public Employees' Retirement System Building 105 Repair and Maintenance Fund shall be in accordance with this 106 article and for the purposes designated herein.

107 SECTION 5. It is the intention of the Legislature that 108 whenever two (2) or more bids are received by this agency for the purchase of commodities or equipment, and whenever all things 109 110 stated in such received bids are equal with respect to price, 111 quality and service, the Mississippi Industries for the Blind shall be given preference. A similar preference shall be given to 112 the Mississippi Industries for the Blind whenever purchases are 113 114 made without competitive bids.

SECTION 6. It is the intention of the Legislature that the 115 116 Executive Director of the Public Employees' Retirement System may 117 increase major objects of expenditure in total amounts not to exceed twenty-five percent (25%) of the appropriated amount of 118 119 each major object of expenditure, provided that other major 120 objects of expenditure are decreased by a corresponding dollar 121 amount and provided the Executive Director of the Mississippi 122 Department of Finance and Administration also approves with written authorization. However, no transfers shall be authorized 123 124 which increase the major object of expenditure "Salaries, Wages and Fringe Benefits." 125

126 SECTION 7. It is the intention of the Legislature that, with 127 the funds appropriated in Section 1, the Public Employees

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128 Retirement System is authorized to implement, in compliance with 129 the rules and regulations of the State Personnel Board, the 130 actions recommended in the State Personnel Board PERS 131 Organizational Study.

132 SECTION 8. In addition to all other sums herein 133 appropriated, the following sum, or so much thereof as may be 134 necessary, is appropriated out of any money in the State Treasury to the credit of the Administrative Expense Account of the Public 135 Employees' Retirement System, for the purpose of defraying those 136 137 expenses associated with consultant services regarding a 138 replacement computer system, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2007, and ending June 30, 2008..... \$ 139 480,458.00.

140 SECTION 9. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the 141 credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon 142 143 warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal 144 Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law. 145 146 SECTION 10. This act shall take effect and be in force from 147 and after July 1, 2007.
